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# PGD Paracetamol 120mg/5mL Oral Suspension, at the time of administration of Meningococcal Group B Conjugate (Bexsero) Vaccine

We have received a number of enquiries this week to confirm the appropriate guidance to follow for patients less than 8 weeks old in relation to the NoS PGD for Paracetamol 120mg/5mL Oral Suspension at the time of administration of Meningococcal Group B Conjugate (Bexsero) Vaccine. While the inclusion criteria for this PGD does state patients aged 6 weeks or over, the licensing of paracetamol on Pharmacy First is 8 weeks and over only. Therefore, if the patient is less than 8 weeks old at the point of vaccination, they would require a prescription for paracetamol supply as this falls out-with the licensed aged to supply on Pharmacy First.

### **Compliance Aid – Medicines Stability**

A reminder that all pharmacy teams are responsible for ensuring that any medication requested for inclusion in a compliance aid is assessed for stability before agreement. There are a number of tools available to pharmacy teams to undertake this requirement, perhaps the most convenient is the Specialist Pharmacy Service medicines compliance aid stability tool available here: Medicines in Compliance Aids Stability Tool – SPS - Specialist Pharmacy Service – The first stop for professional medicines advice

You may need to register to obtain an account to gain access to certain areas of SPS, community pharmacists / teams can do this via your NHS email.

#### **Antimicrobial Resistance Awareness Week**

This year the Scottish focus for World Antimicrobial Awareness Week (WAAW) from 18<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup> November 2023 will be on sustainability and will include an antibiotic amnesty. Now more than ever, we need to continue to work together to prevent serious infections (including COVID-19) while reducing inappropriate antibiotic use. Please continue to explain to patients that antibiotics do not prevent or treat viral infections including COVID-19; antibiotics can cause side effects, including nausea and diarrhoea, and their use can also increase the risk of spreading infections that are caused by bacteria resistant to antibiotics.

Please make or renew your pledge to be an Antibiotic Guardian and promote this to colleagues.

Thank you for your continuing efforts to ensure antibiotics are used wisely and preserved for future generations.
