

Lothian Pharmacy Awards

Dot Anderson Trophy

The Dot Anderson Trophy is presented annually in recognition of a pharmacist's contribution to Pre-Registration Training as a tutor, mentor or trainer. Nominations will be invited from the Pre-Registration trainees at the end of their 42nd week of the pre-registration year. The award will honour the work of Dot Anderson, a Lothian Pharmacist who did much to develop medicine information services in Lothian, made a significant contribution to the profession of pharmacy and who had a special interest in mentoring of junior colleagues.

Criteria

Eligibility

A registered pharmacist practising in Lothian who has had a role in the supervision of pre-registration pharmacist development. That role may be as a formal tutor, or in an alternative role such as a supervisor, trainer or mentor.

Nominations

Pre-Registration Pharmacists, at the end of the 42nd week of the pre-registration year, will be invited to make their nominations using the form available from the Pharmacy Awards Committee. Nominations, together with supporting information will then be assessed by the Awards Committee.

The statement in support of the person nominated should include the following:- status as a role model, commitment to the learning of others, interest in the learner as a person, enthusiasm and engagement (see example of a previous submission).

Nominations will be assessed by the Awards Committee. Unsuccessful nominees can be re-nominated in future years.

The Trophy, together with a Certificate, will be presented to the successful pharmacist at an educational event at the end of the Pre-Registration year.
