Community Pharmacy Opioid Overdose Campaign – a "Public Health Emergency" 2020-2021 – Thursday 25.06.20



All community pharmacies within NHS GGC are being encouraged to hold a supply of naloxone for emergency use. This is supported by The Drug Deaths Task Force, Chief Pharmaceutical Officer, Community Pharmacy Scotland and Primary Care Pharmacy Leads.

Naloxone is a medicine which can temporarily reverse the effects of opioids in a suspected opioid overdose, buying time for an ambulance to arrive. It can legally be administered to anyone by anyone in order to save a life. This is the same exemption under the Human Medicines Regulations 2012, as adrenaline has for anaphylaxis. Not all community pharmacies have naloxone available for use in an emergency situation.

In 2018 a total of 1187 individuals lost their life to a drug-related death, with the majority involving an opioid. Community pharmacies are increasingly being approached to assist in a suspected life threatening opioid overdose in the vicinity of the pharmacy. Within NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde there have been 18 confirmed administrations of naloxone by community pharmacy staff. Community pharmacies are viewed by the public as an accessible contact point for initial first aid, often before an ambulance is called. The evidence demonstrates that pharmacists and their staff are able to identify opioid overdose, respond appropriately and ultimately save lives.

Contractors are being asked to identify staff within the pharmacy who will be able to respond to an emergency opioid overdose. Staff who are not existing naloxone trainers can access a free short online e-learning module, "Overdose Prevention, Intervention and Naloxone" by the Scottish Drugs Forum <a href="https://www.sdftraining.org.uk/online-learning/156-overdose-prevention-intervention-and-naloxone-3">https://www.sdftraining.org.uk/online-learning/156-overdose-prevention-intervention-and-naloxone-3</a>

Prenoxad Injection®, is currently the first line option for lay administration within NHS GGC. Guidance on how to assemble and administer can be viewed at <a href="http://www.prenoxadinjection.com/">http://www.prenoxadinjection.com/</a>

Each community pharmacy will be reimbursed £18 for the cost of a Prenoxad® kit.

It is hoped that all pharmacies will be willing to participate in this important life saving scheme and demonstrate the role that pharmacists in GGC can play in helping to address Scotland's drug death emergency. Please return signed copies of the participation and reimbursement forms.

INFORMATION	Remote Prescribing by NHS24 Clinicians – Thursday 02.07.2020
	NHS 24 has seen an increase in the number of times an NHS 24 prescriber has remotely prescribed a medicine for a member of the public calling the 111 Service. To date, these prescriptions have been telephoned-in to the caller's preferred community pharmacy, without any written confirmation of the prescription being received by the pharmacist until the prescription arrives within 72 hours.
	NHS 24 is now set to introduce a new approach for remote prescribing, whereby the community pharmacy will now be sent an email which contains an NHS 24 Clinical Assessment Summary (information on NHS 24's clinical assessment) with the prescription details included. The email will come from <a href="mailto:noreply@nhs24.scot.nhs.uk">noreply@nhs24.scot.nhs.uk</a> so please add this email address to your address book so that future emails from this address do not go into your junk folder.
	This approach will ensure the community pharmacist receives all relevant clinical information/context around an NHS 24 remote prescription request, and help reduce the risk of transcription errors.
	In all cases, NHS 24 prescribers will still comply with the Human Medicines Regulations 2012, ensuring the original prescription is received by the community pharmacy within 72 hours.
	In preparation for go-live, each pharmacy will shortly receive an email from NHS 24 (from <a href="MHS24APS@nhs24.scot.nhs.uk">NHS24APS@nhs24.scot.nhs.uk</a> ) with a read receipt request to confirm NHS 24 has the correct email address for you. A follow up email will be sent a week after the initial email to any pharmacies who have not sent back a read receipt.
	A sample email and report will be shared with you when we notify you of the go-live date.
	NHS 24 hopes this will prove to be a positive development for community pharmacies across the country, and lead to an improved patient journey for members of the public.

ACTION	Opening of Clinical Mailboxes – Friday 03.07.20
	In the last week we have received several examples where patients have attended their community pharmacy to obtain a drug initiated by secondary care i.e. oncology, and where the pharmacy has claimed not to know anything about the referral.
	As you can imagine, this has been distressing for the patient and has caused unnecessary work for all the Pharmacy and Admin Teams involved.
	Although the clinical mailbox process has only come into its own during the COVID 19 crisis, we have been using this as a means of communicating secondary care referrals since 2017. The standard generic mailbox process has been in existence since 2006we must stress again the importance of checking these mailboxes on a daily basis.
	If you experience difficulties in accessing either of your mailboxes, if you need your password reset, or if you need to add someone to have access to a mailbox you should contact the IT Helpdesk on 0345-612-5000.
	Over the next month or so, the Community Pharmacy Development Team will be conducting an exercise to update the user information for all of the community pharmacy generic mailboxes (both clinical and generic). This is to ensure that the information migrating to the new mail system is as up to date as possible. This exercise will involve a five minute phone call. Please support us in undertaking this important piece of work.

ACTION	Rentokil offer to uplift waste from Care Homes – Monday 07.07.20
	On 24 <sup>th</sup> June we communicated that Initial/Rentokil (the company who currently uplifts patient's returned waste from community pharmacies) had made an offer for pharmacies that provide services to Care Homes.

We have had several requests from community pharmacies asking Rentokil to uplift waste from Care Homes, however the process to date has not been successful and is at risk of being withdrawn. The majority of the requests have not been carried out successfully and have resulted in no uplift or an aborted uplift. It is essential for this service to continue that community pharmacies clearly communicate the requirements to the care home involved so that the home is clear on their responsibilities when Rentokil visit the home.

# ACTION RETURN TO ORIGINAL MODEL HOURS OF SERVICE – Wednesday 08.07.20

As the country starts to move out of lock down and businesses and NHS services begin to return to some form of normality I have taken the opportunity to review the reduction in core model hours that we had in place to allow Community Pharmacies to manage their work load through the COVID pandemic.

In May I completed the same exercise and on presenting to the Pharmacy Practice Committee (PPC), was advised that they did not feel it was the correct time to be returning to core hours and that the decision should be delayed in light of the Scottish Governments instructions at that time.

With these instructions changing, I reviewed the situation and once again presented to the PPC and they are now supportive of a return to our original core model hours.

I am aware that a number of pharmacies throughout the pandemic did not alter their hours of opening, some have since returned to their normal hours and some pharmacies are still currently running on reduced hours. This situation is making it difficult for other services and patients to know when and where to access Pharmacy services at specific times.

Therefore I would like to ask that each Pharmacy return to our original core model hours with effect from *Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2020* - those being:

- 09.00 to 17.30 Monday to Saturday
- Lunchtime closing 1 hour in the middle of the day

This information will be supplied to all services from this date and we would ask that if a pharmacy is unable to comply with this requirement then in the normal manner they advise the CPDT team of this and the reasons behind the non compliance. You should use the form provided at:

First of all, thank you for your continued dedication and hard work during the current crisis.

On 1<sup>st</sup> July 2020 the Pharmacy Contractors Committee agreed to a single monthly payment for disulfiram patients; £15.00 per patient per month. To claim for payment a patient needs to attend once or more for disulfiram supervision in a calendar month or have instalment dispensing specified on their prescription without supervision. This will simplify claiming while the overall service remains the same. Communicating any concerns, for example a missed dose, promptly (within 24 hours) remains the most important part of the service. The related SLA is attached for signing and return. Please note this mentions breathalysing as standard, as previously communicated due to COVID-19 infection risk breathalysing should <u>not</u> be part of the assessment until further notice.

Can I also take this opportunity to urge you to check your supervised disulfiram claims are up to date (claim form attached), as claiming methods will be changing from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2020. You can check with myself if you are unsure what months for which you have been paid or if you have any other queries (telephone number below). Later this month I will send further communication regarding the use of an interim claim form, longer term we will move to paper free claiming (via the NEO system).

# **Interpretation of Guidance on Face Coverings – Wednesday 08.07.20**

As you will be aware, as an additional measure to contain the risk of infection, Scottish Government has mandated that, from 10 July, face coverings must be worn in all enclosed indoor spaces, including community pharmacies. Full details on this guidance can be downloaded from the dedicated <u>information page</u> with the following aspects highlighted as the main features to consider. Community pharmacy teams will be the largest group in the healthcare sector to be exposed to these changes. Your level of commitment into the management of the pandemic to date has been exemplary and this change provides a further opportunity to demonstrate the key role you play in protecting the health and wellbeing of the patients you care for.

- Although the requirement is compulsory you will be required to use your professional judgement in interpretation of the guidance.
- A number of exemptions are listed as examples for patients who may not be able to wear a mask. This is not an exhaustive list and you will come across other conditions in the course of your pharmacy practice that will inform your judgment.
- Exemptions likely to be relevant in a community pharmacy include those who
  cannot apply a covering nor wear it in the proper manner safely and consistently
  or have a reasonable need to eat or drink or need to take medication. The latter
  includes patients receiving supervised opiate substitution therapy (OST).
- Police Scotland are responsible for enforcement
- As with any major change in legislation patients may not fully understand the implications of not adhering to the letter of the law and would benefit from your growing experience on how they could reduce the risk of infection to themselves, their families, and you and your staff.
- Whilst attempting to ensure a degree of consistency across the pharmacy network it is important to remember that there will be variance on how the legislation is interpreted and applied. Community pharmacy teams should exercise professional judgement and advise and support patients to help them comply with the new regulations.
- Further guidance is available from the RPS and CPS and both have issued

posters for display to the public. In addition we will endeavour to keep you up to date with developments. In particular we would welcome feedback on how the new restrictions are being applied by your patients and customers

 In all instances it remains our strong recommendation that pharmacy teams lead by example and wear PPE at all times even though screens may have been erected and restrictions applied to numbers entering your premises. This is critical to protect you, your team, your families and the pharmacy service whilst the risk of infection remains a major risk.

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Below is information from the GPhC updating and clarifying their position on COVID-19 antibody testing in community pharmacies. The GPhC has a FAQ section on their website and this is their current response to on-site testing:

A pharmacy is offering an antibody rapid test service. Is this allowed?

Antibody tests are used to detect antibodies to the COVID-19 virus to see if you have previously had the virus. Some pharmacies are offering a test within the pharmacy. Public Health England <u>currently advises against the use of rapid point of care tests</u> – where results can usually be obtained within 10 minutes – due to insufficient information about their accuracy and suitability for diagnosing COVID-19.

We do not expect pharmacies to be providing tests which do not adhere to guidance from the public health agencies in Great Britain. Where we have been made aware that a pharmacy is offering these tests we've told them to stop doing so.

Please let us know about any pharmacies providing tests that do not adhere to guidance from the MHRA or public health agencies by <u>raising a concern</u>. We will then consider what action to take. Please also report this to the MHRA.

We will keep our position under review in light of any changes to the situation, including any changes in guidance from the MHRA or public health agencies.

We do not have the jurisdiction over and would not advise on the legality, safety or efficacy of particular types of tests or kit.

This has been discussed between pharmacy professionals and lawyers who have been able to interpret and explain the nuances of MHRA guidance and details such as CE markings on tests. CE certification is done differently on kits for different intended uses. The kits that pharmacies are using do comply with MHRA guidance. But due to how they are certified, the CE mark is not necessarily an approval from MHRA.

Public Health England (PHE) is supporting and leading on the government and UK wide response to the pandemic, so GPhC considers their guidance to be authoritative across Scotland, Wales and England. As PHE have provided a very clear statement on the use of point of care rapid test kits in the community, and specifically referencing pharmacies, we have aligned our approach. Therefore, where a pharmacy is providing this testing service, we are asking them to stop.

So, for those pharmacies that are known to be carrying out tests, we will be phoning pharmacy owners, superintendents, or responsible pharmacists to ask them to stop testing, and remove reference to it from their website. We will be do this in a supportive manner. In line with our approach when we issue guidance to pharmacies or pharmacy professionals following concerns being raised, we do not intend to follow up to ensure compliance.


