▲ Sodium Valproate- Information for Primary Care (What does this mean for Community Pharmacy?)

There are well documented significant risks of serious harm to a baby after exposure to valproate in pregnancy. A number of new additional measures have been introduced by the MHRA aiming to ensure valproate is only used if other treatments are ineffective or not tolerated. Also that any valproate use in women of childbearing potential must be in accordance with the Pregnancy Prevention Programme (PPP/PREVENT).

NPSA alert relating to Valproate prescribing states all Health Boards must put the following requirements in place:

- Valproate must not be started in new patients (male or female) younger than 55 years, unless two specialists independently consider and document that there is no other effective or tolerated treatment, or there are compelling reasons that the reproductive risks do not apply.
- At their next annual specialist review, women of childbearing potential and girls should be reviewed using a revised valproate Risk Acknowledgement Form, which will include the need for a second specialist signature if the patient is to continue with valproate. Subsequent annual reviews require only one specialist signature, unless the patient's situation changes.

Verification Certificate Renewal

A reminder regarding the verification certificate renewal for CPs which needs to be manually completed before 24th March. *If the new certificate has not been installed on the PC where the ePharmacy adapter is installed, your pharmacy will no longer be able to download AMS or MCR (SRx) prescriptions,* the electronic prescription data will not be displayed within your PMR and all details will require to be keyed.

To avoid this happening, please download your pharmacy's replacement certificate as soon as possible. The download should only take a few minutes to complete, following the installation instructions which can be found at the following location: <u>http://www.eps.nds.scot.nhs.uk/VertCert/install.html</u>. Please

note that this certificate is common to all Community Pharmacies and the installation does not require any PIN or other pharmacy specific details to be entered.

Community Initiatives North East (CFINE) can provide free sanitary products to all pharmacies within Aberdeen City. If you'd like to stock free products, please contact CFINE. They will deliver the products straight to the pharmacy and you can subsequently order on-demand or set up an automatic repeat delivery system. Aberdeenshire

There is no single point-of-contact for community pharmacies and delivery to pharmacies is challenging due to the geographical spread across Aberdeenshire but we are still exploring options. However, free period products are still available at community hubs around Aberdeenshire. There are distribution hubs confirmed in Huntly, Alford, Ballater, Inverurie, Banff, Fraserburgh, Maud, Peterhead, Banchory, Stonehaven, Portlethen, Laurencekirk and Edzell Woods (full details listed below)

More breast cancers detected in first evaluation of breast screening AI

An artificial intelligence (AI) breast screening solution called Mia helped doctors find an additional 12 percent more cancers than in routine practice, as announced today in collaboration with Kheiron Medical Technologies, NHS Grampian, the University of Aberdeen and Microsoft. If deployed across the entire NHS, a 12 percent uplift in the detection of breast cancer could lead to better outcomes for thousands of women across the UK. The augmented AI workflow also showed a decrease in women recalled unnecessarily for further assessment and modelled a workload reduction of up to 30 percent.
