Clenil Modulite inhalers contain the same medication as before, beclometasone, and therefore require no change to either the way prescriptions are written, or the way patients manage their asthma.
The medicine is provided in the same inhaler device (pressurised metered dose inhaler; pMDI). The only difference in the new additional batches is the lack of dose indicator on any strength of Clenil (50/100/200/250mcg)

Action	Rise in Covid Positive Cases
	As the number of positive cases of Covid continues to be extremely high, and subsequently those having to self-isolate either due to positive results or because of test and protect increases, pressure appears to be building across all aspects of Pharmacy services within NHS GGC. Pharmacy colleagues in Community, Primary and Acute have all been affected to similar degrees and therefore it is unrealistic to expect that resource can be moved from one to another to support if needed.
	With this in mind I would like to remind everyone of their responsibilities to ensure that their own individual contingency plans are in place to minimise disruption to patient care within the communities. These plans should include e.g. working collaboratively with buddy pharmacies and having a full contact list for vulnerable patients in the unlikely event that there is a need for the pharmacy to close.

It is imperative that the Board's closure procedure is followed without exception in the event of a pharmacy being unable to open after 15minutes of the normal opening hours and immediately if you require to close during the working day. Notification should be made by phone in the first instance to the CPD Team (an e-mail to the generic mailbox is also acceptable). The following contacts should be made BEFORE making the call:-
 GP practices that your patients attend and that you work with on a daily basis ADRS local teams if you have harm reduction patients Local pharmacies around you NHS24/OOH if you are an extended hours pharmacy (and the closure affects your extended hours provision).
These continue to be trying times for us all and we would again like to thank everyone for their sterling efforts in ensuring that the pharmaceutical care needs of our patients are being met.

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

Contractors must ensure that at least <u>one pharmacist names their premises or payment cannot be issued if a supply is made via the PGD.</u> Pharmacists have until Friday 30th July 2021 to sign version 28, after which payment for supply may be stopped if there are no pharmacists signed up to use the PGD in that pharmacy. Individual pharmacists are reminded that they must sign the most recent version of the PGD, which is now only issued once every year. If you do not complete and sign an individual authorisation form for each new version of the PGD, and continue to use the CPUS/CP4 forms, you will be acting illegely.
	<u>illegally</u> . Please ensure that all locums have signed and returned the authorisation form as soon as possible and that they are aware of the direct referral process in your board area, particularly if working at the weekends, rota days and over the Bank holiday period. Please also ensure all pharmacy staff are aware of the direct referral process and the PGD, as they are often the first point of contact for many patients.

Action	ULM Omeprazole - letter of clinical need for suppliers
	Some suppliers of the unlicensed Omeprazole solutions/ suspensions are starting to ask for a letter to confirm that the ULM is required when there is a licensed product available and I expect others will follow. We have two examples this week where Ethigen are requesting a letter of clinical need as per the MHRA guidance that wholesaler require to confirm a special need before supplying. This is not unusual as we have seen this before for ULM orders after licensed products came to the market.
	Our recently published PPI guidance has quite clear advice regarding when Aclomep (unlicensed solution) can be used and states that Aclomep 20mg/5ml is first line in patients <1.7kg and <6 months of age.
	Ethigen have seen a copy of the NHSGGC PPI Guideline for Neonates and Paediatrics and this has been discussed with the Responsible Person at Ethigen. Therefore it has been agreed that these patients that must use Aclomep (as per guideline above) do not require a letter of clinical need, and the CP can just write in the notes box of the Ethigen order form that the patients is <1.7kg and <6 months of age.
	This only applies to patients within NHSGGC.
	Any other patients will require a one-off letter of clinical need from the prescriber. This must be on headed paper and signed, but the reason can be as simple as patient cannot tolerate the licensed product.

Action	Chloramphenicol 0.5% eye drops - safety alert in children < 2 years
	In April 2021 interim advice was communicated on a potential safety issue with the use of chloramphenicol eye drops 0.5% containing boric acid This advice followed a European Medicines Agency (EMA) recommendation contraindicating used in children <2years old due to an associated risk of infertility.
	There was a lack of clarity regarding this contra-indication and at the time the MHRA advised they were considering the available evidence in collaboration with specialists. The <u>MHRA have now published safety advice</u> concluding that the potential benefits of use outweigh the risks. <u>Chloramphenicol eye drops 0.5% can be used in children under 2</u> years where antibiotic treatment is indicated.
	Assessment:
	Based on experience and available evidence, the MHRA in conjunction with experts from the Royal College of Ophthalmologists (RCOP), the College of Optometrists and the Paediatric Medicines Expert Advisory Group have drawn the following conclusions:
	 EMA 'permitted daily exposure' limits are not relevant to children aged 0-2years The assumption of potential risk to future fertility is hypothetical and not supported by data in human children. Calculated levels of boron are an overestimate based on drop content, volume of the conjunctival sac and standard dosing regimen (1 drop each
	eye 3-4 times per day)
	<i>Note:</i> Theoretically, higher dosing regimens (every 2 hours) will cause exposure greater than 1mg/day, however it is accepted that adherence to such regimens is generally poor (e.g interrupted for sleep) and even where 100% adherence this treatment approach is only used short term (48-72hours).
	Recommendations:
	The Scottish Antimicrobial Prescribing Group (SAPG) and Healthcare Improvement Scotland Area Drug and Therapeutics Collaborative, are in support of the MHRA recommendations.
	 Prescribers are reminded that most bacterial conjunctivitis in children is self-limiting and does not require pharmacological management.

 Where pharmacological management is required <u>chloramphenicol eye drops</u> 0.5% remain an important mainstay of treatment and should be offered as <u>first line therapy.</u>

Action	Pharmacy changing Optometry prescription
	The number of qualified Independent Prescribing (IP) Optometrists have increased considerably in the last few years, resulting in community pharmacies receiving an increased number of prescriptions from Optometrists. IP Optometrists can prescribe topical medications, creams, ointments and tablets.
	By far the most common are prescriptions for ocular lubricants or artificial tears. IP Optometrists have access to a wide range of artificial tears in the BNF, and many of these products may appear to be the same but have subtle differences due to the excipients involved, their method of delivery and effect on different components of the precorneal tear layer. It is also possible that when managing dry eye other types of artificial tears had already been tried and their use discontinued due to lack of effect or allergic response.
	In addition Optometrists are now managing more complex conditions and the use of one type of artificial tear or lubricant may be problematic when considered with respect to the other products in the management plan.
	Optometrists may be unaware of topical medication temporarily out of stock due to seasonal or manufacturing factors and the particular medication requested is not available at that time
	Should Community Pharmacists have difficulty with the availability of a particular type of medication prescribed by an Optometrist would they contact the prescriber to discuss a suitable alternative.

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
