

Aims


Ensure	Ensure pharmacy staff have the information needed to get IEP up and running in their pharmacy
Provide	Provide opportunity to ask questions on any aspect of IEP
Ensure	Ensure people accessing services have access to all of the equipment needed to reduce risks associated with injecting substances
Ensure	Ensure people accessing IEP services in Grampian have access to supportive, discreet and confidential support



What to order – minimum recommended

- 1 x box (400) 1Ml single kits
- 1 x box (400) 2mL orange single kit
- 1 x box (400) 2mL blue single kit
- 1 x box (2000) 5ml plastic water amps (?split a box)
- 1 x box (100) foil pack of 5 sheets
- 1 x box (70) 0.35L sharps bin (fine to order 0.6L too)
- 5 x box (1) 1L sharps bin
- Carrier bag preference
 - alternate colour type when ordering.
 - Free for purposes of needle exchange. Please do not use for other pharmacy services.



Single Use Packs

3 single use pack types

- 1mL insulin syringe (small veins of arms, hands etc)
- 2mL syringe plus blue needle (groin)
- 2ml syringe plus orange needle (slightly thinner and shorter than blue pack)
- No maximum amount
- Peer distribution of equipment ok

ADVICE....?

- use the smallest needle possible to access the vein
- Advise against use of any high-risk sites highlighted e.g. neck, breasts etc. Encourage of from enhanced IEP
- Encourage new kit for every injecting episode
- Encourage against sharing equipment
- Dispose safely after each injection

Other contents: 1 each of Spoon, Filter, Alcohol Pre-Injection Swab, Vitamin C

Vitamin C

- Less acidic than citric acid theoretically less risk of harm to veins and injecting site
- Remember for a single dose these sachets contain more than needed

ADVICE...?

- Add a little at a time
- If there are any stubborn grains left likely to be impurities
- Do not continue to add vitamin C, filter out impurities
- Single use discard any remainder





Water for Injection and Foil

5ML PLASTIC VIALS OF WATER FOR INJECTION ADVICE...?

- Recommend one per injection
- Discard remainder
- Ensure familiar with water risks (leaflet available)

WALLETS OF FOIL X 5 SHEETS PER PACK

ADVICE...?

- Encourage replacement of injections with smoking to decrease harm to sites

Pre-injection swabs, Spoon and filter

SPOON AND FILTER ADVICE

- Single use
- Advise clients to bend handle upwards
- Handle reduces heat transfer when cooking
- Stable flat bottom with leg to balance



PRE-INJECTION SWABS ADVICE

Tie into hygiene advice

- Use pre-injection swab to clean planned injection site BEFORE injecting
- Recommend soap and hot water for hands and sites
- Physical area of preparation e.g. table clear and clean

What if outdoors/no running water?







Sharps bins

- 0.35L, 0.6L and 1L bins available to order
- Returns encouraged but not needed to supply new equipment
- ADA and Arrows can arrange for home collection of larger volumes

- Top photo 1ml IPED pack contents
- Bottom hand 2mL IPED pack contents blue needles missing from picture

IPED packs

What are they used for?

1mL packs

• subcutaneous injections e.g. growth hormone, insulin, injectable tan

2mL packs

- intramuscular injections e.g. steroids
- Recommend draw up with green needle (puncture bung on vial, often oily)
- Discard green needle and change for blue needle for injecting into the muscle

IPED INFO

Over the last few decades, the use of **Image and Performance Enhancing Drugs (IPEDs)** has become more widespread. Alongside this increase in use, there has been an associated rise in the number of reported infections and complications associated with **IPED** use.

Returns and Waste Collection




- 60L yellow lidded, grey bins currently recommended
- Ordered and uplifted through standard Perfect Hygiene procedures
- Sharps should be returned in sealed sharps container

 ideally placed directly in the large bin by the person returning them
- Options if loose needles returned
 - Provide small sharps bin and ask person to place them in it for you
 - If larger amount ask the person to place directly in the large bin and seal immediately for uplift

Needle stick injuries

- Staff should avoid handling loose needles or syringes
- In the unlikely occurrence of needle stick, Occupational Health's exposure guidance should be followed

Hepatitis B Vaccination

- Prevalence of hepatitis B in Scotland is relatively low however around a third of people who inject drugs are thought to be unvaccinated
- ADVICE: Encourage uptake/check status
- All staff involved in delivery of injecting equipment provision can access hepatitis B vaccination free of charge



Recording transactions: neo360

- What is neo360?
- Web based system to record IEP transactions
- <u>https://scotland.neo360.systems/Secure/Login</u>
- Used by all mainland health boards
- Help staff tailor intervention to person
- You can only see information for your pharmacy but each client should have one identifier they use in all IEPs in Grampian
- Helps inform service development locally and nationally
 - Types of substance
 - Risk activity e.g. sharing, outdoors injecting
 - Quantity of equipment
- Automatic payment for community pharmacies

Direct entry at time of transaction



Why is this important?

- Anonymous service need way of knowing this is one person without being able to identify them from the data
- Challenges with writing down identifiers
 - Multiple identifiers for one person inaccurate estimate of people who inject substances in Scotland
 - Go to enter regular attendee but can't find no record
 - Have to start new record don't have all information you need
 - Missing or wrong data entered
 - Can be difficult to interpret writing...

Anonymous identifiers

- Help people create their identifier
 - We do not identify people from the data they give us, no information shared with CPN, GP etc unless they ask us to help.
- Encourage them to use the same one wherever they go
 - We know this identifier represents one person without needing to know who you are
 - Saves asking for all information every time you come in
 - Helps pharmacy team know what to discuss with you regardless of who serves you
 - Helps shape services always anonymous
 - Ways to do this note on phone, card in wallet, something they will remember

Anonymous identifiers

Doesn't need to be their own initials if very resistant however easier to work out. Gender and year of birth are key

• Gender is selected in a drop down

To build the anonymous identifier....


- 1st initial of first name and 1st and 4th initial of surname plus date of birth
 - E.g. John Smith 1st January 1990 = JST01/01/1990
- What if their surname has less than 4 letters? Use a * for 4th initial
 - E.g. Graeme Hay_ 31st March 2000 = GH*31/01/2000
