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Power Outages

We hope you have all stayed safe today with the strong winds across NHS Grampian. These winds are expected to continue until later this afternoon. Gusts of 60-70mph are likely, and possibly as high as 80mph for exposed coasts and hills.

Given the high number of power outages today and the lack of robust BCPs for power outages in some pharmacies, we have again shared the NHSG power outage guidance (attached) and policy for handling refrigerated products.

In addition, the NHSG Resilience Team are running two evening sessions, **specifically for community pharmacies**, on power outages and resilience planning. Policy for Handling Vaccines and Refrigerated Pharmaceutical Products

Withdrawal of SAPG guidance on Antibiotic management of Group A Streptococcus for Children

Following discussion and agreement at the SAPG committee meeting on 7th February a decision was taken to withdraw the SAPG guidance on "Antibiotic management of Group A Streptococcus (GAS, Strep. pyogenes) infection in children age 18 and under."

This decision was taken based on the following:

- Epidemiology shows levels of Group A Strep have now returned to normal seasonal levels
- Antibiotic prescribing levels are now back to levels similar to those observed in previous years
- Although the serious shortage protocol for penicillin is still active no issues are currently identified with the supply of antibiotics that would be used to treat Group A strep infections.

The SPAG website has now been updated to reflect this Paediatric Stewardship (sapg.scot)

The threshold for prescribing antibiotics in children with sore throats has now returned to normal as well and antibiotics should be considered (as previously indicated) in patients with a FeverPAIN score of 4 or more.

Locally the references on the Antimicrobial Companion app to the SAPG document and the UK interim clinical guidance, and FeverPAIN score will be removed.

The <u>UK interim clinical guidance</u> on GAS is due to remain valid until 13th February and it is anticipated that after that date the NICE Guideline will revert back to applying to adults and children with the usual FeverPAIN scoring system.

Discontinuation of Insuman Products

Sanofi has circulated the attached letter dated Jan 2023 advising of the discontinuation of the Insuman® insulin products. Please also see the below links to the Medicines Supply Notifications:

Sanofi have now advised that due to unexpected capacity and component part constraints, two of the product lines will now run out of stock at the end of February – see attached letter dated Feb 2023. These are:

- Insuman® Basal 100 units/ml suspension for injection in a cartridge.
- Insuman® Comb 25 100 units/ml suspension for injection in a cartridge.

Patients currently being prescribed these products require to be switched to an appropriate alternative. Sanofi have provided the following list of GP practices which have prescribed these two product lines in the last 12 months, and the quantity prescribed. Health Boards are asked to identify patients currently receiving these Insuman products (Insuman® Basal 100 units/ml suspension for injection in a cartridge and Insuman® Comb 25 100 units/ml suspension for

injection in a cartridge) and switch to an appropriate alternative.

Note that the other Insuman products are being discontinued in line with the communications above and will run out of stock in May / June 2023.
