Stat of the week....

In December 2022, **817** females with UTI'S were seen in our 99 community pharmacies. This was the highest number ever recorded in a single month.

703 were treated under PGD, **157** were referred to another professional and **17** given advice only.

Please ensure you have read, signed and returned the latest version of the PGD where the upper age limit of 65 and exclusion criteria of haematuria have been removed.

7 Day prescription turnaround

You may have been made aware of a communication sent to GP practices outlining plans to align all of Ayrshire and Arran Pharmacies and GP's to a 7 day timescale for patients to wait between ordering and collecting repeat prescriptions. This is something that has been agreed between the committees representing Community Pharmacy and GP contractors.

The communication on this at the moment has been paused to allow time for more robust communications to be prepared and we can assure you that you will be properly informed in due course. Apologies if the message caught anyone by surprise and we would like to assure you that this was requested to reduce pressures felt in some areas of community pharmacy and primary care.
