REMINDER	Update Re Formulary Change to dry Eye Products
	Various brands of sodium hyaluronate eye drops are included in the formulary but are restricted to use in severe dry eyes only.
	The total formulary has recently been updated, with the following changes made:
	 Evolve HA® (sodium hyaluronate 0.2%) and Hylo-Forte® (sodium hyaluronate 0.2%) eye drops have been removed from the formulary and are now non-formulary in NHSGGC
	\cdot Eyeaze® 0.4% (sodium hyaluronate 0.4%) eye drops have been added to the formulary, these eye drops are suitable for those requiring preservative free sodium hyaluronate eye drops and also for those with dexterity problems
	Blink Intensive Tears® (sodium hyaluronate 0.2%) eye drops remain on the total formulary and are considered the first line sodium hyaluronate preparation. It should be noted that these eye drops contain a preservative.
	Eyeaze® 0.4% (sodium hyaluronate 0.4%) eye drops are stocked by all major wholesalers and stock levels will be monitored in order to ensure reliable supply. At present, NHSGGC are not undertaking an active program of switching patients already established on Evolve HA® and Hylo-Forte® to Eyeaze®.

LearnPro -	We advised the network a while ago of Pharmacy Services' intention to invest in resource to provide community pharmacy access to the LearnPro training platform.
Pro-Forma.docx	This platform will host a significant proportion of the training elements required for community pharmacy to deliver the various local negotiated services.
	Every pharmacy will be allowed three log-ins. These should be for the regular pharmacist, and any support staff who are regularly involved in the management of a local service. Registrants must be able to provide a GPhC number. The facility is accessed via a self-registration process, details of which will be provided in the next few weeks, along with notification of the training modules that will be on the platform and instructions on what is required in terms of completion.
	There is still time for independent pharmacy owners to include access to the Board's "Mandatory" modules (this facility is not available to multiple chains who operate their own internal training infrastructure). 	NHS GGC is responsible for making sure it's population has access to pharmaceutical services at all reasonable times. It fulfils this responsibility through the Model Hours of Service Scheme which sets out the minimum number of hours our community pharmacy network is required to operate.
	We are fully aware that over the last few months, the network has experienced significant challenges relating to workforce, a resurgence of COVID cases and an increase in workload (amongst others). Our colleagues in CP GGC have advised us that these challenges are set to continue, and may indeed worsen as the summer holiday period begins.
	The Board and CP GGC agree it might be helpful to stabilise service provision over the next few months, if the network were offered an element of flexibility to allow them to better utilise their available staff resource. As such, we are offering contractors the opportunity to indicate whether they would be interested in "not opening" or varying their normal hours of service on Saturdays over the summer holiday period (dates are detailed in the attached pro-forma). This would involve allowing a proportion of pharmacies to close on Saturdays or reduce their hours in line with the Model Hours (9.00am $-$ 1.00pm) temporarily over the summer to allow pharmacist cover to be focussed on week day provision of service.
	<u>You should be aware that a note of interest does not mean your request will be</u> <u>authorised.</u> Obviously any such permissions to vary contracted hours would be considered by the Board to ensure that adequate provision of service remained for the public across all HSCP's.
