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# **Emergency Care Summary (ECS) and Pharmacy Care Record (PCR) Access**

As we approach the first of two festive public holiday weekends, this is a reminder to ensure that all pharmacists and locums are able to access the Emergency Care Summary (ECS) and Pharmacy Care Record (PCR).

#### Pharmacy Care Record (PCR) Access

To be able to deliver a number of both core and national contractual services it is essential to have a personal user ID and password to allow access and utilise the PCR.

To request a user name and password complete a <u>PCR Registration Form</u>, hosted on Microsoft Forms. This request should be undertaken prior to working as a locum pharmacist within NHS Grampian.

# **Carbomer Safety Alert – Actions Required**

Following the MHRA safety alert issued earlier this month (also attached), we are asking all community pharmacy teams to ensure that the following actions are completed:

- 1. <u>Serial Prescriptions</u> check all serial prescriptions for carbomer eye drops in your pharmacy. Ensure the patient does not fall into any of the groups advised not to use the product. If they do, please contact the relevant GP practice to obtain an alternative prescription and cancel any further dispensings.
- 2. <u>OTC purchases / Pharmacy First supplies</u> ensure that <u>all staff</u> know to screen patients for the below exclusion criteria before supplies are made as OTC sales or via Pharmacy First.

Avoid use of all carbomer-containing lubricating eye products for patients in the following groups:

- individuals with cystic fibrosis
- patients who are severely immunocompromised
- patients awaiting lung transplantation.

### **Antiviral Treatment for Influenza**

Please see attached CMO letter regarding the use of antivirals for treatment of influenza this season. Pharmacies are reminded to check stock levels and ensure that all prescriptions are correctly annotated "SLS" to ensure correct processing and reimbursement.

# **Antimicrobial Companion App**

There have been some recent technical issues with the updating of content to the mobile version of the Antimicrobial Companion app. Content on the Antimicrobial Companion website is unaffected and can continue to be used. For staff using the Antimicrobial Companion mobile app:

- Please delete this and replace it with the Right Decisions app.
- Search for 'Right Decisions' in your app store and select Right Decisions: Health & Care (Tactuum).
- Install the app, search for NHS Grampian and choose NHS Grampian, Orkney & Shetland antimicrobial prescribing (HIS/SAPG).
- Add this to 'My Toolkits' for easy access next time you use the app.
