URGENT INFORMATION	Message From AAH Pharmaceuticals – Employees Testing Positive for COVID-19 – Tuesday 01.09.20
	We have been asked to circulate this message to you on behalf of AAH Pharmaceuticals, Polmadie, Glasgow:
	We can confirm that, unfortunately, some colleagues from the AAH Pharmaceuticals' warehouse in Glasgow have tested positive for COVID-19. As a result, we have asked some other employees to self-isolate at home and take a COVID-19 test as soon as possible. We are undertaking a deep clean at the warehouse tonight (30/08/20) including fogging.
	The safety of our colleagues and customers is our priority and we are liaising with Public Health Scotland to ensure that we are taking all the necessary steps that they advise.

Due to the reduction in the workforce at our Glasgow warehouse, we are reducing our
deliveries to pharmacies and other customers in Scotland to once a day for the
very short term. The afternoon cut off time will be brought back to 3pm. We have a
plan to re-route deliveries to other warehouses in our network and information is
available for customers about how this will impact their orders. We aim to keep
disruption to an absolute minimum.

INFORMATION	Decommissioning of Fax Machine – Friday 28.08.20
	Next week Pharmacy Services will migrate to a new telephony system.
	Phone numbers for the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPDT) will not be affected, however the new system does not support fax machines.
	To allow us to continue to receive faxes from community pharmacies, we have had to install a Gateway which will only be available until the end of this financial year. As such CPDT must now start a transition process to allow our fax to be decommissioned.
	The introduction of a paperless claiming process will address much of the fax traffic coming in to the CPDT office. In advance of this we would ask that from now wherever possible contractors should e-mail returns to <u>gg-uhb.cpdevteam@nhs.net</u> instead of utilising the fax. Our fax number will be removed from claim forms/pro-forma on a staged approach as the forms associated with various services are reviewed.

INFORMATION	Serial Prescription Information – Thursday 03.09.20
	You may have noticed an uplift in the number of serial prescriptions coming your way. This has been as a result of a request by the community pharmacy network to try and help manage future workload uplifts should a second wave of COVID come upon us. The more patients that are on serial prescriptions the more manageable the workload can be. Our primary care colleagues and IT have been working hard to support this direction of travel which has generated over 20000 new patients receiving a serial prescription in the last number of weeks. Guidance has already been circulated to community pharmacies in relation to how to manage a serial prescription however I would like to draw your attention to the last part of process which seems to be failing on a number of occasions.
	When a serial prescription has been completed and the final supply has been dispensed from the prescription, a Treatment Summary Report (TSR), has to be completed in order to advise the surgery of the suitability for the patient to continue or otherwise on a new serial prescription. This report also helps create the trigger for a new prescription to be created at the surgery and if not done so could hold up the patients next supply. 	We are experiencing a slight increase in the number of shortages again and we would kindly ask that when you experience a shortage you exhaust all the normal routes of trying to obtain the medication before working with the GP practice to obtain a suitable alternative for your patients.
	We are hearing examples of where patients are being sent back to practices on the request of the pharmacy team to get an alternative with no prior contact with the surgery from the pharmacy. Please work with your practices and where there is no availability of a specific product then be in a position to suggest an alternative product that could be utilised and is available. INFORMATION	Priadel Discontinuation – Tuesday 08.09.20
	The Scottish Government have now circulated a Level 3 Medicines Supply Alert Notice for Lithium carbonate (Priadel® 200mg and 400mg modified release tablets). This has been added to the <u>Staffnet Current Medicine Supply Problems and Shortages page</u> .
	In response to this discontinuation, a GGC multi-disciplinary cross sector short life working group (including representatives from mental health services and Primary Care) has been formed to take forward the GGC response. In the meantime, treatment for existing patients with Priadel tablets should continue as normal however no new patients should be prescribed Priadel tablets.
	Current local primary care supply disruptions
	We are receiving reports of local supply disruptions with Priadel tablets. Essential Pharma advise that there is no manufacturing issues and that there is stock in the

system.
Should community pharmacies have issues then stock can be ordered via Movianto wholesalers (not everyone will have access to do this). Or contact the manufacturer directly. There is more information on how to order direct on the <u>NHSGGC Primary Care</u> <u>Shortages Database</u> .

ACTION	Flu Vaccination Programme – 2020/2021 – Wednesday 09.09.20	
SLA - 2020-21 - Final V6.docx	Following a great deal of planning and discussions between NHS GGC Public Health team, NHS GG&C Community Pharmacy Development Team, CP GG&C and CPS, it has been agreed that Community Pharmacy will play a supportive role in the Flu Vaccination program across the whole of Greater Glasgow and Clyde Health Board for the winter season 2020/21 from participating pharmacies.	
Rev 2021 02 Inactivated flu vaccin	From the 28 <sup>th</sup> of September, Pharmacies will have the opportunity to vaccinate Health and Social Care workers and administer a flu vaccination in line with clear guidelines set out in the Service Level Agreement (SLA) for this service. They will also be able to vaccinate any cohort of patient as advised and specified by NHS GGC as the program progresses including being part of the Board wide mop up service as well as the cohort of patients defined by a lower age group of 50/55 dependent on guidance given. Community Pharmacy colleagues, working in Healthcare areas within Pharmacies, have been recognised as Frontline Workers and as such will be able to be vaccinated through this program from participating pharmacies. The service will attract a payment of <b>£8.27</b> for every patient vaccinated and a participation fee of £250 for each pharmacy taking part in the program. It is intended that each pharmacy participating will deliver a minimum of 50 vaccinations.	
	Each participating pharmacy will have an initial delivery of 50 vaccines from Movianto w/c 28 <sup>th</sup> of September with the details of how to order further vaccines to follow once agreed by either Movianto or local wholesalers. NHS GG&C has purchased the vaccination stock and as such there will be no need for the pharmacy to source stock at this stage however provision will be put in place if private stock from the pharmacy could be utilised to further support this service. Details from Scottish Government around this provision will follow.	
	A number of pharmacies already provide a private Flu service and NHS GG&C will recognise any associated training undertaken. Those pharmacies that do not currently offer a private flu service will need to arrange training for their participating pharmacists. A Statement of Competence (SoC) document must be signed by every pharmacist involved in the pilot and a copy retained within the pharmacy to be produced if requested as part of any evaluation of the pilot or any post payment verification exercise. We are currently making arrangements for the uplift of clinical waste generated during the programme– we will send full details once these are finalised.

	After this date, if the new certificate has not been installed on ePharmacy adapter servers, your pharmacy will <b>no longer be able to download AMS/CMS prescriptions</b> and GP sites will no longer receive compliance/treatment summary messages.

If you haven't already received this e-mail it is because your name wasn't included in the initial spreadsheet sent to Movianto. The e-mail will come through to you in the next week.
	PARTICIPANTS SHOULD PLACE THEIR ORDER FOR THE INITIAL STOCK NO LATER THAN MONDAY 21 <sup>ST</sup> SEPTEMBER TO ENSURE DELIVERY BY THE FOLLOWING MONDAY.
	50 vaccines <u>will NOT</u> be automatically sent to participating contractors w/c 28th September. Each participating contractor will have to place their own order based on predicted needs up to a MAXIMUM of 50 vaccines for their FIRST delivery.
	Subsequent orders will be monitored to ensure excess overordering is not undertaken.

ACTION	Community Pharmacy COVID 19 – Thursday 23.09.2020
Community	If you have been watching the news recently you will be aware of the rise of positive cases of COVID across the country in what is being said is the "second wave" of pandemic.
Pharmacy COVID 19	As a result of a case within a community pharmacy within NHS GGC it was asked of me to circulate a lessons learned document that contractors could refer to, to ensure that they were doing everything possible to minimise the risk of positive cases being detected and potentially spread within their pharmacy environment.
Attached	The attached document outlines those lessons learned and we would recommend that you discuss these with your staff and establish what you can do to help minimise the spread of the virus.

FAQ 20-21.docx	CPDT would like to thank all those contractors who have signed up to this years Flu Vaccination Service before the cut off date of 18/09. The registration period for this service is therefore now closed to any further applicants.
Interflue pilot or dering additional vaccines.c	<ul> <li>There has been some confusion in the initial roll out of the Flu Vaccination Service this year, and as such there are several points that I would like to clear up below.</li> <li>A number of minor alterations have been made to the SLA, which do not affect service delivery from CPs in any way. However I would like to make clear that HSCWs aged 65 or over are <u>not currently eligible</u> for vaccination within a CP setting. This group will be contacted via each individual HSCP to direct them to an alternative service provider. We are not reissuing the SLA. The most up to date document can be accessed at the website (link at end of this e-mail).</li> <li>Similarly within the SoC a small change has been made to highlight the decision made to extend the validity of face to face vaccination training from 3 years to 4 years. This means that for those whose face to face training was needing renewed this year, there is agreement that this does not need to be completed until next year with online refresher training sufficing for this year. Again we are not reissuing the SLA. You can access at the website.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>A Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document has been compiled and will be periodically updated on the community pharmacy Scotland webpage. This will be your source for the most up to date information on practical aspects of the service. Please refer to this document before contacting the CPDT for further advice.</li> <li>A letter to HSCWs will be sent shortly signposting this cohort toward CPs. These letters will state vaccinations can be booked from 5th October onwards, however any CP which receives stock prior to this date may commence vaccinations before 5th October.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>As many of you may already be aware Movianto are currently having IT issues with new user accounts. The details of all participating CPs were resent to Movianto on 21st September, therefore any contractors without access to Movianto's ordering system are asked to check their generic mailboxes (for Boots- clinical mailbox) over the next week.</li> </ul>
• On the issue of Movianto orders, please note that by electing to deliver this service, contractors are pledging to provide a MINIMUM of 50 vaccinations over the service period.
• Bearing in mind that there is an associated <u>carriage charge of £35 per delivery</u> <u>per contractor</u> , please consider this and order as close to 50 vaccines as possible in your first order. We understand that this may not be possible for those with limited fridge space.
<ul> <li>Orders should be placed 3 to 4 working days prior to your store's individually assigned delivery day (given by Movianto) to ensure your delivery is made on time.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Should you require greater than your initial maximum ordering cap of 50 vaccines, please contact <u>cpdt@ggc.scot.nhs.uk</u> as per the attached "ordering additional vaccines" document.</li> </ul>
• Each contractor will receive one 7L sharps bin with deliveries starting this week.
• The NEO flu module will shortly receive an update to accommodate this years altered patient cohort. A user guide will be shared as soon as this is made available.
Please find attached documents discussed above to clarify any queries that you may have.
CPDT are appreciative of the outstanding work that CP teams are doing and the incredible pressures that this year has brought. I would like to thank you all for your help in delivering this vitally important Public Health Service, and commend you for the resilience you have shown over the last few months.

ACTION	COPD Webinar on Thursday 8th of October at 7pm – Tuesday 29.09.2020

INFORMATION	IMPORTANT INFORMATION: BBV Testing in CP – Tuesday 29.09.2020
	Due to the ongoing COVID pandemic the addiction pharmacy team have taken the decision to suspend the BBV Testing Pilot in Community Pharmacy for the foreseeable future. Thank you to all for your willingness and participation in this ground breaking pilot. A total of 312 BBV Tests were performed by community pharmacy staff during the pilot. A total of 98 individuals tested as Hep C positive and 7 HIV positive individuals were identified.
	Please encourage individuals at risk of BBV infection to test every three months. Testing is available via any ADRS team or GP Practice. Testing is also available within Glasgow City Centre as below:

	City Centre Outreach Team HIV rapid tests (results in 20 minutes) and Dry Blood Spot Tests (DBST) from <b>Abbey</b> chemist, Trongate, Monday to Friday 10.00 to 15.30
	Outreach Sexual Health Nurses HIV rapid tests (results in 1-5 minutes) and Dry Blood Spot Tests (DBST) or blood test available. The team regularly attend homeless services - 07422075598

	All requests for authorisation <b>MUST</b> be sent from the clinical mailbox
	Do not use company or personal e-mail mailboxes
	Specials authorisation forms <b>MUST NOT</b> be sent as an image
	Since the introduction of the new Specials authorisation process, there have been numerous cases where patient identifiable data has been sent from an unsecure e-mail address and/or the e-mail has included an image of the form that has been taken on a personal mobile device.
	In order to comply with GDPR regulations, download and complete the online form and save as an attachment and submit using your pharmacy clinical mailbox (@nhs.net).

UPDATE	Move away from fax communication – Tuesday 29.0920
