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Vaccination Services

COVID-19 Service

The COVID-19 Vaccination Service for 50-64 year olds launched on Monday 24th October.

Flu Vaccination Service

The Flu vaccination service mop-up is due to launch on Tuesday 1st November as per the SLA.

For those of you that have placed an LAIV vaccine order, the deliveries are due to be delivered by Friday 28th October.

We are working to get all pharmacy-procured vaccines for private flu services added to VMT.

We have shared all information reported from community pharmacies with the vaccination team nationally and are awaiting action.

If you are not able to provide these services, you must notify PCS team as soon as possible.

Public Protection Modules

SGHD/CMO(2022)37 provides details on the new NHS Public Protection Accountability and Assurance Framework. NES has published a suite of e-learning resources to support health professionals in their child and adult protection roles. These resources aim to ensure greater consistency in what children and young people, adults at risk of harm, and families can expect in terms of support and protection from health services in all parts of Scotland. All four Public Protection e-learning modules are available on Turas: <u>Public Protection learning site on Turas</u> <u>Learn</u>.

Please note that the 'Child protection : practice level 1 [informed]' and 'Child protection : practice level 2 [skilled]' modules will supersede the existing NES Pharmacy resource 'Child protection: it's everyone's job to make sure I'm alright'. Future SLA's will be updated to reflect these changes.

<u>New Community Pharmacy resource –</u> <u>Sore Throat Resource</u>

This is the first in a series of resources designed to support discussion in pharmacy teams by focusing on a particular clinical area, but it can be used for self-directed learning too. The aim of this pilot resource is to give pharmacy teams the confidence to assess and manage sore throats in patient facing roles utilising clinical assessment, prescribing consultation and skills as necessary. Smoking Cessation Update Common PCR Administrative Errors

Please be aware that there are some continual PCR errors being noted which affect data collection and may affect your payments.

- Clients cannot restart the SCS programme in the same week. Be aware that cut off for payment is on a Thursday so please allow a week to pass before restarting and reregistering clients on PCR otherwise the record will not go through, and payment will be void.
- Quit dates cannot be set more than 14 days in advance, PCR will not recognise this and payment will be void.
- Do NOT add the Pharmacy telephone number as client's telephone contact number. If you do

not have a valid telephone number for the client, please enter "UNKNOWN". A blank or a Pharmacy number will make any payment void.

- You should know what type of NRT your client is on but if, for whatever reason, you do not, please do NOT write "unknown", PCR does not recognise that and payment will be void, instead write "NONE"
- It is vital that you ensure good housekeeping in order to keep track of clients and submissions. Missed submissions cannot be claimed beyond 3 months.

<u>Reminder: Return of Pharmacy First</u> PGD's

The updated trimethoprim and fusidic acid Pharmacy First PGDs released in September to you must be live in ALL community pharmacies by Monday 31st October.

A communication advising of these changes has been sent to GP practices advising of the updates and a public facing communication will be released on Monday. A copy of the GP Pharmacy First service information provided is available as an attachment to this update.

Please note the additional training required to be completed before you return the signature pages. The supporting PCA(P) and TURAS modules for completion are all available <u>here</u>.

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Use of NHS.scot Email Accounts for NHS Communication

An nhs.scot address is required to be used when submitting monthly claims, SLA's, PGD's and further communications to NHS colleagues e.g. PCS / PCCT. If you do not have an nhs.scot email address, contact <u>gram.cpfacilitators@nhs.scot</u> who will support set up of an account for you.

Defibrillator Finder

Do you know where your nearest defibrillator is located? Defib Finder is a website funded and managed by the British Heart Foundation. The interactive map shows where your nearest defibrillator is located. Research has shown that deploying a defibrillator within 3-5 minutes of collapse can increase survival rates as high as 50-70% so quick action is essential.
