N:\COMMUNITY CARE\COMMUNITY PI PI N:\COMMUNITY CARE\COMMUNITY PI	The attached NHS Circular contains full guidance on the use of the NHS Near Me technology to enable you to consult remotely with your selected cohort of patients to minimise their risk of exposure to COVID-19 infection. A copy of the information distributed previously is also attached to assist you in installing the necessary equipment and contains details of sites that can be accessed for additional help and advice. This is a key development in enabling community pharmacies to continue to provide care and support for those patients restricted in their ability to attend the pharmacy in person and yet value and welcome this type of innovation as a key contributory factor in maintaining their wellbeing. The feature is particularly well suited to provide access to the NHS Pharmacy First service already attracting considerable interest but previously would have been practically unobtainable to this sector under the conditions prevailing at that time. I commend the concept to you and strongly encourage toutilise this facility to the fullest extent that can be accommodated within your pharmacy.

INFORMATION	HBP Prescriptions - issue regarding number of items requested on several scripts – Monday 03.08.2020
	The Department has been made aware of a number of instances when the number of items handwritten on a HBP prescription has been challenged by the pharmacist and, on a few occasions, when the script has not been accepted for dispensing. Hospital Blue Pad (HBP) scripts are issued by hospital colleagues and, since the introduction of the likes of the Hep C and Oncology treatment options, are increasingly being used in practice reversing the trend of previous years. Within NHS GGC, in the absence of an electronic option, these scripts have to be either handwritten or a bespoke stamp used specific to that service. The general ruling that applies to electronic scripts issued in primary care limits the number of items on a script to 3. Although this has always been considered best practice when hand writing scripts, there had been considerable variance in the application of that guidance. Similarly in secondary care, perhaps influenced by a previous culture of limiting the use of HBPs, some scripts will be issued bearing more than 3 items. I would be grateful if you could contact this office should this present a problem so that we can collate examples and take up the issue on your behalf. It should not be expected that this would prevent the script being dispensed unless the content was indecipherable due to the quality of handwriting.

UPDATE	Supply of Iron Preparations previously on MAS – Friday 31.07.2020
	The Community Pharmacy network were extremely supportive in supplying Iron preparations to pregnant women under MAS during the pandemic to prevent the need for the patient to attend hospital.
	As the MAS formulary has now been replaced with the New Pharmacy First Product List, many of you have noticed that Iron preparations are no longer listed and therefore if prescribed would not be paid. I made Obstetrics departments aware of this back in June and again on the 20th of July so no new patients should be presenting to you for a supply.
	There will, however be patients who have been issued a letter from their clinics which asks for supply to be made where the patient has already had a previous supply. If you are presented with one of these letters we would ask that you honour the supply and

<ul> <li>intimate to the patient that they should return to the clinic for further supplies ( a suggestion would be to supply 3-6 months depending on the patients needs). These prescriptions will be paid as long as the claim is received by PSD before the 1st of October which allows for situations like this to be washed through the system and paid accordingly.</li> <li>I hope this helps clarify the situation.</li> </ul>

Declaration of Interest Form - Final ( Attached	For action by those pharmacies who have not previously replied and wish to provide the service I apologise in advance for the extremely short notice given to respond to this request but it is indicative of the external pressures that we have to accommodate in order to obtain stock and be able to participate in providing this service. Planning for this year's Community Pharmacy flu immunisation programmes commenced in earnest with circulation of a request for details of those pharmacies wishing to participate in the 2020/21 campaigns. The 65% return rate received by the 31 July due date demonstrates the keen willingness within the network to be involved in providing this service. There is an increased sense of urgency associated with this year's

programme with the Board required to submit details of those community pharmacies participating in this year's campaigns to Movianto by this <b>Friday 7 August</b> . ACTION	NHS 24 – ECS Access Line – Thursday 13.08.20
	Contractors should be aware that NHS24 are planning to cease operation of the temporary NHS 24 ECS access line that has been running since the COVID-19 outbreak began.
	The plan is to cease operation from <b>21st August</b> due to a significant reduction in call demand on the line, and the fact that the vast majority of pharmacists now have direct access from the pharmacy. With the minimal demand for access through NHS 24, it is very difficult to justify the staff resource needed to maintain operating the line.
	Pharmacists without access could still in theory phone NHS24 on 111 for ECS access (although not the preferred route), direct access from the pharmacy is a safer and more efficient way of accessing the information. Notification of this change will come through the CPS bulletin.

ACTION	PCA(P) (2020) 16 - Community Pharmacy - National Career Pathway & Introduction of a Common Clinical Conditions Independent Prescribing Service (NHS Pharmacy First Plus) – Tuesday 18.08.2020
	The attached circular contains details of major changes to the Community Pharmacy based independent prescribing programme that will have a significant impact on how this skill is applied in practice
	The concept of independent prescribing (IP) by non-medical practitioners was established over 20 years ago and provided welcomed opportunities for personal and service development across the pharmacy profession. From its fledgling start, the concept of IP by community pharmacists has strived to become main stream despite the best efforts and commitment of many dedicated pharmacists. Whilst attaining the IP qualification is linked to career progression in secondary care and embedded in the pharmacotherapy service in primary care, it's fair to say that in community pharmacy, apart from a few notable exceptions, that a number of inherent difficulties with the current format prevented the concept becoming established as a viable model of service - Until now! . The attraction of utilising a largely untapped pool of expertise in this respect coupled with the need to fulfil the professional aspirations of community pharmacists vindicates that a change in direction is required if the ambitions of the various pharmaceutical care and NHS strategies are to be realised and the promises they hold for patients delivered.
	The launch of the NHS Pharmacy First Scotland Service, providing treatment options for those presenting with a minor ailment, centres on the unique and prominent role that community pharmacy already has in this specialist area. The launch of <b>NHS Scotland Pharmacy First Plus</b> from September 2020 onwards provides a mechanism to utilise the IP qualification and prescribe for Common Clinical Conditions (CCC) in this setting acknowledges that expertise, resolves the various issues impeding progress and builds on an established strength to considerably enhance the patient experience.
	Those pioneering efforts have not been in vain and have featured prominently in determining a way forward that could harness and build on that enthusiasm and expertise. Focusing on prescribing for Common Clinical Conditions heralds a major

opportunity for this service& capitalises on the virtually unassailable position that
community pharmacy already has in this area. The facility provides community
pharmacists with an important weapon in their armoury and redefines the role they play in the provision of suitable treatments for a range of conditions that will increase in
number and complexity as the service matures and develops further. Importantly the
Circular also seeks to define a national career pathway for community pharmacists and
confirms a commitment to support this key element on an ongoing basis
Currently the content gives an overview of how the service will be taken forward and
will be particularly relevant to those with an IP qualification. Whilst more specific details are awaited on some practical aspects, it is envisaged that those IP's who have
successfully completed the NES course on CCC's will be involved from the outset with
others participating on completion of their CCC training.
I commend the development to you and recognise this as one of the most radical and
progressive initiatives I have ever seen in over 30 years of practice. It brings the promise to positively change how the profession is viewed by patients and other health
and social care providers. Little did anyone ever foresee the day that those humble and
initially struggling clinics in Drumchapel, Parkhead, Easterhouse to name but a few
would propel community pharmacy in Scotland to the forefront of practice on a global scale.

INFORMATION	Supply disruptions continue with Enalapril – Friday 21.08.2020
	Supply disruptions continue with enalapril. At this time, although limited, there is still enalapril stock in the system and it is advisable to make enquiries at several pharmacies/ wholesalers to try to source stock. Where a patient is unable to obtain their normal enalapril prescription, prescribers may need to consider switching patients to an alternative Angiotensin-converting enzyme inhibitor (ACEI).

INFORMATION	Proposed discontinuation of Priadel Tablets - Tuesday 25.08.2020
	Essential Pharma issued a communication in July 2020 indicating that they are planning to discontinue Priadel 200mg and 400mg Tablets by April 2021. National Procurement are aware of this proposal and national guidance is awaited. In response to this proposal, a GGC multi-disciplinary cross sector short life working group (including representatives from mental health services and Primary Care) has been formed to take forward the GGC response.
	Patients and carers are likely to be concerned and anxious about having to switch brands of lithium.
	<ul> <li>Clinicians are asked to provide reassurance that alternative lithium preparations remain available.</li> <li>The short life working group will communicate fully and clearly with all relevant parties as more information becomes available nationally.</li> <li>A switch model and guidance will be finalised well in advance of the discontinuation of Priadel, allowing patients to be switched appropriately and safely to an alternative brand.</li> </ul>

EWS - All HSCPs - August 2020.pdf Attached	Please find attached an updated document which contains the Early Warning Systems for each of the Board's HSCP's. Please identify your pharmacy within the attached document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone. As a reminder, this cascade system can be started by either a Board officer or any community pharmacist. Any one initiating the system should telephone the master station clearly relaying the message that is required for circulation. The master station will start the chain of calls by telephoning the next pharmacy on the list, who will in turn, telephone the master Station. When the Master Station receives a call from the last pharmacy in the cascade, it should contact the person who initiated the cascade thus completing the cycle. It is essential that pharmacies follow this cascade in the specified order to ensure that all pharmacies receive the message and that the communication is successfully exchanged throughout each HSCP System. Closed pharmacies should be by-passed however; it would be helpful to telephone them with the message once they reopen. In these instances, please advise that you have already passed on the message to the pharmacy they were expected to contact, which will stop unnecessary calls.
