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
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Pharmacy First Referral Claims

Following a number of pharmacy enquiries, we contacted CPS regarding the correct process to follow where a patient presents in the pharmacy, is initially consulted by a health care assistant under Pharmacy First, who then refers to a prescribing pharmacist in the same pharmacy for assessment and treatment under Pharmacy First Plus.

Only one outcome can occur for a patient, therefore pharmacies cannot submit a claim for a Pharmacy First referral when "referring" within the pharmacy to a prescribing pharmacist. As a reminder, we have included the patient flowchart below and attached to this update:

Scientists have used artificial intelligence (AI) to discover a new antibiotic that can kill a deadly species of superbug. The AI helped narrow down thousands of potential chemicals to a handful that could be tested

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in the laboratory. The result was a potent, experimental antibiotic called abaucin, which will need further tests before being used. The researchers in Canada and the US say AI has the power to massively accelerate the discovery of new drugs. It is the latest example of how the tools of artificial intelligence can be a revolutionary force in science and medicine.
