

REMINDER	F.A.O. All Pharmacies currently providing ARV/HIV Medication
	The NEO module has now been live for nearly a year.
	We have undertaken a rolling audit for services provided by those community pharmacies for current patients and this continues to show that usage of the module is low.
	All pharmacies who currently have patients, and who are not recording information on NEO have been contacted individually. The Pharmacy Champions will also raise this with the pharmacies in their next round of visits (December 2022 – February 2023).

You should note, that as previously notified from January 2023 the NEO module will be the sole generator for payments. No payments will be made for services provided during January 2023 and beyond unless these are claimed via the ARV module on NEO.
The module is an important tool, allowing the Hospital Pharmacy Team to monitor patient compliance and react to missed doses.
If you are currently providing service to an ARV patient, and have not started using the module, I would urge you to do so. A copy of the User Manual can be found here: NHS Community Pharmacy Website (scot.nhs.uk).



REMINDER	Medicine Shortages
	There are multiple different factors when medicine shortages occur these can include manufacturing issues, raw material issues, and distribution issues. Medicine shortages and supply issues unfortunately seem to be increasing in frequency with various factors influencing this. Quotas are being used more frequently at wholesaler level and Pharmacies are often unaware these have been set.
	There is sometimes, although not always, advice issued from the MHRA or Scottish Government or both. These are called MSN (MHRA) or MSAN's (Scottish Government) these provide information relating to the shortage and the estimated recovery date if known. There may also be a Serious Shortage Protocol (SSP) issued with specific advice for Community Pharmacy. These communications are shared locally via the Community Pharmacy Development Team newsletter.
	Where items are in short supply, out of stock or only available above tariff cost, this can be reported by the contractor via the Community Pharmacy Scotland shortage reporter (CPS Members Area shortages). This report, along with other information, is used to influence any potential tariff concessions at a national level. The Health Board cannot influence these discussions and would encourage all CPs to report issues to CPS to ensure as much information is available as possible.
	When a shortage is in effect, we would encourage pharmacies to try all wholesalers available to them; check for all strengths, pack sizes and presentations including branded prior to asking the prescriber for an alternative.
	The Health Board endeavour to take a proactive approach with shortages, or short supply medication and community pharmacy teams can report potential shortages to us via their clinical mailbox or NHS.scot account to the prescribing team inbox, prescribing@ggc.scot.nhs.uk we can then assess potential for disruption and may follow up with suppliers. We cannot do this for all shortages, however.

CMO - Seasonal Influenza - Use of A	Please find attached recent intelligence provided by Public Health Scotland (PHS) of increases in laboratory-confirmed influenza incidence and test swab positivity in general practices (GPs), which now suggests sustained community-level influenza transmission in Scotland. This may lead to an increase in numbers of people presenting at GPs with influenza-like illness who are likely to be infected with the influenza virus.
	As a result GP's have been advised that Tamiflu and Relenza can now be prescribed to treat influenza where clinically indicated.
	Please be aware of this within the community, in readiness for any prescription which may be presented within your pharmacies.

	Please ensure that sales of this product are monitored and multiple purchases, and increased frequency of request from patients are managed in a patient centred manner to help and support when required.

PLEASE READ: Early Warning System - Analysis

The Board initiated the Early Warning System (EWS) Cascade on the 21st October 2022 relating to a Class 1 Drug Alert.

Of the 29 cascade systems, 7 were successful. This represents a 24% success rate. Please note, this is a 20% decrease in the EWS which took place in September 2022. I would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 7 cascades.

On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-

- Last pharmacy in cascade unable to get through to the Master Station;
- Master Station failed to confirm completion with the CPD Team;
- Pharmacy using an old list:
- Trainee Pharmacist did not know that the cascade process had to be followed;
- Pharmacy thought this was a cascade relevant only to their pharmacy chain and didn't follow the CPDT EWS process; and
- Unable to get through to the next Pharmacy on the list and forgot about cascade.

We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however, the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative.

I have attached a further copy of each of the Board's HSCP's systems. Please identify your pharmacy within that document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.

NES Pharmacy: Prescribing Database



You will be familiar with our annual data collection processes for the NES prescriber database. These data are used to build the annual Prescribing Report and influences education developments and workforce planning. We appreciate this can be a significant piece of administration and thank you for your efforts in previous years. We are pleased to advise that we have developed Turas to allow prescribers to view and update their data themselves. We are communicating directly with pharmacist prescribers to announce our new process, where they are required to update their own data by the end of November. We hope this will have a positive impact on workload for your teams.

For this to be successful we would appreciate your support and your views on encouraging prescribers to log onto TURAS and complete this activity before 16th December.

	As you will be aware the CP network receives prescriptions via e-mail from numerous NHS Teams in advance of the "hard copy" prescription being sent by Royal Mail.
	We have previously communicated to the network that patients should be supplied on the basis of the e-mailed request rather than waiting for the paper copy of the prescription to reach you before supplying.
	We are aware of further impending postal strikes which may add delay to Community Pharmacies receiving prescriptions from OOH and specialist services e.g Hep C, HIV etc.
	In light of this, we are reiterating our expectation that CPs support patients by supplying medicines at the point of the request being made. The CPD Team will support with any prescriptions that fail to reach you taking into consideration these prolonged delays.

ACTION Interim Guidance Antibiotic Management of Group A Streptococcus MEMORANDUM GGC Interim guidance - Antibioit To: Acute Care Clinicians, GP practices, Community Pharmacies From: NHSGGC Pharmacy Services Date: 7th December 2022 <u>Backgroun</u>d There is an unusually high number of children with suspected or confirmed GAS infections presenting to primary, secondary and unscheduled care settings across NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde. This has placed pressure on the medication supply chain across the UK which is being proactively managed by a national and agencies. However, there are shortages being noted across NHSGGC at this time. **Interim Local Guidance** The attached interim guidance has been produced to inform local clinicians and dispensing pharmacists on how to proactively deal with the issue. It will be updated when national advice becomes available. The quidance has been developed by the NHSGGC Paediatric Antimicrobial Management Team and Pharmacy Services informed by knowledge of local and national epidemiology and resistance patterns. It has been approved by the Deputy Medical Directors. General principles: Encourage use of solid oral dosage formulations in older children Product selection for each drug should follow the priority lists based on age/weight and dosage administered. Switch to the most appropriate product where available. If not available, switch to an alternative product of the same drug.

- Where the drug is not available, any of the drugs contained within the guidance can be substituted. Follow the priority list for formulation as shown.
- **Caution in penicillin allergy use clarithromycin/erythromycin**

Prescribing / Dispensing in Community Settings



REMINDER	Medicine Shortages
	There are multiple different factors when medicine shortages occur these can include manufacturing issues, raw material issues, and distribution issues. Medicine shortages and supply issues unfortunately seem to be increasing in frequency with various factors influencing this. Quotas are being used more frequently at wholesaler level and Pharmacies are often unaware these have been set.
	There is sometimes, although not always, advice issued from the MHRA or Scottish Government or both. These are called MSN (MHRA) or MSAN's (Scottish Government) these provide information relating to the shortage and the estimated recovery date if known. There may also be a Serious Shortage Protocol (SSP) issued with specific advice for Community Pharmacy. These communications are shared locally via the Community Pharmacy Development Team newsletter.
	Where items are in short supply, out of stock or only available above tariff cost, this can be reported by the contractor via the Community Pharmacy Scotland shortage reporter (CPS Members Area shortages). This report, along with other information, is used to influence any potential tariff concessions at a national level. The Health Board cannot influence these discussions and would encourage all CPs to report issues to CPS to ensure as much information is available as possible.
	When a shortage is in effect, we would encourage pharmacies to try all wholesalers available to them; check for all strengths, pack sizes and presentations including branded prior to asking the prescriber for an alternative.
	The Health Board endeavour to take a proactive approach with shortages, or short supply medication and community pharmacy teams can report potential shortages to us via their clinical mailbox or NHS.scot account to the prescribing team inbox, prescribing@ggc.scot.nhs.uk we can then assess potential for disruption and may follow up with suppliers. We cannot do this for all shortages, however.

Background

There is an unusually high number of children with suspected or confirmed GAS infections presenting to primary, secondary and unscheduled care settings across NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde. This has placed pressure on the medication supply chain across the UK which is being proactively managed by a national and government agencies. However, there are shortages being noted across NHSGGC at this time.

Interim Local Guidance

The attached interim guidance has been produced to inform local clinicians and dispensing pharmacists on how to proactively deal with the issue. It will be updated when national advice becomes available. The guidance has been developed by the NHSGGC Paediatric Antimicrobial Management Team and Pharmacy Services informed by knowledge of local and national epidemiology and resistance patterns. It has been approved by the Deputy Medical Directors.

General principles:

- Encourage use of solid oral dosage formulations in older children
- Product selection for each drug should follow the priority lists based on age/weight and dosage administered.
- Switch to the most appropriate product where available. If not available, switch to an alternative product of the same drug.
- Where the drug is not available, any of the drugs contained within the guidance can be substituted. Follow the priority list for formulation as shown.
- **Caution in penicillin allergy use clarithromycin/erythromycin**



	Several months ago, we asked the community pharmacy network to give us their views on the last 12 months of the Communications Update.
	We received 26 responses (thank you so much to those who took the time to complete the survey and provide valuable feedback). The majority of the responses were positive and confirmed that the process continues to work well.
	There were constructive critical comments as well and we thought it would be useful to provide you with information on how we intend to respond to the suggestions made

FRQUENCY/FORMAT – the majority of responses indicated that the frequency was "Just Right" – 77% - however 23% of respondents felt that the frequency was too often, with comments citing frustration at the repetitive nature of the Thursday edition.

Response: We will retain the twice weekly format as we know that some pharmacists miss information when it first appears in the Tuesday edition. We will however reduce the retention of information in the Thursday edition from four weeks to two weeks (unless the articular has a cut-off date e.g. for training or submission of a PGD). This will serve to reduce duplication.

INDEX – An equal percentage of respondents were aware of the Communications Update Index and Archive, and never knew these resources existed. Of those who were aware of the Index, the majority had used the resource, and had found it useful.

Response: The link to the Communications Update Index and back copies of each Update will be added to the end of the Update.

SPECIFIC ISSUES RAISED: – Specific comments were made around Drug Alerts, with some pharmacists preferring these to be sent separately so that the notification could be used for the GPhC Inspector Service.

Response: From 4th January 2023, we will send all Drug Alerts as separate notifications.

Several respondents felt it would be useful for there to be an Index on each Update showing what items were in each edition.

Interim Guidance Antibiotic Management of Group A Streptococcus **REMINDER MEMORANDUM GGC** Interim To: Acute Care Clinicians, GP practices, Community Pharmacies quidance - Antibioit From: NHSGGC Pharmacy Services Date: 7th December 2022 **Background** There is an unusually high number of children with suspected or confirmed GAS infections presenting to primary, secondary and unscheduled care settings across NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde. This has placed pressure on the medication supply chain across the UK which is being proactively managed by a national and government agencies. However, there are shortages being noted across NHSGGC at this time. **Interim Local Guidance** The attached interim guidance has been produced to inform local clinicians and dispensing pharmacists on how to proactively deal with the issue. It will be updated when national advice becomes available. The quidance has been developed by the NHSGGC Paediatric Antimicrobial Management Team and Pharmacy Services informed by knowledge of local and national epidemiology and resistance patterns. It has been approved by the Deputy Medical Directors. **General principles:** Encourage use of solid oral dosage formulations in older children and dosage administered. Switch to the most appropriate product where available. If not available, switch to an

- Product selection for each drug should follow the priority lists based on age/weight
- alternative product of the same drug.
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Please note: The memorandum states that pharmacies are permitted to offer an alternative formulation and/or drug where the prescribed medication cannot be supplied.

REMINDER	Medicine Shortages
	There are multiple different factors when medicine shortages occur these can include manufacturing issues, raw material issues, and distribution issues. Medicine shortages and supply issues unfortunately seem to be increasing in frequency with various factors influencing this. Quotas are being used more frequently at wholesaler level and Pharmacies are often unaware these have been set.
	There is sometimes, although not always, advice issued from the MHRA or Scottish Government or both. These are called MSN (MHRA) or MSAN's (Scottish Government) these provide information relating to the shortage and the estimated recovery date if known. There may also be a Serious Shortage Protocol (SSP) issued with specific advice for Community Pharmacy. These communications are shared locally via the Community Pharmacy Development Team newsletter.
	Where items are in short supply, out of stock or only available above tariff cost, this can be reported by the contractor via the Community Pharmacy Scotland shortage reporter (CPS Members Area shortages). This report, along with other information, is used to influence any potential tariff concessions at a national level. The Health Board cannot influence these discussions and would encourage all CPs to report issues to CPS to ensure as much information is available as possible.
	When a shortage is in effect, we would encourage pharmacies to try all wholesalers available to them; check for all strengths, pack sizes and presentations including branded prior to asking the prescriber for an alternative.
	The Health Board endeavour to take a proactive approach with shortages, or short supply medication and community pharmacy teams can report potential shortages to us via their clinical mailbox or NHS.scot account to the prescribing team inbox, prescribing@ggc.scot.nhs.uk we can then assess potential for disruption and may follow up with suppliers. We cannot do this for all shortages, however.

UPDATED GUIDANCE - SUPPLY OF ANTIBIOTICS - 20/12/2022

You will be aware of the NHSGGC guidance that was issued last week to suggest alternative treatment if penicillin V is unavailable. The preferred order of replacement products is clearly defined in the NHSGGC Guidance. GGC Interim guidance-Antibiotics in GAS V10

Serious Shortages Protocols (see attached PCA's) have now been issued that allows community pharmacists to substitute an alternative formulation of penicillin V or an alternative antibiotic if all formulations are unavailable. Attached Please ensure that the allergy status of the patient is checked in relation to any

medication that is being considered.

Prescribers have been asked to include the following phrase as part of the dosage instructions in the antibiotic prescription - "**if unavailable substitute as per local Group A Strep guidance**". This will provide authorisation for the pharmacist to use their clinical judgement to provide an alternative antibiotic within NHSGGC guidance.


The endorsement "PC" should be used on the prescription when substituting to a product in the guidance document. This will ensure that you are paid appropriately for what has been supplied and that the instruction on the prescription has been followed.

ACTION	ARV Module on NEO
	As you will be aware, the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPDT) undertake a rolling- monthly audit of the ARV module on the NEO platform, which includes measuring completion of information and submission of claims.
	The Audit continues to show that usage is relatively low in comparison to other modules on the platform i.e. OST and Disulfiram. In addition, we are experiencing a disproportionate level of information being input retrospectively (sometimes weeks after the event). Please see message from Dr Erica Peters (Consultant Physician), Infection Diseases:
	There has been an outbreak of HIV in Glasgow in recent years. A key part of care for those infected is HIV antiretroviral treatment (ARV). If a person infected with HIV takes their medication daily without a break or missed doses they can expect to have a normal life expectancy. It has a better prognosis now than many other common illnesses if treated. Further, if HIV is controlled by good compliance with medication then the chances of passing it on to others can be reduced significantly. Indeed there is good data showing that sexual transmission does not occur if the patient's blood is undetectable as a result of good HIV compliance, referred to as U=U.
	We have a dedicated team of doctors, nurses and pharmacists looking after the patients in GG&C infected with HIV and we work very hard to support them, particularly in times of need or crisis. Missing doses of HIV medication needs to be acted on quickly and within the same week. This can have significant health implications for the patient, cause future resistance to future medications and increase the chance of transmission to others. It can also indicate that there are other health or social issues that are behind the patient's inability to attend the community pharmacy.

By completing NEO for ARV on the same day you are supporting the care of the individual patient in the most important of ways. This system of using community pharmacies to support the management of HIV care has been recognised as a gold standard across the world and has been shown to be a significant factor in outbreak management. As the clinical lead for the care of these individuals I would encourage you to continue to complete the ARV functions on NEO every day. And on behalf of our patients thanks so much for your efforts in supporting their care.

You should also note, that as previously notified from January 2023 the NEO module will be the sole generator for payments. No payments will be made for services provided during January 2023 and beyond unless these are claimed via the ARV module on NEO.

The Community Pharmacy Champions have been given a list of community pharmacies who are currently supporting patients and who aren't currently using the module. They will make direct contact in the next few months to support anyone who continues to struggle. In the meantime, if you require any direct input please contact Michelle Cooper on 0141-201-6041.

Early Warning System (EWS) Cascade



The Board initiated the Early Warning System (EWS) Cascade on the 8th December 2022 relating to urgent information for Strep A antibiotics.

Attached

Of the 29 cascade systems, 19 were successful. This represents a 65% success rate. Please note, this is a 41% increase in the EWS which took place in October 2022. I would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 19 cascades.

On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-

- Unable to get through to the Master Station;
- Pharmacy thought this was a cascade relevant only to their pharmacy chain and didn't follow the CPDT EWS process; and
- Continued to the next pharmacy on the list after being unable to contact the initial pharmacy.

We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however, the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative.

I have attached a further copy of each of the Board's HSCP's systems. Please identify your pharmacy within that document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.



UPDATED GUIDANCE - SUPPLY OF ANTIBIOTICS - 21/12/2022

You will be aware of the NHSGGC guidance that was issued last week to suggest alternative treatment if penicillin V is unavailable. The preferred order of replacement products is clearly defined in the NHSGGC Guidance. GGC Interim guidance-Antibiotics in GAS V10

Serious Shortages Protocols (see attached PCA's) have now been issued that allows community pharmacists to substitute an alternative formulation of penicillin V or an alternative antibiotic if all formulations are unavailable. 
Please ensure that the allergy status of the patient is checked in relation to any medication that is being considered.

Prescribers have been asked to include the following phrase as part of the dosage instructions in the antibiotic prescription - "**if unavailable substitute as per local Group A Strep guidance**". This will provide authorisation for the pharmacist to use their clinical judgement to provide an alternative antibiotic within NHSGGC guidance.

The endorsement "PC" should be used on the prescription when substituting to a product in the guidance document. This will ensure that you are paid appropriately for what has been supplied and that the instruction on the prescription has been followed.

REMINDER	ARV Module on NEO
	As you will be aware, the Community Pharmacy Development Team (CPDT) undertake a rolling- monthly audit of the ARV module on the NEO platform, which includes measuring completion of information and submission of claims.
	The Audit continues to show that usage is relatively low in comparison to other modules on the platform i.e. OST and Disulfiram. In addition, we are experiencing a disproportionate level of information being input retrospectively (sometimes weeks after the event). Please see message from Dr Erica Peters (Consultant Physician), Infection Diseases:

There has been an outbreak of HIV in Glasgow in recent years. A key part of care for those infected is HIV antiretroviral treatment (ARV). If a person infected with HIV takes their medication daily without a break or missed doses they can expect to have a normal life expectancy. It has a better prognosis now than many other common illnesses if treated. Further, if HIV is controlled by good compliance with medication then the chances of passing it on to others can be reduced significantly. Indeed there is good data showing that sexual transmission does not occur if the patient's blood is undetectable as a result of good HIV compliance, referred to as U=U.

We have a dedicated team of doctors, nurses and pharmacists looking after the patients in GG&C infected with HIV and we work very hard to support them, particularly in times of need or crisis. Missing doses of HIV medication needs to be acted on quickly and within the same week. This can have significant health implications for the patient, cause future resistance to future medications and increase the chance of transmission to others. It can also indicate that there are other health or social issues that are behind the patient's inability to attend the community pharmacy.

By completing NEO for ARV on the same day you are supporting the care of the individual patient in the most important of ways. This system of using community pharmacies to support the management of HIV care has been recognised as a gold standard across the world and has been shown to be a significant factor in outbreak management. As the clinical lead for the care of these individuals I would encourage you to continue to complete the ARV functions on NEO every day. And on behalf of our patients thanks so much for your efforts in supporting their care.

You should also note, that as previously notified from January 2023 the NEO module will be the sole generator for payments. No payments will be made for services provided during January 2023 and beyond unless these are claimed via the ARV module on NEO.

If you have not already done so, please access the module and begin inputting information for your patient/s with immediate effect. A copy of the User Manual can be found here: NHS Community Pharmacy Website (scot.nhs.uk)

The Community Pharmacy Champions have been given a list of community pharmacies who are currently supporting patients and who aren't currently using the module. Early Warning System (EWS) Cascade



The Board initiated the Early Warning System (EWS) Cascade on the 8th December 2022 relating to urgent information for Strep A antibiotics.

Of the 29 cascade systems, 19 were successful. This represents a 65% success rate. Please note, this is a 41% increase in the EWS which took place in October 2022. I would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 19 cascades.

On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-

- Unable to get through to the Master Station;
- Pharmacy thought this was a cascade relevant only to their pharmacy chain and didn't follow the CPDT EWS process; and
- Continued to the next pharmacy on the list after being unable to contact the initial pharmacy.

We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however, the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative.
I have attached a further copy of each of the Board's HSCP's systems. Please identify your pharmacy within that document and print off the relevant cascade. I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It might therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.

	Updated information regarding individuals NHS email addresses – please see highlighted section in red below.
	We have, on a number of occasions, over the last few years advised you that GDPR protocols have been breached because of the way that pharmacies have been sending patient identifiable information into Pharmacy Services in order to obtain authorisation for a Specials request.
	In 2021, this happened 81 times and so far in 2022 it has happened 55 times. These breaches were due to information being submitted on-

- 1. a personal email address e.g. gmail, hotmail etc;
- 2. an individual pharmacy business email address; and
- 3. an image supplied as a photograph taken on an individuals personal mobile device sent through their NHS email address e.g. joe.bloggs@nhs.scot

For clarity

- Any nhs.scot email is secure and should be used to scan or transfer patient identifiable information - these routes have end to end encryption that protects the patient information;
- Company/Personal emails should not be used email from either of these which are then forwarded using nhs.scot should not be used;
- Photos should not be sent at all regardless of email used; and
- Scanned images may be acceptable if they come from a proper scanner and sent via nhs.scot

Please ensure that all staff within the pharmacy are briefed on this important GDPR information including Relief and Locum Pharmacists.
