Serial Prescriptions

Transferring suitable patients on to serial prescriptions remains a priority in Ayrshire and Arran and your primary care pharmacy colleagues are actively working towards the target of having 40% of patients who are on repeat medicines receiving serial prescriptions.

Currently 16.9% of all A&A patients on repeat medicines are receiving serial prescriptions and our community pharmacy with the highest percentage dispense 80% of their total items on serial prescriptions.

Boots – Burns Mall (Kilmarnock)

The pharmacist in Boots received a telephone call from a regular patient in distress after taking a deliberate overdose in an attempt to end their own life.

Their calm, professional and caring attitude of meant that a prompt 999 call was made from the pharmacy and NHS services were able to help the patient who is now recovering.

Well done and thank you to the team in Boots an intervention that saved the life of one of our Ayrshire and Arran citizens.
