ACTION	INSTALMENT DISPENSING
ACTION	
	We believe there may be some confusion around supply of controlled drugs in dosette boxes. It appears that some pharmacies are supplying weekly dosette boxes, four at a time, against prescriptions for one months' supply where the prescriber has specified weekly dispensing.
	The Misuse of Drugs Act and Regulations legislation is quite clear in that you are not able to make a supply of a Schedule 2 or Schedule 3 controlled drug, prescribed in instalments, in advance of the supply date except in circumstances where the pharmacy is closed and where the Home Office wording is included on the prescription. Where a prescription for these drugs states supply weekly, it must only be supplied weekly.
	For example, where the first supply is made on the 1 st day on the month, then the next supply should be made 7 days later on the 8 th day of the month. All four boxes should not be issued at once if the prescription specifies weekly dispensing.
	Requests from patients, family, carers or others cannot take precedence over the prescriber's instructions. Where a prescriber requests the supply to be made in advance, then they must furnish a legally compliant prescription before any supplies are made.
	This legislation applies to many commonly prescribed medicines in addition to Schedule 2CDs including Tramadol, Temazepam, Gabapentin and Pregabalin
	We reminded you recently that pharmacists, are unable to amend the frequency of the supply stipulated by the actual prescriber.
	Many medicines, including those not governed by controlled drug legislation, are potentially harmful when not used appropriately, and there are risks inherent in making supplies that are contrary to the prescribers instructions.

COMMENCEMENT OF COPD SERVICE FROM 7TH JUNE 2021

You will remember that NHS GGC in collaboration with CPGGC planned to launch a COPD service towards the end of 2020, after a successful pilot completed in Renfrewshire. This was unfortunately delayed as a result of the Covid Pandemic, and interim arrangements put in place where suitable patients could be issued with a rescue prescription which could be drawn upon should a COPD patient require medication urgently or to replace just in case medication. This initial supply could then be used for an unscheduled care supply from community pharmacies to be made for future events should the patient have further exacerbations.

After careful review of current cases of Covid and the extent of hospital admissions of COPD patients, the Respiratory MCN have agreed that we should now progress with the original service.

The service will commence from Monday 7th June 2021 and will replace the interim service which has been running for the last few months.

The current participant list is attached. You should check this list and make sure your details are included. If your name isn't included in the participant list and you wish to engage with this service, you will need to complete a Participation Form and submit this to the CPDT (this does not apply to multiple chains who sign up centrally).

Notification of the commencement of service will be sent to colleagues within primary care and acute settings week beginning **24**th **May 2021**. Patient record cards will be delivered to GP practices and Respiratory Teams the same week.

We would ask that you refresh your understanding of the service requirements in time for the service commencing.

This will be a roll out service and will develop as patients are reviewed under their current COPD care plan rather than a huge uplift and surge in all COPD patients being signed up under the service guidance.

I look forward to your engagement and ongoing support in the development of patient care for those COPD patients who will utilise the service going forward.


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Patient Return of Sharps Bins.

ACTION	Patient Return of Sharps Bins
Sharps Bins - Updated Letter to GPs.	The Board's Waste Manager recently issued a letter to GP practices, which mistakenly advised that pharmacies would routinely accept patient returns of sharps bins (regardless of where the bins were generated).
Spaced Ester to Gran	This as you will be aware, is not correct. The only community pharmacies who routinely take back sharps are the IEP pharmacies, and this arrangement is solely for harm reduction patients.
	We have highlighted the error, and an updated message has been sent out to GP practices (copy attached for information). This should result in GP practices being more willing to take bins back from patients.
	It is entirely possible that the initial message has made its way through to a small number of patients which might result in some attempts to return sharps bins to community pharmacies. If this happens, please provide the patient with the correct information.

Action	Vaccination Programme – 2021/2022
Vaccination	As you might be aware, the Board is currently planning its vaccination programme for 2021/2022.
Programme - 2021-2 Attached	At this point, no firm decisions have been taken around the level or focus of community pharmacy involvement in the programme. We do however need to undertake some preparatory work to inform the planning process at this stage.
	Attached is a pro-forma which we would ask that you complete and return to the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPD) by Wednesday 23rd June 2021. Within the pro-froma you should indicate whether you would be interested in participating in the flu element of the vaccination programme, a dual flu/COVID element of the programme, or whether you do not wish to participate in any part of the vaccination programme.
	An indication of participation at this point is not a commitment to take part, but rather an indication that will allow the CPD Team to work with CP GGC to effectively plan and organise any potentially agreed service.

Action	CONTINUED EFFORTS TO REPRESS VIRUS
	We are beginning to receive intelligence from across the country that the Delta strain of the Covid virus is starting to cause problems with pharmacy colleagues testing positive and having to self-isolate as a result.
	This strain has been identified as being more virulent, is spreading much faster that other strains and yet again is putting a strain on the pharmacy workforce.
	With this in mind we thought it pertinent to remind everyone again of the steps that should be in place within your pharmacies to help minimise the risk of onward transmission of the virus:
	 PPE supplied from PECOS should continue to be used at all times in line with guidance – we would advise against the wearing of cloth face masks; Staff and patients should socially distance wherever possible; Use of hand gels and more importantly regular handwashing regimes should be in place; All work benches and counters should be regularly cleaned with suitable
	products; 5. Ensure that breaks are split and wherever possible colleagues are not sharing close spaces when having rest breaks; and
	Please, Please do not let your guard down and remember that the above still apply EVEN THOUGH you may have had one or both vaccines.

Action	Varenicline (Champix) Availability
	We've been informed that unfortunately Pfizer are currently facing an issue with the supply of varenicline (Champix) across all doses and presentations.
	Pfizer anticipate this supply disruption will last for at least several weeks.
	The current recommendation is that until the Champix shortage is resolved, patients will need to consult with their healthcare professional to choose an alternative treatment option. For those who have already started a course of Champix, there isn't a lot of evidence on switching from Champix to an alternative stop smoking medication like combination NRT, but that would seem a reasonable option.
	Any new clients starting a quit attempt should be advised to use an alternative stop smoking product rather than begin a course of Champix at this time, given the uncertainty around supply.





	If the patient is able to measure themselves then please remember that measurements should be taken as early as possible in the day ideally when the patient is getting out of bed. If this is impractical and the measurements are to be taken within the pharmacy then as early in the morning as possible would be recommended. This is to ensure that there is minimum swelling on the legs/ankles/feet and the measurements give a true reflection of the actual size of the area being measured.

	Wearing personal protective equipment (PPE) in warm/hot environments increases the risk of heat stress. This occurs when the body is unable to cool itself enough to maintain a healthy temperature. Heat stress can cause heat exhaustion and lead to heat stroke if the person is unable to cool down.
	Measures to control the temperature of clinical environments and enable staff to make behavioural adaptations to stay cool and well hydrated should be made. Staff may require more frequent breaks and the frequency of PPE changes may increase, with a resulting increase in demand.

NHS 24 would like to take this opportunity to thank contractors for their continued support in providing unscheduled care and to highlight the following points on the PGD and its use:

- Please complete the individual signing sheet and tick each board you work in. If you work in more than 3 board areas then an additional form needs to be used.
- It is also important to name the main pharmacy you work in for each board area and return to each health board you wish to use the PGD in. Contractors must ensure that at least <u>one pharmacist names their premises or payment cannot be</u> issued if a supply is made via the PGD.
- Pharmacists have until **Friday 30**th **July 2021** to sign version 28, after which payment for supply may be stopped if there are no pharmacists signed up to use the PGD in that pharmacy.
- Individual pharmacists are reminded that they must sign the most recent version of the PGD, which is now only issued once every year.
- If you do not complete and sign an individual authorisation form for each new version of the PGD, and continue to use the CPUS/CP4 forms, you will be acting illegally.

Please ensure that all locums have signed and faxed the authorisation form as soon as possible and that they are aware of the direct referral process in your board area, particularly if working at the weekends, rota days and over the Bank holiday period. Please also ensure all pharmacy staff are aware of the direct referral process and the PGD, as they are often the first point of contact for many patients.

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
