Pharmacy First: Chloramphenicol Eye Drops

The following questions relate to Pharmacy First, but were covered on the Ask Me Anything Unscheduled Care event:

With the chloramphenicol drops (P) shortage can CPS do something to allow us to use POM drops? This is not possible without a PGD. The workload associated with the production and implementation of this is significant – stock of the P line is anticipated sooner than a PGD could be in place.

Could you also consider when looking at chloramphenicol that a lot of parents with children under the age of 2 present to pharmacy being sent in by the nursery and cannot send their children back to nursery without treatment?

NHS Inform advises that treatment isn't usually needed for conjunctivitis, because the symptoms often clear up within a couple of weeks. If treatment is needed, the type of treatment will depend on the cause. Full details are available here.

Public Health Scotland (PHS) advise that there is no need to stay away from work or school if a parent/carer or their child has conjunctivitis, unless either are feeling particularly unwell.

If there are a number of conjunctivitis cases at a child's school or nursery, parents/carers may be advised to keep them away until their infection has cleared up.

There is no link to nursery attendance and treatment - the decision to provide treatment should be made by a clinician, based on the clinical condition. Advice for treatment and care to signpost patients, parents and carers is available on NHS Inform.

The Ocean Cleanup, the only organisation currently tackling the Great Pacific Garbage Patch (GPGP), has just reached a milestone of



200,000 kilograms, or 220 tons of plastic removed from the ocean. By using the data of the currents and the winds to estimate volumes of plastic and to guide the capture vessels, Bojan Slat, the CEO and Founder of Ocean Cleanup, believes he can clean the whole patch in just a decade. <u>More</u> information here.
