The supply of Enzalutamide (Xtandi®) through Community Pharmacies: We would like to remind all pharmacy contractors, who are or who may in future become involved in the supply of Enzalutamide through community pharmacy for the treatment of prostate cancer, of their obligation as part of the service level agreement to purchase Enzalutamide (Xtandi®) medicine through the formal UK supply chain, which is through the wholesaler Alliance. We appreciate your co-operation in this.

Benzodiazepines for Fear of Flying: Fear of flying is considered one of the top three phobias in the adult population. It is recognised that patients often approach their GP to seek benzodiazepines ahead of flying <u>but benzodiazepines are not licensed to treat those with a fear of flying</u>. Please see the advice below that can be given should a patient attend a GP practice due to fear of flying:

- •Often reassurance about the patients' fitness to fly can alleviate apprehensions
- Signpost the patient to fear of flying courses available across the various airlines (British Airways https://flyingwithconfidence.com/, EasyJet https://flyingwithconfidence.com/, EasyJet https://flywith.virginatlantic.com/il/en/wellbeing-and-health/flying-withoutfear.html
- Advise the patient to inform cabin crew of their fear in order that they can support inflight
- In severe cases, you could refer the patient for cognitive behavioural therapy

PHARMACY FIRST PLUS + UPDATES

Starting Pharmacy First Plus We encourage those qualified as an IP and interested in starting the service to check in with CP Lanarkshire Website- this contains all the information needed on getting started, ordering forms, instructions on joining the peer review group. Antimicrobial Prescribing Optimising antimicrobial use remains an important way to minimise the threat from antimicrobial resistance. In winter there is an increase in people presenting with symptoms of respiratory infections but most winter respiratory tract infections are caused by viruses and do not require treatment with antibiotics. It is vital for clinicians to follow advice on antibiotic prescribing from the Scottish Antimicrobial Prescribing Group and NHS Lanarkshire antibiotic prescribing guidelines on when to use antibiotics, the choice of antibiotic and duration of treatment. We encourage our pharmacist IPs to use and follow these resources.

Pharmacy First Plus IP Peer Review Group in Lanarkshire There is a growth of new pharmacists now undertaking prescribing, and the pharmacy first plus service- I wanted to issue a gentle reminder of our own Lanarkshire IP Peer Review Network Group, whom meet quarterly, this good for service governance, your own CPD, and linking in with

CLINICAL SERVICE UPDATES

Addiction Services Updates Neo 360 Ort Module Communication Tool A gentle reminder that the NEO communication tool is live and available for pharmacies to use. The communications tool will allow community pharmacies to report when patients have missed more than 3 doses or are no longer attending that community pharmacy directly to the patients' community addiction team by e-mail. This will provide a robust audit trail and allow communication between community pharmacy and addiction team. The early reporting of missed doses is important as this allows addiction services to respond to patients who have missed doses quickly. The e-mail will be sent from the NEO system directly, but will use the pharmacies e-mail address to allow for reply or further communication between the community pharmacy and the addiction team.

As we are nearing the end of the financial year a gentle reminder to all pharmacies to check their NEO submissions are up to date, and no submissions have been missed to ensure correct payment. Thank you.

IT/Digital Team Updates NHS.Scot Shared Mailboxes NHS Lanarkshire Digital Team are currently in the process of auditing all pharmacy shared mailboxes to ensure you all have the coverage you require and to remove access for staff who no longer work in your pharmacy. It is very important that when someone leaves the pharmacy you send an email from your pharmacy's shared mailbox

<u>SWAN1 > SWAN 2 (Independent Pharmacy Contractors)</u> Over the coming weeks and months NSS are working with our partners BT to facilitate the move from SWAN1 > SWAN2, this will bring a fibre connection to your pharmacy, also upgrading your current WIFI solution. Colleagues from the ePharmacy Helpdesk are contacting the pharmacy by telephone to book both visits (1st Hardware install & 2nd Connectivity transition). Please share details of the planned

Controlled Drugs Team Update All Private CD Prescriptions for Schedule 2 and 3 CDs (i.e. PPCD(1) Forms) are to be sent to NSS along with your mid-/end-of-month submissions, and are to be accompanied by a CD34 form, which can be ordered from Practitioner Services, 3 Bain Square, Livingston, EH54 7DQ (Tel: 01506 705100).
