I wanted to highlight two training modules that are available and may be of interest to community pharmacy teams.

Within the Scottish Government's Action Plan, <u>Improving the lives of Gypsy/Travellers:</u> <u>2019-2021</u>, there was an action to support community pharmacists to use health literacy tools and techniques. An eLearning module on health literacy was developed and tested by community pharmacists and then originally promoted during Health Literacy month in October 2020.

In addition to the health literacy module, there is another training module available that provides more detail explaining the background of Gypsy/Travellers and giving a rationale of why some individuals may not access healthcare services in the same way that the settled community might. For anyone undertaking this training we would recommend to do the Raising awareness module prior to the health literacy module.

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

FINAL REMINDER: Business Continuity Planning Process

PLEASE READ THE BELOW CAREFULLY – THERE ARE DIFFERENT
REQUIREMENTS DEPENDING ON WHETHER YOUR PHARMACY IS AN
INDEPENDENT PHARMACY OR A MULTIPLE/SMALL MULTIPLE THAT OPERATES
UNDER A CORPORATE BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLANNING ARRANGEMENT

Legislation contained in the Civil Contingencies Act 2004 requires public bodies such as Health Boards to have plans in place to maintain access to core and essential services in an emergency situation. This extends to key constituent elements of the Board's service provision, including community pharmacies.

During the course of the pandemic, the Board's Civil Contingencies Team has taken soundings from a wide range of areas, and has made amendments to the template used for Business Continuity Planning.

It is now five years since we asked community pharmacies to provide copies of their Business Continuity Plan and we feel that while these amendments do not constitute a material change to the template, they are significant enough to warrant an updating exercise for community pharmacies.

With the support of CP GGC and to ensure the Board fulfils its obligations and complies with the governing legislation we are asking:

- All independent community pharmacies to complete the template from Pages 13 onwards. On submission of a properly completed template, a payment of £50.00 will be made;
- Community pharmacies who are part of a chain who operate a corporate Business Continuity Planning process should complete Page 13 and Section 1 of the template. On submission of a properly completed portion, a payment of £25.00 will be made.

Completed templates should be submitted electronically to: ggc.cpdevteam@nhs.scot by Friday 29th April 2022. It would be helpful if you could mark the following in the Subject Line: BCP Submission – Contractor Code:**** (insert your contractor code).

Payments will be made via the Regional Services function and will appear in the payment relating to Dispensed January 2022 (Paid March 2022). Full details will be included in the monthly remittance generated by the CPD Team.

REMINDER	Reporting of Missed Doses for OST Patients
	Following on from the updates to NEO in November regarding the recording of missed doses and reporting of patient concerns, I would like to share with you a review of the information we have received from colleagues in the ADRS service.
	94/254 (37%) pharmacies providing OST have used the Missed dose module since launch in mid- November 805 reports have been made in total
	426 reports of 3 consecutive missed doses 230 reports of issues with Rx 149 reports of concerns for patient
	The number of reports coming in per month continues to rise which is allowing the ADRS service and others an opportunity to intervene at an early stage in managing patient care. What is hugely encouraging is the number of reports of concern that community pharmacy teams are raising when they feel that a patient could do with some additional support.
	Feedback from both the pharmacy teams and the ADRS teams has been hugely positive as more interactions are occurring between the two services making care more joined up and less time consuming when individuals previously had to chase around different options to try and get the correct person to speak to.
	I would urge more Pharmacies to utilise these functions that we now have on NEO to ensure that more patients are able to receive a quick intervention into their care.
	Many thanks for the support that you are giving to one of the most vulnerable cohorts of patients we service and i look forward to seeing these numbers grow in the future.

Safeguarding Process Maps for HfU and SS	Dear colleague,
Attached	 Please find attached a flowchart developed by Scottish Government in partnership with local authorities in response to safeguarding Ukrainians seeking refuge in Scotland. In addition to this we can update on the following: Glasgow has recently received confirmation on funding arrangements and will now be issuing £200 per person to all arrivals from Ukraine. This will be issued directly from our Asylum Refugee Service. Property checks are being undertaken by Glasgow City Council Environmental Health Officers and we are making good progress. Enhanced Disclosures for hosts including anyone residing in the host household above the age of 16 years are also underway with good progress being made. Enhanced Disclosure Scotland are currently processing decisions within 48 hours. Once property checks and Enhanced Disclosure are complete the Asylum and Refugee Service will activate monthly payments of £350 to hosts, which will be accompanied by monthly visits.
	At present Glasgow continues to see small numbers of arrivals through the super sponsor scheme where we would be required to provide emergency accommodation through the Glasgow hub hotel. Anyone arriving at the hotel will be provided with initial assessment via Asylum Refugee Service and where necessary immediate access to Asylum Bridging Health Team. We are however seeing slightly higher numbers of arrivals through the family visa scheme and host arrangements. Once arrived in the Glasgow hub hotel we will seek to match families to hosts or Local Authority Housing Association accommodation to allow people to move on from the hotel as quickly as possible. Anyone seeking refuge from Ukraine are entitled to full benefits and arrangements are in place to ensure this happens as quickly as possible.
	Glasgow hub members continue to meet weekly where a full review of activity and demand takes place ensuring all the necessary support arrangements are in place. More recently a list of FAQs has been developed to assist those arriving from Ukraine which includes registering with schools, GPs etc: https://www.glasgow.gov.uk/index.aspx?articleid=29262
	Anyone presenting as destitute via local area teams should be signposted to Asylum Refugee Service on 0141 222 7300.

	Various brands of sodium hyaluronate eye drops are included in the formulary but are restricted to use in severe dry eyes only.
	The total formulary has recently been updated, with the following changes made:
	 Evolve HA® (sodium hyaluronate 0.2%) and Hylo-Forte® (sodium hyaluronate 0.2%) eye drops have been removed from the formulary and are now non-formulary in NHSGGC
	• Eyeaze® 0.4% (sodium hyaluronate 0.4%) eye drops have been added to the formulary, these eye drops are suitable for those requiring preservative free sodium hyaluronate eye drops and also for those with dexterity problems
	Blink Intensive Tears® (sodium hyaluronate 0.2%) eye drops remain on the total formulary and are considered the first line sodium hyaluronate preparation. It should be noted that these eye drops contain a preservative.
	Eyeaze® 0.4% (sodium hyaluronate 0.4%) eye drops are stocked by all major wholesalers and stock levels will be monitored in order to ensure reliable supply. At present, NHSGGC are not undertaking an active program of switching patients already established on Evolve HA® and Hylo-Forte® to Eyeaze®.
