## SEASONAL COMMON CONDITIONS TREATABLE UNDER THE NHS PHARMACY FIRST SCOTLAND SERVICE:

Given pumpkin-carving activity in the run up to Halloween, this time we focus on....CUTS!

## Remember to record every patient interaction you have on your PMR, including:

ADVICE such as: for surface cuts, clean and cover to control infection risk (can use antiseptic cream too). For deeper cuts that stop bleeding when pressure is applied, the patient might want to use steristrips to close the gap and promote healing, then apply a dressing.

**REFERRALS** you need to make for patients with cuts that won't stop bleeding when pressure is applied, or wounds showing signs of infection or displaying a foreign body that can't be easily removed.
