| | Following my email last week, the Central Prescribing Team have been able to obtain some more information about stock availability and I promised to share with you all: |
| | Fusidic acid 250mg/5ml suspension – there is no stock disruption and continues to be manufactured by Leo. However, this is only supplied by Alliance wholesalers so other wholesalers may use the standard (and misleading) message that the product is either 'discontinued' or 'manufacturing issue with no date of recovery'. |
| | Anyone who receives a prescription for Fusidic acid can obtain via Alliance as part of the solus supplier arrangements. |
| | <u>Trimethoprim 50mg/5ml suspension</u> – stock remains erratic from the wholesalers. We will continue to monitor and update. |
| | Community pharmacy teams are encouraged to follow the process for shortages on the Community Pharmacy Scotland website via the following links – |

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

DEVELOPMENT TEAM - ALL COMMUNICATIONS SHOULD BE SENT TO ggc.cpdevteam@nhs.scot **ACTION** COMMENCEMENT OF COPD SERVICE FROM 7TH JUNE 2021 You will remember that NHS GGC in collaboration with CPGGC planned to launch a COPD service towards the end of 2020, after a successful pilot completed in **COPD** Participation Renfrewshire. This was unfortunately delayed as a result of the Covid Pandemic, and Spreadsheet.xlsx interim arrangements put in place where suitable patients could be issued with a rescue prescription which could be drawn upon should a COPD patient require medication urgently or to replace just in case medication. This initial supply could then be used for **COPD Participation** an unscheduled care supply from community pharmacies to be made for future events Form.docx should the patient have further exacerbations. Attached After careful review of current cases of Covid and the extent of hospital admissions of COPD patients, the Respiratory MCN have agreed that we should now progress with the original service. The service will commence from Monday 7th June 2021 and will replace the interim service which has been running for the last few months. You will find all information you need (including V2 of the SLA) to engage with the service here: https://www.communitypharmacy.scot.nhs.uk/nhs-boards/nhs-greater-glasgowclyde/pharmacy-services/chronic-obstructive-pulmonary-disease-copd-exacerbation/ The current participant list is attached. You should check this list and make sure your details are included. If your name isn't included in the participant list and you wish to engage with this service, you will need to complete a Participation Form and submit this to the CPDT (this does not apply to multiple chains who sign up centrally). Notification of the commencement of service will be sent to colleagues within primary care and acute settings week beginning 24th May 2021. Patient record cards will be delivered to GP practices and Respiratory Teams the same week. COMMENCEMENT OF COPD SERVICE FROM 7TH JUNE 2021 You will remember that NHS GGC in collaboration with CPGGC planned to launch a COPD service towards the end of 2020, after a successful pilot completed in Renfrewshire. This was unfortunately delayed as a result of the Covid Pandemic, and interim arrangements put in place where suitable patients could be issued with a rescue prescription which could be drawn upon should a COPD patient require medication urgently or to replace just in case medication. This initial supply could then be used for an unscheduled care supply from community pharmacies to be made for future events should the patient have further exacerbations.

After careful review of current cases of Covid and the extent of hospital admissions of COPD patients, the Respiratory MCN have agreed that we should now progress with the original service.

Several months ago, we asked the community pharmacy network to give us their views on the first 8 months of the Communications Update.

We received 50 responses (thank you so much to those who took the time to complete the survey and provide valuable feedback). The majority of the responses were positive and confirmed that the "new" process was working well.

There were constructive critical comments as well and we thought it would be useful to provide you with information on how we intend to respond to the suggestions made

<u>FRQUENCY/FORMAT</u> – responses were evenly split between "twice a week is sufficient" and "once a week would be better" – More than 50% of respondents felt the continued inclusion of "Reminders" and/or "Updates" cluttered the Update and could potentially lead to important new information being missed.

Response: From 1st June 2021, the Tuesday update will contain "new" information only. Reminders, Updates and the list of previous articles will be restricted to the Thursday edition.

We will include a "headline" list at the top of each Update for easy reference.

We have agreed with CP GGC that the Thursday edition may also include new information, where the information cannot be held over until the following week.

<u>INDEX</u> – Only 35% respondents were aware of the Communications Update Index, or that back copies of the Update are stored on the CPDT website. Of those who were aware of the Index, the majority had used the resource, and had found it useful.
