Officer


How long have you worked in NHS AA? I worked in NHS AA from 1993 to 2013, then worked for Ayrshire Hospice for 8 years before returning to NHS AA in December 2021 to take up the post of CD Inspection Officer.

What roles have you previously held? I started as a Student Pharmacy Technician at Ayr Hospital in 1993 gaining experience in all areas of hospital pharmacy. I progressed to Senior Pharmacy Technician and completed my accuracy checking qualification. I have worked as a Senior Technician in Medicines Information, Distribution/Issues, Dispensary and ward based Medicines Redesign teams. In 2013, I moved to the Ayrshire Hospice and worked there until end of 2021 as Palliative Care Technician working with the multi-disciplinary team.

What's the best bit of your job? I have now been in post for just over a year and I love the variety of my job. I am out and about and meet a lot of different people.
