Dissemination Error of Shingles PGD

You may be aware that we recently shared an attachment and information on the Shingles PGD within our newsletter dated 9th February. We can confirm that this was shared in error, and is not applicable for pharmacy services. Please note our apologies for any confusion this may have caused.

Codeine Linctus (Codeine Oral Solutions): Reclassification to Prescription-only Medicine

In October 2022, the Commission on Human Medicines (CHM) advised that codeine linctus should be made available as a prescription-only medicine (POM). The MHRA <u>undertook a public consultation</u> to obtain views on its reclassification. The consultation ran from 18 July 2023 to 15 August 2023.

Following the results of the public consultation and the further advice of the CHM, codeine linctus will no longer be supplied without a prescription. This is a risk minimisation measure to protect the health of patients in need of treatment, to prevent recreational use and to enable the identification of individuals who may have become unintentionally addicted to codeine.

Patients will still be able to access codeine linctus with a prescription from a qualified healthcare professional. This will ensure that the medicine is used safely and appropriately under medical supervision.

Pseudoephedrine: Very Rare Risk of Posterior Reversible Encephalopathy Syndrome (PRES) and Reversible Cerebral Vasoconstriction (RCVS)

There have been very rare reports of PRES and RCVS with pseudoephedrine. A review of the available evidence, including the assessment of cumulative reporting of adverse drug reaction reports, was considered by the Pharmacovigilance Expert Advisory Group (PEAG) of the Commission on Human Medicines (CHM).

The PEAG recommended updates to the <u>Summary of Product Characteristics (SmPC)</u> and the <u>Patient Information Leaflet (PIL)</u> to further describe the risk of PRES and RCVS and the potential risk factors for these conditions, and advised the MHRA to remind healthcare professionals and patients of these risks.

Smoking Cessation Update

Smoking Cessation Data, Quarter 2 July – September 2023

We have received the smoking data for Quarter 2, July to September 2023. Please note the data is always 6 months behind.

Below shows a summary of all pharmacies in Grampian; sign-ups and missed submissions at 4 weeks and 12 weeks. Remember if you sign someone up, you can claim at 4 weeks providing you've made an effort to support them (tried to contact them on 3 separate occasions). Someone who swaps to vaping is classed as a successful tobacco quit!

It's vital for National data that we know what has happened to patients at the 4 week mark and you will still be paid even if they have been "lost to follow up" or are still smoking, so please ensure the PCR record is updated at the 4 week mark for ALL sign-ups. Patients lost to follow up or still smoking at 4 weeks cannot continue to completion and should be closed off on PCR.

Great improvement again at the 12 week mark, well done!

Missed submissions for July to September (Quarter 2) 2023

- Sign-ups in total = 860
- Missed submissions at 4 weeks = 276
- Missed submissions at 12 weeks = 5

TOTAL PERCENTAGE OF MISSED AT 4 WEEK STAGE = 32% TOTAL LOSS TO PHARMACIES = £4315

Missed submissions for July to September (Quarter 2) 2022 as a comparison

- Sign-ups in total = 732
- Missed submissions at 4 weeks = 251
- Missed submissions at 12 weeks = 31

TOTAL PERCENTAGE OF MISSED AT 4 WEEK STAGE = 34%

TOTAL LOSS TO PHARMACIES = £4850

Pharmacy Care Record (PCR) for Locums

We have heard a few concerns that the smoking records on PCR are not updated by locum pharmacists who see patients for Smoking Cessation Services.

To be able to deliver a number of both core and national contractual services it is essential to have a personal user ID and password to allow access and utilise the PCR. To request a user name and password complete a PCR Registration Form, hosted on Microsoft Forms. This request should be undertaken prior to working as a locum pharmacist within NHS Grampian.

Please remind ALL locums working with you that they have a responsibility to be able to log into PCR and update all appropriate records.
