

Action	Exacerbation of COPD Service
Post-reg	In a previous edition of the Communications Update on 25 th May 2021, we provided information to allow community pharmacies to participate in the above service.
foundation infograp	To date, 187 of the Board's community pharmacies (65%) have completed a Participation Form indicating that they are keen to take part in the service. Despite this, we have had a handful of GP practices notifying us that patients have been referred into the service,
Allacheu	and have been advised by their community pharmacy "we don't know anything about this service".
	If you have indicated that you will participate in the service, I would urge you to make yourself and your staff (including locums) familiar with the service requirements so that patients can receive the intended interventions.

Action	Environmental impact of inhalers
	Metered dose inhalers (MDIs) contain propellants which are powerful greenhouse gases and as such contribute to global warming. Due to these propellants MDIs have a much higher carbon footprint than dry powder inhalers (DPIs).
	 The use of MDIs are estimated to account for 4% of the NHS's entire carbon footprint¹
	 A single MDI inhaler is estimated to have the same carbon footprint as driving 172 miles in a typical car, the same as a journey from Glasgow to Inverness¹ Approximately 73 million inhalers are used in the UK every year²
	 Landfill disposal of inhalers is harmful to the environment both in material waste and in greenhouse gas emissions as the residual gas from canisters is released to the atmosphere.²
	 If every inhaler user in the UK returned all their inhalers for one year, this could save 512,330 tonnes of CO2eq - the same as a VW Golf car being driven around the world 88,606 times²
	The Respiratory MCN are supporting activity to reduce the environmental impact of inhalers and raise awareness of this issue (without making people feel they should not be taking inhalers they need). One activity that can reduce the environmental impact of inhalers is to dispose of them via incineration rather than landfill (incineration destroys the greenhouse gases ²).
	We are encouraging patients to return their used inhalers to pharmacies for disposal through the established patient medication return scheme. We ask that all community pharmacies support this activity by continuing to accept patient returned medication and encouraging return of inhalers for disposal.
	If needed the Community Pharmacy Development team can arrange early replacement of yellow bins when full. If this is required, please contact CPDT via email on ggc.cpdevteam@nhs.scot
	We would also encourage pharmacies to check which inhalers are required when ordering medicines for patients. Ventolin [©] Evohaler has one of the highest carbon footprints, please check with patients if they require a salbutamol inhaler before ordering/ supplying. People with asthma should always have access to a reliever inhaler for acute attacks but should require very little reliever at other times if their asthma is well controlled.

Specials A-Z GGC July 2021 CP V2.pdf Attached	 Previous attachment had formatting errors The Specials A-Z has now been fully updated and reviewed for use by prescribers and dispensing community pharmacies. The A-Z should be used in conjunction with advice within NEWT guidance for those patients with either enteral feeding or swallowing difficulties. Details are accurate at point of publication. The A-Z examines possible alternatives for commonly prescribed unlicensed medicines that should be considered before a ULM is prescribed and may be used as part of the decision making process or discussions between the GP practice and the pharmacy. In the event of a ULM still being needed, the community pharmacy should follow the authorisation process as per normal. This version supersedes any previous versions and you are asked to update your records accordingly.

Action	Unplanned closures/Late opening/Early closures (more than 15 minutes)
	Over the last four or five weeks, a perfect storm of self isolation requirements, positive COVID testing, routine annual leave and the lack of available pharmacists (amongst other things) has caused an escalation to short-notice closures/late opening/early closing incidents within the community pharmacy network in NHS GGC.
	This is now having a significant impact on direct patient care and access to medicines.
	There is a clear duty on pharmacy contractors to ensure they provide services in line with their contractual arrangements with the Health Board, however we accept that the current pressures may cause contractors to make difficult decisions in terms of service provision.
	For the most part, where a pharmacy is effected, the contractor follows the established procedure which allows the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPDT) to log the event and make sure relevant healthcare colleagues are informed.
	Over the last week however on three separate occasions, we were not aware of the closure until notified by a third party.
	I am once again providing a reminder of the process that must be followed if your pharmacy has to close outwith normal contracted hours for any reason:

1. The CPDT must be notified immediately, details should be emailed to: ggc.cpdevteam@ggc.scot.nhs.uk or contact any of the numbers below
0141-201-6041/6042/6046/6047/6049/6054
2. You must advise the time you will close and the reason for it
3. You must confirm when you will reopen
4. You must display a notice on your window/door informing patients of the details of the their next nearest pharmacies (a template can be found at the link below)
5. If applicable, arrangements must be put in place for patients receiving Opioid Substitution Therapies who are still due in that day.
6. Arrangements must be put in place for prescriptions that are still to be collected.
7. Ensure local prescribers are aware of the closure including GP practices, Substance Misuse Services and any other specialist services.
You will be asked to confirm that you have made arrangement for Points 4-7 when contacting the CPDT.
Please note: This process must be followed even for those pharmacies who are part of multiple chains and who may have their own company processes to follow.

Action	Disallowed Items
	A review of the recent Disallowed Report from PSD is showing a few common recurring themes:
	Wrong form used for drug is often being cited in relation to disallowed items for the UCF services and community pharmacy teams are reminded to select the correct service prior to generating the electronic claim. Whilst the paper form itself is no longer required for submission, the electronic message combines the product supplied and the service selected. We are seeing a significant number of POM medicines supplied on "CP2" forms on the report which is suggesting that users may be incorrectly selecting something else instead of the Unscheduled Care services. This is also true for smoking cessation service on UCF to ensure correct payment.
	NHS Pharmacy First Scotland is supported by an approved list. The description of items within this list is very tightly controlled and some of the disallowed items is as a result of the product supplied as the description does not match word for word for the product on the approved list. For example, Beconase hayfever 50micrograms/dose nasal spray (omega pharma ltd) 180 dose is incorrect due to the inclusion of the supplier.
	As ever, there are a large number of disallowed items for wrong forms being used (GP prescriber on a GP10N, or vice versa) and also products not matching the SDT entries – size does actually matter here and the sizing of the item prescribed must match the description in the Drug Tariff.

Action	Patient Safety Concerns Relating to Online Prescribing Services
	We are continuing to identify serious patient safety concerns relating to registered pharmacies dispensing prescription-only medicines from prescribers based in the EEA working alone or for third-party online prescribing services.
	Since April 2019, we have taken enforcement action against over 40 pharmacies linked to their provision of online pharmacy services. The majority of these pharmacies were working with online prescribing services that were prescribing medicines which are liable to abuse, misuse and overuse to people, on the basis of an online questionnaire.
	Our inspections found that our standards were not being met and our guidance on providing pharmacy services at a distance was not being followed. This meant the dispensing pharmacies did not adequately safeguard vulnerable people who may be trying to obtain medicines which are not clinically appropriate for them. This puts patients at risk of serious harm or death.
	We have taken swift and robust enforcement action against these pharmacies and the pharmacists involved have been referred for a Fitness to Practise investigation. We are continuing to act quickly on intelligence we receive relating to online pharmacy services and will take further action where needed to protect patients.
	Action to take
	Pharmacy owners, superintendent pharmacists and pharmacists must make sure that they are meeting our standards and following <u>our guidance on providing pharmacy services at a distance, including on the internet</u> , if they are involved in any online pharmacy services.
	We recognise that many will be already doing so, but there is a significant minority of pharmacies and pharmacy professionals who are not meeting our standards and following our guidance at all times. Action	Specials process update
Guide Prices for Commonly Requested	We have been contacted recently by a number of contractors regarding adjustments made by PSD using the code "SPECREC". This code is used for monetary recoveries or adjustments for overpayment or non-authorisation of Specials, ULM or imprinted medicines.
Specials Authorisation GGC Fir	To reassure all contractors, the process by the Board has not altered, however, as a result of the pandemic, PSD are a number of months behind in processing additional recoveries for specials and Not Collected/ Not Dispensed. It is difficult to ascertain the timeframe for this recent adjustment however I have asked PSD to let me know when the next processing will take place and I will pass this information on as and when I receive it.
Specials A-Z GGC July 2021 CP V2.pdf	As a result of the feedback and discussion with contractors, the Board and CP GGC have reviewed the monthly analysis letters. These letters will now contain an expected adjustment value to help with reconciling the SPECREC when it occurs. The timing of the recovery however is out of the Board's control and is dependent on PSD.
Specials Guidance V2 April 2021.pdf	To help you with the local process, contractors will shortly receive the list of all authorised items held on file for your pharmacy. This list will be sent to your genereic mailbox and should be retained for your records. The list will also contain recently "expired" authorisations for awareness and information. Please note, that any item that is contained within the pre-approved guide price list does not require to be authorised using the normal process, or for drugs with a licensed product equivalent.

The_supply_of_unlic ensed_medicinal_proc	 Please remember any special ordered from PSS (Tayside Pharmaceuticals) or is listed within Part 7S or 7U does not require authorisation. Contractors are also reminded of the endorsing requirements for all specials – you need to both electronically and hand endorse the price of the item and quantity along with any OOPE and the agreed £30 handling charge which is paid only by endorsement.

Action	Potential Supply Problem - Rifater



Action	Advanced warning of change to preferred buprenorphine 7 day patch
	Formulary change – buprenorphine 7 day patches:
	The preferred brand of buprenorphine 7 day patches on the NHSGGC total formulary will change from Butec to Sevodyne on 30th September 2021. Please adjust stocks accordingly.

Action	Incomplete Stage 1 assessments
	Under arrangements for Medicines, Care and Review (MCR), all patients are entitled to receive pharmaceutical care and as such, the Pharmacy Care Record (PCR) has now been changed to reflect the new requirements for the service. All patients registered for the service must have a completed patient profile and a completed Stage 1 assessment within 16 weeks from registration. It is the completion of the stage 1 assessment that triggers the current payment associated with the registration.
	In addition, details for the service contained within NHS Circular: PCA (P)(2021) 3 Additional Pharmaceutical Services .Medicines: Care And Review Service – Directions And Service Specification, there is a new requirement for an annual assessment to take place. The PCR update now includes a new reporting tool to identify when these new annual assessments are due.
	As part of the wider support for the service, I monitor activity with the stage 1 assessments and the most recent report (based in registrations and assessments on 1 st August) have shown that some pharmacy teams have larger numbers where the stage 1 assessment appears to have not been completed. This means that you will not have been paid for the registration for this patient.
	To help community pharmacy teams, I recently sent each a copy of the registrations and number of missing stage 1 assessments as of 1 st August for you to review and action as appropriately. It may be that the reviews have taken place but the "complete" button has not been triggered. It may also be possible to conduct this review safely in a face to face environment with the patient, on the telephone or via NHS Near Me or other VC methods that you may have access to use for those assessments that are still outstanding.
