

# Carbomer Eye Drops – Recall and Supply Issues (specific brands)

### **Recall information**

The MHRA have issued a precautionary recall of specific batches of carbomercontaining lubricating eye gels (brands Aacarb<sup>®</sup>, Aacomer<sup>®</sup> and Puroptics<sup>®</sup>). See Press Release for full information.

## Stock & availability information

In addition to recalled stock there are reported supply issues with additional carbomer eye drop brands (Viscotears<sup>®</sup>, Artelac<sup>®</sup> Nighttime and GelTears<sup>®</sup>) which are expected to resolve mid-January 2024. ## **Dry Eye Management**

#### Actions for primary care

As this is a short term issue, no proactive switching should be undertaken. If an alternative eye drop is required, dry eye guidance should be consulted alongside patient notes.
