# ACTION Service Provision - Christmas and New Year 2022/2023 PLEASE NOTE: Branches of Boots, Dickson's, Gilbride's, Houlihan, Invercoast, Lloyds, M&D Green, Morrisons, Rowlands, Well, Willis or any other contractor who has a Central Sign Up process have no need to respond to this communication as this will be co-ordinated from a central point within your company. As you will be aware, the Board has a statutory responsibility to ensure that its population can access pharmacy services at all reasonable times and in keeping with previous years we, as a first step, are seeking to establish those of you who are planning to open on the public holiday dates shown in the table appearing on the attached pro-forma.

Although 25th December and 1st January aren't officially public holidays, we expect that the majority of the CP network will close. Again we are keen to establish those of you that are planning to open and for what hours.

In keeping with previous years, the focus of provision of pharmaceutical services will be around the Out of Hours centres across the Board's area. On Christmas and New Year's days, a minimum 3 hour service will be required between midday and 3.00pm from at least one pharmacy within each designated area. On the Mondays (26th Dec and 2nd Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.

We will only rota pharmacies to open if it is absolutely necessary (depending on the response we receive). Attached you will find a pro-forma. Please complete this to confirm which days you plan to provide pharmaceutical services over the key festive holiday dates.

Responses will be consolidated and matched against the potential level of services required in each area. Where gaps are identified, we will endeavour to cover these with volunteers. Where there are no volunteers, we will rota pharmacies to open. Where there is an over provision of volunteers, **Payment will only be made to contractors who receive formal confirmation from the CPD Team by email.** Contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed for all agreed slots covered at the rate of £244.75 per hour. NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision.



# PLEASE READ: Early Warning System - Analysis **ACTION** The Board initiated the Early Warning Cascade on the 13th September 2022 regarding the Public Holiday for the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II on Monday 19th September 2022. EWS - All HSCPs -Of the 29 cascade systems, 13 were successful. This represents a 44% success rate. I July 2022.pdf would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 13 Attached cascades. On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-Last Pharmacy in cascade did not call Master Station; Last Pharmacy in the cascade tried repeatedly to get through to the master station and gave up: Master Station failed to confirm completion with the CPD Team: Locum did not know that the cascade process had to be followed; Regular Pharmacist not in, message was not passed onto the next Pharmacy; and Unable to get through to the next Pharmacy on the list and gave up. We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative. I have attached a further copy of each of the Board's HSCP's systems. Please identify your pharmacy within that document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone. UPDATE	Prescribing Team Update - Endorsing
	Endorsing is the means in which community pharmacies can ensure correct and appropriate payment for items dispensed and services offered to patients. Accurate endorsing is the responsibility of the contractor prior to submission of the form to PSD for payment.
	There are two ways to endorse – electronically via your PMR and ePharmacy messages and on paper. However, as we move to dominant process of automation and into a paper lite service, electronic endorsing takes precedence and we will shortly come to a point in time where the paper is no longer used for payment purposes.
	It is therefore vital that all pharmacy team members involved in dispensing process are aware of how to endorse correctly using the electronic system.
	For many cases, the PMR will automatically endorse and all ePharmacy claims come with quantity and pack size as part of the claim message. This means that it is vital that the pack size selected at labelling corresponds correctly to the pack size being dispensed and will ensure that there is correct remuneration for that pack size.
	It is also important when endorsing to add any additional endorsements to the claim message as the PMR will not do it automatically. This is particularly important for "specials" or unlicensed medicines. You must electronically endorse the invoice price and claim for any relevant out of pocket or handling charges by adding to the claim message.
	There is a very helpful endorsing guide to help with all the claims that a CP may need to make and is available here. Community Pharmacy Scotland also have a very helpful section on their website on endorsing that is worth looking at.
	Please ensure that you are familiar with the processes for correctly endorsing as this may be subject to payment verification checks.
	In the event that the strength or quantity is changed e.g for a short supply, ensure that the correct item which was dispensed is claimed electronically and endorse with the appropriate PC or PNC as required. Any items dispensed under the SSP protocols have additional endorsing requirements.
	Key messages on endorsing:
	Electronic endorsing trumps paper – you must ensure that you electronically endorse and matches the paper.
	Serial prescriptions – only accept electronic endorsing.
	For items not dispensed or collected, you must endorse the item as NC or ND so as not to be incorrectly paid for an item that was not dispensed.
	Ensure the correct pack size is added to the message.
	Remember to send your claim message at point of handover or after medication has been supplied to the patient.

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

	There will be a need to request higher quotas given more patients will be on the 0.5mg weekly strength.

## **Blood Glucose Meters & Test Strips Formulary Update**



Following an update to the NHS GGC Blood Glucose Meter & Strip Formulary there will be a gradual change over the coming months to the new formulary meters and strips for people with type 2 Diabetes.

The new formulary strips are Contour Plus Test Strips and Glucofix Tech Sensor.

**Glucomen Areo Sensors & CareSens Pro Strips** are still on formulary for the combined glucose & ketone meters.

The **Palmdoc2 meter and strips** are an option for those who are visibly impaired; it has a speaking function in English, Bengali, Polish, Urdu and Arabic.

There will be a gradual reduction in the use of **GlucoRx Nexus** strips as patients move to the new meters.

Technology has advanced such that the new meters have Bluetooth technology (excl. Palmdoc2) and link easily to apps to support the management of diabetes. The Contour Plus Blue meter allows for a second blood sample to be added to the strip. The Red, Amber & Green indicators advise if blood glucose levels are within range.

All connect to Diasend to monitor trends in blood glucose and enable data sharing with diabetes specialists.

You may begin to see requests for the new strips coming out initially from clinics. The switch activity in Primary Care will be gradual, with pockets starting from the end of November and running over the first half of 2023.

Companies have been asked to ensure quotas do not affect the supply model into community pharmacies. They have assured us they have sufficient stock to support the anticipated growth in demand.

REMINDER	Business Continuity Plan (BCP)
	As you will be aware, contingency planning for a range of risks is a key business activity to ensure essential services continue to be provided and maintained in an emergency such as a fire, flood or for example recently - a car going through the front window of a pharmacy. The recent incident provides a timely opportunity to remind community pharmacies that they should have an up-to-date Business Continuity Plan (BCP).
	This should be a relatively simple process for most contractors given the Board conducted an update exercise earlier this year and provided funding for the submission of an up-to-date Plan. In the unlikely event that you have not established a Plan using the most up-to-date template; you will find this <a href="https://example.com/here/">here</a> .
	As part of business continuity planning, we have previously asked you to consider a "buddy" system. This "buddy" system would involve discussing with a fellow contractor in the proximity of your pharmacy and within your local community, to identify where you could help and support each other in times of difficulty. Based on what we have seen over the years, it is even more important that a relationship like this is in place to ensure that the continuity of patient care within communities can be maintained wherever possible. Therefore, we kindly ask that a "buddy" pharmacy is written into each of your Business Continuity Plans when preparing for winter this year.

REMINDER	Change to Supply Route of the Prostrate Cancer drug Abiraterone (Zytiga)
	For the attention of Oncology Drug supplying Pharmacies.
	You may be aware that the Prostrate Cancer drug Abiraterone (Zytiga) is coming off patent soon.
	As a result of this Pharmacy Services has had to consider how best to support patients as we change to the generic product that has come onto the market.
	From the 1st of December patients will be supported with supply of the new drug from acute sites within NHS GGC which means that patients currently accessing community supply will need to be transitioned to the new pack and supply route.
	There will still be prescriptions live within the system and you may have still have active prescriptions for patients you are currently supplying. As such we ask that you continue to service these prescriptions as you would normally do HOWEVER please only order stock for the prescriptions that you have and do not forward plan as no new prescriptions will be forthcoming in the future. For any that have still to be processed please endorse the prescription as "ZYTIGA".
	We are currently in discussion around stock management and how we will deal with surplus stock in the unlikely event that this is an issue after the 1st of December. We will share any process with you as soon as it has been agreed.

REMINDER	Shortages
	We are aware of the high level of drug shortages currently which has grown quite drastically over the last year. We are fully appreciative of the work that community pharmacy teams carry out in trying to obtain stock from all sources. Please find below, some reminders of actions to consider when shortages occur -
	<ol> <li>If a product can be found at a higher price than the tariff, please supply and ensure that this is recorded with CPS on their shortages page in order that negotiations with NSS can happen to influence changes in tariff prices;</li> <li>Be aware of single route supply lines. Where these are in place, a product is NOT in short supply - it is only available through one supplier and therefore should be obtained accordingly regardless of which wholesaler is involved. This also applies to normal lines – the item is not Out of stock or unavailable because the pharmacy is unable to access it from their own wholesaler - it may be available from others;</li> <li>On dealing with shortages, please consider rationing amounts to patients in order that a number of patients can gain access to medicines, albeit smaller quantities;</li> <li>Familiarise and utilise the "Medicines shortages guidance" document. Link noted below -</li> </ol>

	<ol><li>In the event of a shortage, be prepared to offer guidance as to what is available when contacting surgeries for an alternative.</li></ol>

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

As you will be aware, the Board has a statutory responsibility to ensure that its population can access pharmacy services at all reasonable times and in keeping with previous years we, as a first step, are seeking to establish those of you who are planning to open on the public holiday dates shown in the table appearing on the attached pro-forma.

Although 25th December and 1st January aren't officially public holidays, we expect that the majority of the CP network will close. Again we are keen to establish those of you that are planning to open and for what hours.

In keeping with previous years, the focus of provision of pharmaceutical services will be around the Out of Hours centres across the Board's area. On Christmas and New Year's days, a minimum 3 hour service will be required between midday and 3.00pm from at least one pharmacy within each designated area. On the Mondays (26th Dec and 2nd Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.

We will only rota pharmacies to open if it is absolutely necessary (depending on the response we receive). Attached you will find a pro-forma. Please complete this to confirm which days you plan to provide pharmaceutical services over the key festive holiday dates.

Responses will be consolidated and matched against the potential level of services required in each area. Where gaps are identified, we will endeavour to cover these with volunteers. Where there are no volunteers, we will rota pharmacies to open. Where there is an over provision of volunteers, **Payment will only be made to contractors who receive formal confirmation from the CPD Team by email.** Contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed for all agreed slots covered at the rate of £244.75 per hour. NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision.

## PLEASE READ: Early Warning System - Analysis

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The Board initiated the Early Warning Cascade on the 13<sup>th</sup> September 2022 regarding the Public Holiday for the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Of the 29 cascade systems, 13 were successful. This represents a 44% success rate. I would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 13 cascades.

On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-

- Last Pharmacy in cascade did not call Master Station;
- Last Pharmacy in the cascade tried repeatedly to get through to the master station and gave up;
- Master Station failed to confirm completion with the CPD Team;
- Locum did not know that the cascade process had to be followed;
- Regular Pharmacist not in, message was not passed onto the next Pharmacy; and
- Unable to get through to the next Pharmacy on the list and gave up.

We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative.

I have attached a further copy of each of the Board's HSCP's systems. Please identify your pharmacy within that document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.




REMINDER	Prescribing Team Update - Endorsing
	Endorsing is the means in which community pharmacies can ensure correct and appropriate payment for items dispensed and services offered to patients. Accurate endorsing is the responsibility of the contractor prior to submission of the form to PSD for payment.
	There are two ways to endorse – electronically via your PMR and ePharmacy messages and on paper. However, as we move to dominant process of automation and into a paper lite service, electronic endorsing takes precedence and we will shortly come to a point in time where the paper is no longer used for payment purposes.
	It is therefore vital that all pharmacy team members involved in dispensing process are aware of how to endorse correctly using the electronic system.
	For many cases, the PMR will automatically endorse and all ePharmacy claims come with quantity and pack size as part of the claim message. This means that it is vital that the pack size selected at labelling corresponds correctly to the pack size being dispensed and will ensure that there is correct remuneration for that pack size.
	It is also important when endorsing to add any additional endorsements to the claim message as the PMR will not do it automatically. This is particularly important for "specials" or unlicensed medicines. You must electronically endorse the invoice price and claim for any relevant out of pocket or handling charges by adding to the claim message.
	There is a very helpful endorsing guide to help with all the claims that a CP may need to make and is available here. Community Pharmacy Scotland also have a very helpful section on their website on endorsing that is worth looking at.
	Please ensure that you are familiar with the processes for correctly endorsing as this may be subject to payment verification checks.
	In the event that the strength or quantity is changed e.g for a short supply, ensure that the correct item which was dispensed is claimed electronically and endorse with the appropriate PC or PNC as required. Any items dispensed under the SSP protocols have additional endorsing requirements.
	Key messages on endorsing:
	· Electronic endorsing trumps paper – you must ensure that you electronically endorse and matches the paper.
	· Serial prescriptions – only accept electronic endorsing.

 $\cdot$  For items not dispensed or collected, you must endorse the item as NC or ND so as not to be incorrectly paid for an item that was not dispensed.

 $\cdot$  Ensure the correct pack size is added to the message.

Remember to send your claim message at point of handover or after medication has been supplied to the patient.

BGM_Formulary_20 22 final.pdf	Following an update to the NHS GGC Blood Glucose Meter & Strip Formulary there will be a gradual change over the coming months to the new formulary meters and strips for people with type 2 Diabetes.
Attached	The new formulary strips are Contour Plus Test Strips and Glucofix Tech Sensor.
	Glucomen Areo Sensors & CareSens Pro Strips are still on formulary for the combined glucose & ketone meters.
	The <b>Palmdoc2 meter and strips</b> are an option for those who are visibly impaired; it has a speaking function in English, Bengali, Polish, Urdu and Arabic.
	There will be a gradual reduction in the use of <b>GlucoRx Nexus</b> strips as patients move to the new meters.
	Technology has advanced such that the new meters have Bluetooth technology (excl. Palmdoc2) and link easily to apps to support the management of diabetes. The Contour Plus Blue meter allows for a second blood sample to be added to the strip. The Red, Amber & Green indicators advise if blood glucose levels are within range.
	All connect to Diasend to monitor trends in blood glucose and enable data sharing with diabetes specialists.
	You may begin to see requests for the new strips coming out initially from clinics. The switch activity in Primary Care will be gradual, with pockets starting from the end of November and running over the first half of 2023.
	Companies have been asked to ensure quotas do not affect the supply model into community pharmacies. They have assured us they have sufficient stock to support the anticipated growth in demand.

REMINDER	Business Continuity Plan (BCP)
	As you will be aware, contingency planning for a range of risks is a key business activity to ensure essential services continue to be provided and maintained in an emergency

such as a fire, flood or for example recently - a car going through the front window of a pharmacy. The recent incident provides a timely opportunity to remind community pharmacies that they should have an up-to-date Business Continuity Plan (BCP).

This should be a relatively simple process for most contractors given the Board conducted an update exercise earlier this year and provided funding for the submission of an up-to-date Plan. In the unlikely event that you have not established a Plan using the most up-to-date template; you will find this <a href="https://example.com/here/">here</a>.

As part of business continuity planning, we have previously asked you to consider a "buddy" system. This "buddy" system would involve discussing with a fellow contractor in the proximity of your pharmacy and within your local community, to identify where you could help and support each other in times of difficulty. Based on what we have seen over the years, it is even more important that a relationship like this is in place to ensure that the continuity of patient care within communities can be maintained wherever possible. Therefore, we kindly ask that a "buddy" pharmacy is written into each of your Business Continuity Plans when preparing for winter this year.

UPDATE	Update from the GGC Diabetes MCN October 2022
	Due to supply problems with the glucagon-like peptide 1 (GLP-1) receptor agonists, dulaglutide and semaglutide, likely to last until the beginning of 2023, the GGC Diabetes MCN advise:
	1.No new patients should be started on injectable semaglutide or dulaglutide until further notice.
	2. Existing patients on injectable semaglutide 1mg weekly can be reduced to one 0.5mg injection weekly until supplies return to normal (expected early 2023). Clinical effectiveness should be monitored, and additional or alternative treatments may need to be considered.
	3. For advice on alternatives for new patients being considered for a GLP-1 receptor agonist, refer to the Department of Health and Social Care Medicines Supply Notifications (MSNs) for dulaglutide and semaglutide and further information below.
	4. If patients are changed to the lower 0.5mg strength (as per the MCN advice) they should <b>continue with 1 injection a week</b> .
	They should <b>not</b> "double up" the 0.5mg injection.
	Please can you ensure that affected patients are aware of this
	Further information
	Semaglutide is also available as a once daily tablet (Rybelsus®). Other parenteral GLP 1 receptor agonists that remain available include exenatide and liraglutide. The GLP-1 receptor agonists differ in dose schedule and tolerability, as well as evidence base for effectiveness and clinical outcomes
	Liraglutide 1.2mg daily would be the first line alternative if semaglutide 0.5 mg weekly becomes unavailable. If previously stopped liraglutide due to intolerance or poor response, consider weekly exenatide (Bydureon) second line.  Liraglutide optimises cardiac and renal protection which is why it is recommended over weekly exenatide or oral semaglutide. (LEADER Clinical Trial evidence)
	Please also note the effect of switching between oral and SC semaglutide cannot easily be predicted because of the high pharmacokinetic variability of oral semaglutide. An oral dose equivalent to 1mg of SC semaglutide has not been established and therefore patients should be titrated according to the guidance below.





#### **Service Provision - Christmas and New Year 2022/2023**



PLEASE NOTE: Branches of Boots, Dickson's, Gilbride's, Houlihan, Invercoast, Lloyds, M&D Green, Morrisons, Rowlands, Well, Willis or any other contractor who has a Central Sign Up process have no need to respond to this communication as this will be co-ordinated from a central point within your company.

As you will be aware, the Board has a statutory responsibility to ensure that its population can access pharmacy services at all reasonable times and in keeping with previous years we, as a first step, are seeking to establish those of you who are planning to open on the public holiday dates shown in the table appearing on the attached pro-forma.

Although 25th December and 1st January aren't officially public holidays, we expect that the majority of the CP network will close. Again we are keen to establish those of you that are planning to open and for what hours.

In keeping with previous years, the focus of provision of pharmaceutical services will be around the Out of Hours centres across the Board's area. On Christmas and New Year's days, a minimum 3 hour service will be required between midday and 3.00pm from at least one pharmacy within each designated area. On the Mondays (26th Dec and 2nd Jan), services will extend to 5.5 hours between midday and 5.30pm. This service will be provided by at least two pharmacies in the respective area opening for 3 hours each, with a half hour overlap.

We will only rota pharmacies to open if it is absolutely necessary (depending on the response we receive). Attached you will find a pro-forma. Please complete this to confirm which days you plan to provide pharmaceutical services over the key festive holiday dates.

Responses will be consolidated and matched against the potential level of services required in each area. Where gaps are identified, we will endeavour to cover these with volunteers. Where there are no volunteers, we will rota pharmacies to open. Where there is an over provision of volunteers, **Payment will only be made to contractors who receive formal confirmation from the CPD Team by email.** Contractors receiving confirmation will be reimbursed for all agreed slots covered at the rate of £244.75 per hour. NHS24 and the Out of Hours Service will be notified of service provision.

### PLEASE READ: Early Warning System - Analysis



EWS - All HSCPs -July 2022.pdf The Board initiated the Early Warning Cascade on the 13<sup>th</sup> September 2022 regarding the Public Holiday for the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Of the 29 cascade systems, 13 were successful. This represents a 44% success rate. I would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 13 cascades.

On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-

- Last Pharmacy in cascade did not call Master Station;
- Last Pharmacy in the cascade tried repeatedly to get through to the master station and gave up;
- Master Station failed to confirm completion with the CPD Team;
- Locum did not know that the cascade process had to be followed;
- Regular Pharmacist not in, message was not passed onto the next Pharmacy; and
- Unable to get through to the next Pharmacy on the list and gave up.

We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative.

I have attached a further copy of each of the Board's HSCP's systems. Please identify your pharmacy within that document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.



# **REMINDER Prescribing Team Update - Endorsing** Endorsing is the means in which community pharmacies can ensure correct and appropriate payment for items dispensed and services offered to patients. Accurate endorsing is the responsibility of the contractor prior to submission of the form to PSD for payment. There are two ways to endorse – electronically via your PMR and ePharmacy messages and on paper. However, as we move to dominant process of automation and into a paper lite service, electronic endorsing takes precedence and we will shortly come to a point in time where the paper is no longer used for payment purposes. It is therefore vital that all pharmacy team members involved in dispensing process are aware of how to endorse correctly using the electronic system. For many cases, the PMR will automatically endorse and all ePharmacy claims come with quantity and pack size as part of the claim message. This means that it is vital that the pack size selected at labelling corresponds correctly to the pack size being dispensed and will ensure that there is correct remuneration for that pack size. It is also important when endorsing to add any additional endorsements to the claim message as the PMR will not do it automatically. This is particularly important for "specials" or unlicensed medicines. You must electronically endorse the invoice price and claim for any relevant out of pocket or handling charges by adding to the claim message. There is a very helpful endorsing guide to help with all the claims that a CP may need to make and is available here. Community Pharmacy Scotland also have a very helpful section on their website on endorsing that is worth looking at. Please ensure that you are familiar with the processes for correctly endorsing as this may be subject to payment verification checks. In the event that the strength or quantity is changed e.g for a short supply, ensure that the correct item which was dispensed is claimed electronically and endorse with the appropriate PC or PNC as required. Any items dispensed under the SSP protocols have additional endorsing requirements. Key messages on endorsing:

• Electronic endorsing trumps paper – you must ensure that you electronically endorse and matches the paper.	
· Serial prescriptions – only accept electronic endorsing.	
· For items not dispensed or collected, you must endorse the item as NC or ND so as not to be incorrectly paid for an item that was not dispensed.	
· Ensure the correct pack size is added to the message.	
Remember to send your claim message at point of handover or after medication has been supplied to the patient.

# REMINDER **Blood Glucose Meters & Test Strips Formulary Update** Following an update to the NHS GGC Blood Glucose Meter & Strip Formulary there will be a gradual change over the coming months to the new formulary meters and strips for BGM\_Formulary\_20 people with type 2 Diabetes. 22 final.pdf Attached The new formulary strips are **Contour Plus Test Strips** and **Glucofix Tech Sensor**. Glucomen Areo Sensors & CareSens Pro Strips are still on formulary for the combined glucose & ketone meters. The Palmdoc2 meter and strips are an option for those who are visibly impaired; it has a speaking function in English, Bengali, Polish, Urdu and Arabic. There will be a gradual reduction in the use of GlucoRx Nexus strips as patients move to the new meters. Technology has advanced such that the new meters have Bluetooth technology (excl. Palmdoc2) and link easily to apps to support the management of diabetes. The Contour Plus Blue meter allows for a second blood sample to be added to the strip. The Red, Amber & Green indicators advise if blood glucose levels are within range. All connect to Diasend to monitor trends in blood glucose and enable data sharing with diabetes specialists. You may begin to see requests for the new strips coming out initially from clinics. The switch activity in Primary Care will be gradual, with pockets starting from the end of November and running over the first half of 2023. Companies have been asked to ensure quotas do not affect the supply model into community pharmacies. They have assured us they have sufficient stock to support the anticipated growth in demand. REMINDER	Business Continuity Plan (BCP)
	As you will be aware, contingency planning for a range of risks is a key business activity to ensure essential services continue to be provided and maintained in an emergency such as a fire, flood or for example recently - a car going through the front window of a pharmacy. The recent incident provides a timely opportunity to remind community pharmacies that they should have an up-to-date Business Continuity Plan (BCP).
	This should be a relatively simple process for most contractors given the Board conducted an update exercise earlier this year and provided funding for the submission of an up-to-date Plan. In the unlikely event that you have not established a Plan using the most up-to-date template; you will find this <a href="here">here</a> .
	As part of business continuity planning, we have previously asked you to consider a "buddy" system. This "buddy" system would involve discussing with a fellow contractor in the proximity of your pharmacy and within your local community, to identify where you could help and support each other in times of difficulty. Based on what we have seen over the years, it is even more important that a relationship like this is in place to ensure that the continuity of patient care within communities can be maintained wherever possible. Therefore, we kindly ask that a "buddy" pharmacy is written into each of your Business Continuity Plans when preparing for winter this year.

REMINDER	Update from the GGC Diabetes MCN October 2022
	Due to supply problems with the glucagon-like peptide 1 (GLP-1) receptor agonists, dulaglutide and semaglutide, likely to last until the beginning of 2023, the GGC Diabetes MCN advise:
	1.No new patients should be started on injectable semaglutide or dulaglutide until further notice.
	2. Existing patients on injectable semaglutide 1mg weekly can be reduced to one 0.5mg injection weekly until supplies return to normal (expected early 2023). Clinical effectiveness should be monitored, and additional or alternative treatments may need to be considered.
	3. For advice on alternatives for new patients being considered for a GLP-1 receptor agonist, refer to the Department of Health and Social Care Medicines Supply Notifications (MSNs) for dulaglutide and semaglutide and further information below.
	4. If patients are changed to the lower 0.5mg strength (as per the MCN advice) they should <b>continue with 1 injection a week</b> .
	They should <b>not</b> "double up" the 0.5mg injection.
	Please can you ensure that affected patients are aware of this
	Further information
	Semaglutide is also available as a once daily tablet (Rybelsus®). Other parenteral GLP 1 receptor agonists that remain available include exenatide and liraglutide. The GLP-1 receptor agonists differ in dose schedule and tolerability, as well as evidence base for effectiveness and clinical outcomes
	Liraglutide 1.2mg daily would be the first line alternative if semaglutide 0.5 mg weekly becomes unavailable. If previously stopped liraglutide due to intolerance or poor response, consider weekly exenatide (Bydureon) second line.  Liraglutide optimises cardiac and renal protection which is why it is recommended over weekly exenatide or oral semaglutide. (LEADER Clinical Trial evidence)
	Please also note the effect of switching between oral and SC semaglutide cannot easily be predicted because of the high pharmacokinetic variability of oral semaglutide. An oral dose equivalent to 1mg of SC semaglutide has not been established and therefore patients should be titrated according to the guidance below.





REMINDER	Prescribing Team Update - Endorsing
	Endorsing is the means in which community pharmacies can ensure correct and appropriate payment for items dispensed and services offered to patients. Accurate endorsing is the responsibility of the contractor prior to submission of the form to PSD for payment.
	There are two ways to endorse – electronically via your PMR and ePharmacy messages and on paper. However, as we move to dominant process of automation and into a paper lite service, electronic endorsing takes precedence and we will shortly come to a point in time where the paper is no longer used for payment purposes.
	It is therefore vital that all pharmacy team members involved in dispensing process are aware of how to endorse correctly using the electronic system.
	For many cases, the PMR will automatically endorse and all ePharmacy claims come with quantity and pack size as part of the claim message. This means that it is vital that the pack size selected at labelling corresponds correctly to the pack size being dispensed and will ensure that there is correct remuneration for that pack size.

It is also important when endorsing to add any additional endorsements to the claim message as the PMR will not do it automatically. This is particularly important for "specials" or unlicensed medicines. You must electronically endorse the invoice price and claim for any relevant out of pocket or handling charges by adding to the claim message.

There is a very helpful endorsing guide to help with all the claims that a CP may need to make and is available here. Community Pharmacy Scotland also have a very helpful section on their website on endorsing that is worth looking at.

Please ensure that you are familiar with the processes for correctly endorsing as this may be subject to payment verification checks.

In the event that the strength or quantity is changed e.g for a short supply, ensure that the correct item which was dispensed is claimed electronically and endorse with the appropriate PC or PNC as required. Any items dispensed under the SSP protocols have additional endorsing requirements.

Key messages on endorsing:

- Electronic endorsing trumps paper you must ensure that you electronically endorse and matches the paper.
- · Serial prescriptions only accept electronic endorsing.
- · For items not dispensed or collected, you must endorse the item as NC or ND so as not to be incorrectly paid for an item that was not dispensed.
- · Ensure the correct pack size is added to the message.
- Remember to send your claim message at point of handover or after medication has been supplied to the patient.
