ACTION	Medicine Supplies during COVID – Thursday 01.10.2020
	As we experience an increasing number in positive cases of COVID virus and unfortunately admissions to intensive care in our acute services we are asking our pharmacy colleagues to help and manage patient expectations of medicine supply in our communities.
	There is obviously a concern around patients getting their normal medications but this should not be alleviated by ordering early or ordering larger quantities of their medicines.
	We witnessed what this did back in March and April when the network was stretched to capacity with medicine requests so please work with your patients to ensure that medicines are ordered in the normal manner.
	We will ensure that these same messages are conveyed to our colleagues in primary care so that we are fully supportive of each other in maintaining a robust and manageable workload in line with normal expectations.

#### Flu Vaccination Service -

Thank you for everyone's continued interest in getting this year's Flu Vaccination Service up and running. We have experienced a lot of change in the programme over the last few weeks as discussions go on at the Executive and Scottish Government level.

We provide the following to clarify communications previously sent and also to provide additional information relating to the operational aspects of this year's programme:

- Extended cohorts It has been agreed that <u>Unpaid Carers and Household</u> <u>Members of Shielding Patients will be included in CP's targeted cohorts.</u> Please remain vigilant within your own areas, ensuring this service is promoted to your regular patients whom you know fit into these additional cohorts.
- Vaccinating Pharmacy Staff- The vaccination of community pharmacy staff has been removed from the SLA after review by the CMO for Scotland. This is in line with other independent contractor groups i.e. GP staff, General Dental and Community Optometrists. The SLA has been updated to reflect this change.
- Further ordering- You should by now have ordered your initial allocation of 50 vaccines through Movianto's on-line ordering system. If you have not yet received an e-mail from Movianto providing instructions on how to access their Marketplace system, please make contact <a href="mailto:cpdt@ggc.scot.nhs.uk">cpdt@ggc.scot.nhs.uk</a> as a matter of urgency.
- If you need to order more than your initial ordering limit of 50 vaccines, you must first contact CPDT to review this via email. Orders exceeding your limit, placed before contacting CPDT, will be rejected. More information is available <u>here</u>.
- **NEO -** The updated NEO module for this year's vaccination programme is not yet live. This should be live in the next week. An updated User Guide is attached and will also be available from the Community Pharmacy website (link below).
- Once the system is live, I would ask CP teams to ensure the NEO system is updated **as soon as possible** after vaccinating a patient, but no later than the end of each working day.
- **Patient Consent Form (Appendix D)** in response to early feedback from Participants, Appendix D has been amended to include patient details. This is available as a separate document on the web page and a copy is attached.
- Sharps Bins Tradebe are delivering sharps bins to participating pharmacies this week. If you have not received your bin by Monday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2020 please contact <u>cpdt@ggc.scot.nhs.uk</u> to let us know.
- **Posters** an A4 promotional poster is currently being developed. An electronic version will be sent to participants next Tuesday (6<sup>th</sup> October) and a physical copy will be delivered to participating pharmacies within the next ten days.
- **Communications to Social Care Staff** the Board has sent communication to Care Home and Care at Home Managers providing details of participating pharmacies along with instructions on how staff can access vaccinations. A copy of this communication can be found on our website (link below).
- Schematic A helpful schematic showing where all cohorts can access their flu vaccinations is attached. You might wish to display this so that your patients are aware of how and where they can access their vaccination.
- **NHS** Inform The NHS Inform website provides comprehensive information on this year's programme <u>www.nhsinform.scot/flu</u>. This is the first port of call for patients accessing information.
- **FAQ Document** this has been updated to reflect recent changes. Please familiarise yourself with the updated version sited on the webpage.
- Finally, all information relating to your participation in this year's Flu Vaccination Service will be housed on the <u>Community Pharmacy website</u>.

REMINDER	Move away from fax communication – Tuesday 29.0920
	Following on from our previous communication several months ago, you will have noticed that the CPD Team have started to remove the fax number from our claim forms/participation forms. This is in line with our move to decommission fax communications by the end of this financial year.
	As the number of e-mails into the Team's generic mailbox increases over the next couple of months, we would ask that the inclusion of a contractor code be a minimum requirement when sending messages to the Team. While the subject line of your message should clearly let us know what your message is about, it should at the very least contain a contractor code so that we can clearly identify messages and ensure they are actioned appropriately.

INFORMATION	Monthly Specials analysis and overpayment recovery – Monday 05.10.2020
	The Prescribing Team have now completed April – June's analysis of the Specials dispensing and payment. Analysis and recovery has only been made on the price paid (using the guide price list circulated in March 2020).
	Out of the 614 items to be queried, 411 items were for melatonin products. The vast majority of these were not endorsed and therefore PSD apply business rules for payment.
	It is the contractor's responsibility to ensure that all prescriptions are correctly, accurately endorsed before submitting for payment. In these cases above, this did not happen and results in a lot of work for PSD to pay you (albeit incorrectly), for the Board to analyse and PSD to recover the overpayments that were made.
	Please ensure that all prescriptions for unlicensed medicines are correctly endorsed with products supplied, quantity and costs to ensure a more accurate payment to you. This is even more necessary given that we have moved towards using the guide prices more formally now.

URGENT ACTION	Provision of Pharmaceutical Services during Festive Season 2020/2021
	It's that time of year again!!!
	Below you will find the link to a Webropol survey (right at the bottom of this piece). Please complete this to confirm which days you plan to provide pharmaceutical services over the key festive holiday dates (the confirmed dates for NHS GG&C public holidays are detailed on the front sheet of the survey, or can be found here: <u>https://www.communitypharmacy.scot.nhs.uk/nhs-boards/nhs-greater-glasgow- clyde/public-holidays/</u> ).
	In keeping with previous years we might need to rota pharmacies to open (depending on the response we receive). As a first step, we look for volunteers willing to open at Board request on key dates. As per previous years, the focus of provision of pharmaceutical services will be around the Out of Hours centres across the Board's area.
	On Christmas and New Years days, a minimum 3 hour service will be required between midday and 3.00pm from at least one pharmacy within each designated area. On the Mondays (28 <sup>th</sup> Dec and 4 <sup>th</sup> Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.
	Contractors who open and provide normal services during Christmas and New Year days and the public holidays, will receive payment only if pharmacy cover is considered necessary and this has been confirmed by the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPD Team). Once responses have been consolidated and these are matched against the potential level of services required in each area, we will be able to identify which pharmacies will be eligible for reimbursement.
	Contractors who volunteer or are required to open will receive confirmation from the CPD Team by email. All contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed at the agreed rate of <b>£244.75</b> per hour.
	NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision once the service level has been established.
	To meet the Board's winter planning deadline and ensure robust details relating to your pharmacy are featured in any promotional material the Board might produce, <u>it is</u> <u>essential that you complete the Webropol survey</u> no later than Monday 26 <sup>th</sup> October 2020.

	We have been asked whether a provisionally registered pharmacist can operate under a PGD and in particular the flu vaccination PGD. Please note this refers to provisionally registered pharmacists and not pre registration pharmacists We sought guidance from the GPhC and the following has been received :-
	"provisionally-registered pharmacists will be able to provide the same services as a fully registered pharmacist, provided that these are within the provisional registrants current scope of competence and they are suitably trained to carry them out."
	Therefore with this in mind, as long as the individual has completed the relevant full training (including anaphylaxis training) and feels confident to deliver the service within their own competence, then we see no reason as to why they should not be allowed to work within our PGD for Flu Vaccination.
	Please ensure that this message is cascaded to those relevant individuals that this applies to and they are directed to our PGD for signing when they have completed all training requirements.

	Could you please ensure that stock is ordered upon receiving emailed copies of prescriptions sent to your clinical mailbox. Although you would not yet be in the possession of the physical prescription, we would ask you to do this to ensure adequate time is given for stock to reach pharmacies. Ordering stock in anticipation of receiving the physical prescription facilitates a smoother patient journey, guaranteeing there will be no interruption in the patient's treatment.

	Thank you for everyone's continued support in implementing this year's Flu Vaccination Service. There has been further change in the programme over the last few weeks as discussions continue at the Executive and Scottish Government level.
	We provide the following to clarify communications previously sent and also to provide additional information relating to the operational aspects of this year's programme:
	• <b>SLA changes-</b> we would like to bring your attention to the removal of the requirement from pharmacies to deliver this year's service exclusively within a registered pharmacy premises. Going forward the service may be delivered by appropriately trained pharmacists in a suitable location outwith a pharmacy (e.g. Care Home premises, Non-pharmacy business), provided this location meets the requirements outlined in the SLA.
	• Vaccine choice- to clarify, the only vaccine which should be given to patients under this service is Flucelvax Tetra, a cell-based Quadravalent Inactivated Vaccine (QIVc). This is as our eligible cohorts require a quadravalent vaccine as recommended by the NHS Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI).
	• <b>PPE requirements-</b> The guidance on use of PPE during vaccination has been updated. The guidance states that in some clinical settings, such as vaccination/injection clinics, where contact with individuals is minimal, the need for <u>single use</u> PPE items for each encounter, for example, gloves and aprons is <u>not necessary</u> .
SLA 2020-21 v8.docx	Staff administering vaccinations/injections must apply hand hygiene between patients and wear a sessional Type IIR mask.
FAQ 20-21.docx	PPE supplies can be replenished using the normal process of calling 0300 303 5550 between 08:00 and 20:00 Monday to Friday.
	• <b>HSCW Eligibility-</b> to highlight that HSCWs working in GGC but who live outside GGC are eligible for vaccination under the service.
	<ul> <li>NEO- could pharmacy teams please ensure that <u>only HSCWs are marked as</u> <u>members of staff</u> when inputting vaccination details on NEO. Members of the public (unpaid carers/household members of shielding patients) <u>should not</u> be marked as members of staff.</li> </ul>
	This has important ramifications for monitoring and reporting to the Scottish Government.
	<ul> <li>Supply issues- please note that due to unprecedented demand for Flu vaccines, Community Pharmacies are <u>unable to order greater than 50 vaccines until</u> <u>advised otherwise by CPDT.</u> Further supply is expected to become available in early November; more information will be communicated to you around this closer to the time.</li> </ul>
	• Letters sent in error- Please be aware that the Scottish Government has informed us that a number of Boards have reported that the 'under 65 at risk' cohort letter has been issued to some members of the public who are under 65 with no health condition.
	If local teams or call handlers are approached by someone who has mistakenly received this letter, then please advise as such; apologising that the letter was issued in error and that they are <u>not eligible</u> for a flu vaccine under the National Programme.

The only difference to the one previously circulated is in the 'Maximum or minimum treatment period' section. There is now the option for treatment to be continued for up to 24 weeks if the pharmacist considers this to be necessary. (N.B Most often 12 weeks treatment is sufficient.) ACTION	NEO Alcohol Module (Disulfiram Supervision) Live from 1st November 2020 – Tuesday 27.10.2020
	For those pharmacies registered to provide the supervised disulfiram service.
NEO Alcohol module user guide.pdf	On 1 <sup>st</sup> July 2020, the Pharmacy Contractors Committee agreed to a £15 single monthly payment for disulfiram patients. A patient needs to attend once or more for disulfiram supervision in a calendar month or have instalment dispensing specified on their prescription without supervision. Communicating any concerns, for example a missed dose, promptly (within 24 hours) remains the most important part of the service. The NEO module to support with this will go live on 1 <sup>st</sup> November 2020, a user manual is attached.
	From 1 <sup>st</sup> November, the new NEO alcohol module should be used for:
	- Recording/reporting a missed dose of disulfiram (within 24 hours), the system will send an automated email to the team for you. No further doses should be supplied/supervised until the team has advised to do so.
	- Monthly paper free disulfiram claims (first claim in December for service provided in November).
	You will need your Manager Login to give staff access (GPhC registered staff only) to the module, if you do not know this, contact <u>Adrs.PharmacyTeam@ggc.scot.nhs.uk</u> .
	Please note the NEO user manual and module mention breathalysing/breathalyser readings as this is our standard service, <b>as previously communicated due to COVID-19 infection risk</b> <u>breathalysing should not be part of the assessment until further</u> <u>notice</u> .
	Can I also take this opportunity to urge you to check your supervised disulfiram claims are up to date. As per NHS policy you have 6 months to submit a claim. When claiming for November 2020 onwards, paper claims will not be accepted.

On the Mondays (28 <sup>th</sup> Dec and 4 <sup>th</sup> Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.
	Contractors who open and provide normal services during Christmas and New Year days and the public holidays, will receive payment only if pharmacy cover is considered necessary and this has been confirmed by the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPD Team). Once responses have been consolidated and these are matched against the potential level of services required in each area, we will be able to identify which pharmacies will be eligible for reimbursement.
	Contractors who volunteer or are required to open will receive confirmation from the CPD Team by email. All contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed at the agreed rate of <b>£244.75</b> per hour.
	NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision once the service level has been established.

INFORMATION	CMO Letter to Shielding Patients – Wednesday 28.10.20
	Patients who were previously in the COVID shielding group or identified at high risk of COVID have been issued a letter from the Chief Medical Officer providing guidance for patients depending on which "protection level" their area of residence falls in to. The protection levels come into force on 2nd November and more information can be found <u>here</u> .
	The letter also gives advice on taking Vitamin D supplements and provides these patients an opportunity to access a free supply by contacting a text messaging service or free phone number, the supply will be posted to the patient. The letter does also mention that these supplements can be bought from a Community Pharmacy and so may result in more enquiries than usual regarding this. <u>To be clear the free supply can</u> <u>only be accessed via the text or free phone number</u> , if the patient wishes to obtain a supply in any other way, they will be expected to purchase these from a pharmacy, retail supplier or online and GPs will not be expected to provide a prescription.

UPDATE	Melatonin Products – Thursday 29.10.20
	We have been made aware that there are some licensed melatonin products coming to the UK market shortly. We are in discussions with colleagues across paeds, mental health and acute services about how these will fit in with the shared care agreement between acute and primary care, especially in relation to the large numbers of patients who are currently using unlicensed melatonin capsules.
	We are still gathering information about these new products, and any off license use (ie crush tablets or open capsules). Once we have all the detail, we will share this with the community pharmacy network.
	In the meantime, you may find that the prices of ULM melatonin start to increase or availability becomes restricted or hard to get. We will work as fast as we can to minimise disruption for patients and CP teams but please be aware of this over the coming weeks.
