Serial Prescription Flyer.pdf	As you know, in Healthcare Improvement Scotland's ihub we support quality improvement and service redesign, and in 2018 the Primary Care Improvement Portfolio received a commission from SG PC division to support the implementation of elements of the GMS contract and accompanying MoU.	
Attached	Throughout this time we have been supporting a number of improvement activities including supporting the implementation of processes around the evolving pharmacotherapy services. In response to the pandemic and stakeholder feedback we focused our pharmacotherapy work on Serial Prescribing. Over the past year we have been working across 8 HSCPs with 53 GP practice teams and pharmacy staff to bring together their collective experience and develop a national toolkit to support the safe transition of patients from repeat prescriptions onto a serial prescription.	
	We have created the Serial Prescribing Toolkit to support teams to set-up and implement serial prescription services. The toolkit is now available and we plan to support the spread of this nationally with a series of virtual webinars, followed by dedicated improvement support delivered nationally and locally at a cluster or practice level. The link to the toolkit and details of how to join the webinars are in the attached flyer.	
	To promote the toolkit and subsequent implementation, it would be really helpful if you could share the toolkit and the flyer across your networks.

It's that time of year again!!!			
	The arrangements being observed by NHS GGC across the festive period for community pharmacy are as follows:		

Friday 24 th December 2021 – Normal working day	Friday 31 st December 2021 – Normal Working day;
Saturday 25 th December 2021 – Normal working day	Saturday 1 st January 2022 – Normal working day
Sunday 26 th December 2021 – Normal Working day	Sunday 2 nd January 2022 – Normal Working day
Monday 27 th December 2021 – Public Holiday	Monday 3 rd January 2022 – Public Holiday
Tuesday 28 th December 2021 – Public Holiday	Tuesday 4 th January – Public Holiday

Attached you will find a pro-forma. Please complete this to confirm which days you plan to provide pharmaceutical services over the key festive holiday dates.

Although 25th December and 1st January aren't officially public holidays, we expect that the majority of the CP network will close. As such we would expect that you move your Saturday hours to either the Monday (27th & 3rd) or Tuesday (28th & 4th). Please indicate this on the pro-forma.

In keeping with previous years we might need to rota pharmacies to open (depending on the response we receive). As a first step, we look for volunteers willing to open at Board request on key dates. As per previous years, the focus of provision of pharmaceutical services will be around the Out of Hours centres across the Board's area.

On Christmas and New Year's days, a minimum 3 hour service will be required between midday and 3.00pm from at least one pharmacy within each designated area. On the Mondays (27th Dec and 3rd Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.

Contractors who open and provide normal services during Christmas and New Year days and the public holidays, will receive payment only if pharmacy cover is considered necessary and this has been confirmed by the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPD Team). Once responses have been consolidated and these are matched against the potential level of services required in each area, we will be able to identify which pharmacies will be eligible for reimbursement.

Contractors who volunteer or are required to open will receive confirmation from the CPD Team by email. All contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed at the agreed rate of £244.75 per hour.

NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision once the service level has been established.



ACTION	INDEPENDENT PRESCRIBING COURSES 2022/ 23 - APPLICANT INFORMATION for NES FUNDING				
	In collaboration with Health Boards, Community Pharmacy Scotland, Robert Gordon University and University of Strathclyde, we have revised the application process for NES funded Independent Prescribing (IP) places. I am now pleased to invite notes of interest for the next IP Courses.				
	There are 4 courses available for 2022/23 with a total of 244 NES funded places. IP course dates can be found below. Places are open to all sectors of pharmacy practice, and are now distributed on a Health Board allocation rather than a first come, first serve basis. As a result, requests should be made directly to your Health Board using the relevant contact email or link in the table below.				
	As part of this NES funding, attendance at consultation and clinical skills training is also required. These skills courses will also be fully funded by NES, and all successful NES funded IP applicants will automatically be offered a place on these courses once they become available.

The clinical service(s) you plan to deliver as a pharmacist prescriber

- Release from service for all course dates (including all relevant clinical skills courses) and agreement to support you during the period of learning in practice
- Release for attendance at a Teach and Treat Common Clinical Conditions (CCC) hub if planning to deliver the Pharmacy First Plus service in Community Pharmacy

If demand for NES funded IP places exceeds allocation, Health Boards will be required to prioritise places. If unsuccessful at initial application, you will be added to a waiting list should a place then become available.

Action	ORDERING OF DRUGS ASSOCIATED WITH HIV/HEP C
	Over the last few months, we have seen an increase in the number of times that the Brownlee has supplied medication to community pharmacies due to difficulties in obtaining stock.
	On further investigation, for the most part, the medication was available from the designated route, but the community pharmacist either wasn't aware of the ordering process, or sufficient time wasn't allowed for the ordering process to be complete so that a break in treatment would only be avoided by the Brownlee providing the stock.
	If you have any HIV/Hep C patients, please make yourself familiar (and any locums or support staff who may be involved in the care of the patient) with the ordering arrangements for these drugs. You will find the details on the individual pages for each service within the Community Pharmacy website (links below).

Action Endorsement of urgency for all prescriptions for subcutaneous (SC) medicines for palliative care patients in primary care

To help community pharmacists prioritise the dispensing and supply of SC palliative care medicines in primary care, it would be helpful if all prescriptions for either SC 'as required', SC regular bolus or continuous subcutaneous infusions via a syringe pump, could be endorsed with one of the following statements:

- 1. <u>'Urgent' if needed the same day</u>, or
- 2. 'Just in Case' if needed in the next 12-24 hours

This will allow the community pharmacist to accurately prioritise both the dispensing and delivery (if identified as being needed) for these important medicines to patients in primary care.

Our courier service for palliative care patients remains available, but there are currently significant staffing challenges being faced by the company which provides it for us. Endorsement of prescriptions as stated above will help to identify those scripts which are the most urgent and prevent any unintentional delays.

Action	Unplanned Closure Process
	We would like to clarify that while community pharmacies are required to advise the Board of any unplanned pharmacy closure where this lasts more than 15 minutes; this does not extend to community pharmacies who utilise the option to close their pharmacy for an hour at lunch time (where they would previously have stayed open over lunch).
	We have amended the wording on the CPD website to make this clearer.

In keeping with previous years we might need to rota pharmacies to open (depending on the response we receive). As a first step, we look for volunteers willing to open at Board request on key dates. As per previous years, the focus of provision of pharmaceutical services will be around the Out of Hours centres across the Board's area.

On Christmas and New Year's days, a minimum 3 hour service will be required between midday and 3.00pm from at least one pharmacy within each designated area. On the Mondays (27th Dec and 3rd Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.

Contractors who open and provide normal services during Christmas and New Year days and the public holidays, will receive payment only if pharmacy cover is considered necessary and this has been confirmed by the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPD Team). Once responses have been consolidated and these are matched against the potential level of services required in each area, we will be able to identify which pharmacies will be eligible for reimbursement.

Contractors who volunteer or are required to open will receive confirmation from the CPD Team by email. All contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed at the agreed rate of £244.75 per hour.

NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision once the service level has been established.

To meet the Board's winter planning deadline and ensure robust details relating to your pharmacy are featured in any promotional material the Board might produce, <u>it is</u> <u>essential that you complete and return the pro-forma</u> no later than **Monday 25**th October 2021.
