The evening will give an overview of how to deliver needle exchange (Injecting Equipment Provision/IEP) and the key harm reduction messages/interventions that can help people who inject drugs.

There are also upcoming changes which needle exchange pharmacies need to be aware of following a retendering process by NHS Scotland national procurement - these apply to all services in Scotland. The key changes are as follows:

- Changes to ordering processes/change of supplier for packs
- 2. Removal of bulk 20 packs. Use of single injecting packs
- 3. Change from citric acid to vitamin C

It is incredibly important that pharmacies participating in needle exchange/IEP have a workforce informed of and ready to implement these changes. We are planning to introduce these from the 1st of April.

Methylphenidate Supply Issues

Over recent months there have been several issues with supplies of prolonged-release methylphenidate, which has highlighted a need for awareness of the differences between brands, prolonged-release methylphenidate tablets and why they cannot be used inter-changeably.

The linked Specialist Pharmacy Service document comprehensive (also attached) provides information relating to the various brands of prolonged-release methylphenidate noting that different prolonged-release brands of contain methylphenidate different compositions of immediate and extended release methylphenidate and as such cannot be used inter-changeably.

Where there is a supply issue with a particular brand of prolonged-release methylphenidate, pharmacies should ensure care is taken to advise practices (when appropriate) on an alternative brand of prolonged-release methylphenidate.

Due to variances in composition of immediate and extended release methylphenidate within prolonged-release methylphenidate products, these medicines should always be prescribed by brand name. Where a generic prescription is received, further clarification should be sought relating to the required product prior to dispensing and issue to the patient.
