DECOMMISSIONING OF GENERIC MAILBOX

	We are receiving a number of complaints from patients who have tried to access an NHS flu vaccination from a community pharmacy and been advised that this service or vaccines are not available.
	Can I urgently remind you that from the 4 th January 2021 the network of participating flu vaccination pharmacies has become the port of call for all patients who are eligible to receive a vaccine and who have failed so far to access one in the normal manner.
	This means that the following cohorts of patients can access a vaccine from a community pharmacy:- 1. Health and Social care workers 2. Care home staff 3. Unpaid carers 4. Householders of patients who have been shielding
	Additional cohorts 5. Over 60's (over 65's has now been dropped to 60) 6. Under 60 and in an at risk category)
	For vaccination purposes the QIVc vaccine should be used for all cohorts first and if your allocation has been exhausted then the QIVe can be used as second choice.
	This has been agreed with Public Health and the CP GGC contractors committee and was communicated to all pharmacies pre Christmas.
	Please ensure that all staff are urgently communicated this message and aware of this important change.

An updated SLA will be published to the Community Pharmacy website by the end of

this week and an updated poster will be sent out to community pharmacies in due course.





You will be aware that the cohorts of patients who are eligible to receive a flu vaccination from community pharmacy as part of this year's programme, was further extended from 5th January 2021.

An amended SLA is attached, along with a FAQ document which has been updated to include information on the revised process for ordering vaccinations, COVID 19 vaccinations and other issues that have been raised recently.

An amended poster is currently with our Medical Illustration department and will be issued in due course.

The Patient Consent form has been changed to reflect the need to ask the patient if they have had/will be having a COVID 19 vaccination within 7 days of any potential flu vaccination. A copy of the updated form can be found as a separate document on the webpage.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Guidance for OST Supervised Prescriptions – Wednesday 13.01.21

A number of concerns have been raised over recent instances when prescribed supervision of OST has been suspended by pharmacy staff without consultation with the prescriber. Any decisions on supervision have been taken after the prescriber has conducted a full risk assessment of the patient's capability to manage more take home medication and considers all known health and social care aspects. Within NHSGGC, this exercise has been completed for all OST patents on two occasions in the past 9 months representing a significant effort to safeguard the wellbeing of this vulnerable patient group.

With the current new COVID restrictions please be reassured that prescribers are ensuring that any supervision requests are reduced to essential requests to minimise patient public exposure and to minimise any potential impact on the community pharmacy network.

Consequently any decision to amend the prescriber's instructions, without an individual patient risk assessment, could potentially put patients and other household members, including children at risk. Pharmacy teams are unlikely to have all the necessary background information available to make fully informed individual patient risk assessments without consultation with the prescribing services.

Where you believe there is an identified need to alter prescribed supervision instructions, the prescriber must be contacted for each patient to discuss whether supervision can safely be reduced or not. A record of the discussion detailing outcome, time, date, name, etc. should be retained in the pharmacy as good practice.

Please note that the Misuse of Drugs Regulations do not allow any amendments to be made to the frequency of prescribed instalments.


UPDATE	Continued Vigilance After Vaccination – Wednesday 13.01.21
	As you should all be aware community pharmacy colleagues are able to access COVID vaccination appointments from various venues across Greater Glasgow and Clyde Health Board. We are hearing of many colleagues already vaccinated and also of just as many if not more with appointments booked in over the next few weeks.
	This is great news for the community pharmacy network however we have to make sure that having had a vaccine we do not let our guard down against what is turning out to be an extremely virulent strain of virus.
	With this in mind I thought it was pertinent to remind everyone that even after you have had a vaccine the following should be followed:-
	F – CONTINUE TO WEAR A FACE COVERING WHEN WORKING WITHIN THE PHARMACY A – AVOID CROWDS IN AND OUT OF WORK C – CLEAN HANDS AND SURFACES REGULARY T – STAY 2M APART WHEREVER YOU POSSIBLY CAN

S – SELF ISOLATE AND BOOK AT TEST IF YOU START TO SHOW SYMPTOMS EVEN IF YOU HAVE HAD THE VACCINE.

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ACTION	Temporary reduction to model hours – Tuesday 19.01.2021
	We have been receiving information from various avenues regarding the recent uplift in prescription numbers and also the pressures associated with the reduction in workforce, numbers due to positive COVID-19 cases, or colleagues having to self-isolate as a resul of being a contact through test and protect. We are also conscious of the new virulent strain of the virus and how quickly and easier it is to spread.
	With this in mind we will formally reinstate the amendment to the Model Hours of Service that was previously introduced during March, April and May last year when the first wave of the pandemic took hold. Accordingly, the minimum opening hours required from Monday 25th January 2021 will be:
	Monday - Saturday: 10.00am - 5.00pm; 2 x days in the week: 10.00am - 1.00pm; and Lunch: 1 hour in the middle of the day
	We will review this in four weeks' time and advise accordingly if this reduction in model hours is to continue.
	If you decide to move to these new model hours there is no need to inform the Community Pharmacy Development Team. However, we would ask any extended hours pharmacy with hours beyond 7pm (on any day in the week) that in the unlikely event you find it necessary to amend your hours at all, you must inform us to allow this information to be passed onto the Out Of Hours services. You should use the form at the undernoted link to submit your amended information.

Public Health Alert 2021/03 COVID-19 (SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus) – Variant of Concern (VOC202101/01) – Brazil and other linked countries – Monday 18.01.2021 A new COVID-19 variant of concern (VOC202101/01) has been identified in Brazil with evidence of rapid spread there. A precautionary approach has been taken in the UK by the 4 Nations in terms of travel regulations, with implementation of public health actions as outlined below for travellers returning from Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, French Guiana, Guyana, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, Uruguay and Venezuela

and other countries and territories with strong travel links to South America; namely Portugal, including Azores and Madeira, Panama, Cabo Verde (Cape Verde) and the British Overseas Territory of the Falkland Islands.

Please note the recommendations in the attached, including that:

- Any individual with a travel history from the above-noted countries and territories in the preceding 10 days to arrival in the UK OR individuals who have had contact with an individual with such a travel history in the previous 10 days, who requires emergency assessment or admission to hospital should be managed in strict isolation in a single room with en-suite facilities.
- As well as informing the local Infection Prevention and Control Team, hospital colleagues should contact their local Health Protection Team with the details of admitted individuals who test positive and who have returned from the above-noted countries or territories OR been in contact with someone who has returned, for further public health advice. Further risk assessment and discussion with the local/regional specialist infectious diseases centre is advised to inform further clinical management.

Please find attached an updated document which contains the **Early Warning Systems** for each of the Board's HSCP's.

Please identify your pharmacy within the attached document and print off the relevant cascade.

I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.

As a reminder, this cascade system can be started by either a Board officer or any community pharmacist. Any one initiating the system should telephone the master station clearly relaying the message that is required for circulation. The master station will start the chain of calls by telephoning the next pharmacy on the list, who will in turn, telephone the next pharmacy and so forth until the last pharmacy calls the Master Station. When the Master Station receives a call from the last pharmacy in the cascade, it should contact the person who initiated the cascade thus completing the cycle. It is essential that pharmacies follow this cascade in the specified order to ensure that all pharmacies receive the message and that the communication is successfully exchanged throughout each HSCP System. Closed pharmacies should be by-passed however; it would be helpful to telephone them with the message once they reopen. In these instances, please advise that you have already passed on the message to the pharmacy they were expected to contact, which will stop unnecessary calls.



UPDATE	Licensed Melatonin Products – Wednesday 20.01.21
	In addition to the melatonin 3mg tablets which were licensed at the end of 2020, there are now newly licensed melatonin capsules in 2mg, 3mg and 5mg strengths. Unlicensed melatonin capsules will no longer be available in these strengths and patients will require to be changed to a licensed product.
	NHSGGC has made the decision that melatonin 3mg tablets will be the preferred melatonin product in children, rather than capsules from now on. The manufacturer of the tablets has advised that they can be crushed and mixed with water for patients unable to swallow a solid dose formulation. This is an off-label use.
	Prescribing support teams are being asked to support the above switch and messages have been deployed to Script Switch for prescribers to use the tablets where appropriate.

ACTION Wearing of PPE After Receiving COVID Vaccination – Tuesday 26.01.21 This will be the last week available for frontline workers to receive their Covid Vaccination from one of our vaccination centres. Many of the community Pharmacy teams have taken this opportunity through the month of January to ensure that they receive their first dose of vaccine as we ensure that we protect ourselves from this virulent strain of virus. However I am concerned that I am hearing of situations where community pharmacy teams are choosing not to wear PPE after they have received their vaccine believing that they are totally protected and cannot therefore spread the virus after that initial dose. I must reiterate the message I gave earlier in the month where it was advised that the Scottish Government guidance on the prevention of virus transmission must still be maintained even after the vaccine has been administered. So that means that we should continue to wear face masks, maintain social distancing wherever possible and ensure that hand hygiene is paramount. Please ensure that all staff are briefed on this important public health message and we continue to protect patients and ourselves going forward.

Managing Violent and Aggressive Behaviour in the Workplace

It is concerning to learn of an increasing number of reports of staff in community pharmacies being exposed to violent and aggressive behaviour from those venting their anger and frustration at the current restrictions on personal liberty. Whilst these remain in place the ready accessibility of community pharmacies makes staff particularly vulnerable to these unwarranted and unwelcome outbursts. Such behaviour is unacceptable and particularly disheartening when directed at staff striving to maintain access to a vital service despite operating under significant additional pressures and personal risk. The behaviour is defined as 'Any incident in which a person working in the healthcare sector is verbally abused, threatened or assaulted by a patient or member of the public in circumstances relating to his or her employment' and could encroach into other aspects covered by legislation e.g. disability, gender, race, age, sexual orientation, religion etc.. It can be a traumatic experience with long lasting implications particularly when these behaviours go unchallenged. The perpetrator may then assume the false premise that there is no deterrent and in time this characteristic may be adopted as established practice and escalate in frequency and intensity.

Tackling the issue at the outset is fundamental to managing the problem but is easier said than done. The NHS policy of zero tolerance on aggressive and violent behaviour remains extant and is embodied in the attached poster which you are recommended to display in a prominent area in your pharmacy. Before doing so you may wish to complete the short training module available from Health Scotland at http://www.healthscotland.scot/learning-resources/violence-and-aggression-in-the-workplace on the subject covering the following key aspects -

- understanding of the causes and impact of violence and aggression at work
- knowledge of the legal requirements to manage violence and aggression at work
- understanding the use of risk assessment in controlling violence and aggression hazards
- understanding of the types of violence and aggression hazards in the workplace
- knowledge of techniques to manage these risks at work
- knowledge of the support available to help and advise on this issue.

The content gives an awareness of how the behaviour may develop and equip you with some basic skills in managing the situation. Access is free and you will need to enrol on their e-Learning platform beforehand and then register and login to start the module. Guidance on the procedure to follow in recording incidents is also attached and further reinforces the importance of handling such episodes appropriately when they occur. Further details are available on the Health Scotland web site and from his office when required.



Communication Between GP Practice and Community Pharmacy – Thursday INFORMATION 28.01.21 Over the last couple of months Graeme Marshall, Clinical Director for Glasgow North East, has been working with Derek Jamieson, Community Pharmacy Champion for North w East and Anne Thompson, previously Clinical Pharmacist Lead for North East, to agree Pharmacy to GP-GP a protocol for GP practices and Community Pharmacies to work and communicate to Pharmacy SOP.dc collaboratively together. This has arisen as a result of issues identified with the transfer Attached of prescriptions and messages from one to another and the expectations of each service in relation to what a patient can expect from their pharmacy after being prescribed at the GP practice. The SOP that has been developed is attached and as such I would ask all GP practices and Community Pharmacists to brief their teams on this new way of working between the two services. This can only work if each practice and pharmacy ensures that they check their clinical email box a minimum of twice a day to pick up messages and prescription requests quickly and in a timely manner. 	 Payment Verification (Pharmacy) will reclaim the appropriate monies for paid items that have an 'NC/ND' (or scored out) endorsement evident.
