Community Learnpro Registration Walkthrc	Do you have a fridge used for medicines or vaccines in your pharmacy? We strongly encourage completion of the cold chain module now available on LearnPro in conjunction with Pharmacy Public Health. Ideally by all staff but especially those tasked with checking fridge temperatures regularly. Fridge lines can be extremely expensive and additionally as thermolabile products, incorrect storage can result in treatment failure. Robust cold chain storage is paramount to ensure the patients given vaccines are protected from the illness they are being vaccinated against. The module could form part of a small project for a trainee in quality assurance of refrigerated medicines. GGC: 097 Cold Chain Management is the name of the module.

	Please identify your pharmacy and print off the relevant cascade.						
	I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including Locums, know and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to message. It may therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.						
	As a reminder, this cascade system can be started by either a Board Officer or any Community Pharmacist. Anyone initiating the system should telephone the 'Master Station' clearly relaying the message that is required for circulation. The 'Master Station' will start the cascade of calls by telephoning the next pharmacy on the list, who will in turn, telephone the next pharmacy and so forth until the last pharmacy calls the 'Master Station'. When the 'Master Station' receives the call from the last pharmacy in the cascade, it should contact the person who initiated the cascade thus completing the cycle.						
	It is essential that pharmacies follow this cascade in the specified order to ensure that all pharmacies receive the message and that the communication is successfully exchanged throughout each HSCP System. Closed pharmacies should be by-passed however; it would be helpful to telephone them with the message once they re-open. In these instances, please advise us that you have already passed on the message to the pharmacy they were expected to contact, which will stop unnecessary calls.

Action For How to use your Pharmaceutical waste Attached	<ul> <li>The Board currently operates a single service for the collection and uplift of patients' returned pharmaceutical waste from Community Pharmacies.</li> <li>Pharmaceutical Waste is picked up from community pharmacies either every three months or every two months (only available after agreement with CPDT), however, where an AD HOC uplift (an additional uplift outwith the agreed schedule) is required for any reason, the Pharmacist (or their representative) <u>must</u> contact the Community Pharmacy Development Team via email to make arrangements: ggc.cpdevteam@nhs.scot</li> <li>Our Team will agree a collection date with the waste Contractors and inform the pharmacy of this date.</li> <li>The Pharmacy will be responsible for ensuring the following: <ul> <li>All waste is securely packed, identified, and in a secure location;</li> <li><u>NO</u> cardboard, or paper is added to the bins, unless it is out of date patient returned medication.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The attached document contains a list of what should and what should not be put into the pharmaceutical waste bins, please print and display as reference for all.</li> <li>Any questions regarding collection schedules, AD HOC requests, or any other waste queries, must be passed on to the CPDEV Team mailbox. <u>ggc.cpdevteam@nhs.scot</u></li> </ul>

	Nicorette QuickMist Mouthspray Trial- Quit Your Way specialist services
	Available to smoking cessation clients from QYW <b>specialist</b> services until the end of <b>March 2023.</b>

With varenicline and bupropion currently unavailable, the options for products for smoking cessation attempts are limited. To expand the options QYW community and acute services will be offering their clients Nicorette QuickMist mouthspray as an option. This may be as a second product with a patch in dual-NRT, or as a single NRT product.
If you receive a product recommendation request for Nicorette Quickmist spray, and it is appropriate for your client, you can prescribe it without needing to check with the QYW pharmacy team.
At the moment this is targeted for clients from the QYW specialist services, but this will be reviewed.
First line products in NHSGGC remain Nicotinell patches, lozenges, gum and Niquitin mini lozenges.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION	Dexcom One Real-Time Continuous Glucose Monitoring System
	<b>Dexcom One real-time CGM system</b> has been added to the NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde Blood Glucose Monitoring formulary as an alternative continuous glucose monitoring system for patients who may not have been able to use or tolerate the Freestyle Libre system. Patients will need to be assessed for eligibility by specialist Diabetes teams.
	We recommend that patients be given 9 sensors at a time, which would require a repeat prescription (3 boxes) every three months. Patients will require a new transmitter which works alongside the sensors every three months. This free of charge item is not currently available on GP10 but has to be ordered via Alliance through their community pharmacy. When Dexcom One sensors are added to the patient's prescription we recommend the following text should be added to the dosage instructions to alert the community pharmacy team of the requirement to order the transmitter:
	'Replace sensor every 10 days. This is a 3-month supply. Important - Free of charge transmitter must be ordered along with this prescription (ALLIANCE PIP 421-4730)'
	Faulty sensors should be replaced by the manufacturer (Dexcom) <b>The patient should obtain one free of charge via the tech support online portal</b> <u>Dexcom Support</u> <u>Portal</u> <b>or directly from Dexcom (0800 031 5763).</b> These should not be requested via <b>prescription.</b> Patients should only require 36 sensors per year. If patients request higher numbers, this should prompt a conversation with the patient
	Further information:
	<b>Dexcom One</b> is a real-time continuous glucose monitoring technology which provides glucose results without requiring a finger prick. The system comprises an adhesive sensor (worn for 10 days at a time), a transmitter which lasts for 90 days, and a hand-held receiver or smart phone app. Blood glucose results are transmitted automatically to the receiver and/or app via Bluetooth technology. Eligible patients will be provided with a starter pack with one sensor (which lasts 10 days) at their clinic. After that, sensors will need to be issued on prescription.
	Diabetes teams will continue to monitor that patients are using the system appropriately and reflecting on glucose data to make appropriate treatment adjustments.
	If the patient had previously been prescribed Freestyle Libre2, this will be removed from the patient's repeat prescription.
	Patients will still need a supply of blood glucose monitoring strips, but in most cases their total strip consumption should reduce. Current DVLA requirements for driving state that flash and real-time glucose monitoring readings are acceptable only for category 1 licence holders (car and motorcycle) but drivers must also test a finger prick glucose if they have symptoms of hypoglycaemia, or the Dexcom One reading is below 4 mmol/L. <b>Dexcom One</b> readings are not accepted by the DVLA for category 2 (HGV and PSV) licence holders and these drivers must continue to provide evidence of finger prick glucose checks every 2 hours when driving.
	Blood glucose test strips should be supplied as recommended by the secondary care Diabetes teams in accordance with the 2022 NHS GG&C Blood Glucose & Ketone Meter formulary for use in adults.

URGENT ACTION	Pharmacy Opening Hours for Public Holidays 2023
Public Holidays iProforma 2023.pdf	The public holidays for 2023/24 have now been agreed by the NHS GGC Area Partnership Forum and CP GGC, with the exception of The Kings Coronation on 8th May 2023. We are relatively certain that the 8th May 2023 will included for contractors and will advise you when the final decision has been made. A list has previously been circulated in the Communications Update and can also be found on our website at:
	https://www.communitypharmacy.scot.nhs.uk/nhs-boards/nhs-greater-glasgow- clyde/public-holidays/
	This will now allow the Board to develop their scheme to ensure that pharmaceutical services are available within its area at all reasonable times. As you will be aware, part of this process involves the collation, and publication of pharmaceutical services available during public holidays.
	Over the last two years we have consolidated this exercise and sought information from contractors for all public holidays up to and including the September Weekend. This exercise has worked relatively well, given that the provision of services over public holidays is relatively static with the majority of contractors having a consistent approach to opening/closing.
	Due to the relatively consistent approach the CP network has to opening on Public Holidays, we will continue to set the default position for all community pharmacies as being closed on all public holidays (up to and including September weekend). As such, you will only need to complete the attached pro-forma if you intend to OPEN on any of the holidays. Please return by 10th March 2023.
	Hopefully, this will reduce the workload for pharmacies.

REMINDER	Dexcom One Real-Time Continuous Glucose Monitoring System
	<b>Dexcom One real-time CGM system</b> has been added to the NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde Blood Glucose Monitoring formulary as an alternative continuous glucose monitoring system for patients who may not have been able to use or tolerate the Freestyle Libre system. Patients will need to be assessed for eligibility by specialist Diabetes teams.
	We recommend that patients be given 9 sensors at a time, which would require a repeat prescription (3 boxes) every three months. Patients will require a new transmitter which works alongside the sensors every three months. This free of charge item is not currently available on GP10 but has to be ordered via Alliance through their community pharmacy. When Dexcom One sensors are added to the patient's prescription we recommend the following text should be added to the dosage instructions to alert the community pharmacy team of the requirement to order the transmitter:
	'Replace sensor every 10 days. This is a 3-month supply. Important - Free of charge transmitter must be ordered along with this prescription (ALLIANCE PIP 421-4730)'
	Faulty sensors should be replaced by the manufacturer (Dexcom) The patient should obtain one free of charge via the tech support online portal Dexcom Support Portal or directly from Dexcom (0800 031 5763). These should not be requested via prescription. Patients should only require 36 sensors per year. If patients request higher numbers, this should prompt a conversation with the patient
	Further information:
	<b>Dexcom One</b> is a real-time continuous glucose monitoring technology which provides glucose results without requiring a finger prick. The system comprises an adhesive sensor (worn for 10 days at a time), a transmitter which lasts for 90 days, and a hand-held receiver

or smart phone app. Blood glucose results are transmitted automatically to the receiver and/or app via Bluetooth technology. Eligible patients will be provided with a starter pack with one sensor (which lasts 10 days) at their clinic. After that, sensors will need to be issued on prescription.

Diabetes teams will continue to monitor that patients are using the system appropriately and reflecting on glucose data to make appropriate treatment adjustments.

If the patient had previously been prescribed Freestyle Libre2, this will be removed from the patient's repeat prescription.

Patients will still need a supply of blood glucose monitoring strips, but in most cases their total strip consumption should reduce. Current DVLA requirements for driving state that flash and real-time glucose monitoring readings are acceptable only for category 1 licence holders (car and motorcycle) but drivers must also test a finger prick glucose if they have symptoms of hypoglycaemia, or the Dexcom One reading is below 4 mmol/L. **Dexcom One** readings are not accepted by the DVLA for category 2 (HGV and PSV) licence holders and these drivers must continue to provide evidence of finger prick glucose checks every 2 hours when driving.

Blood glucose test strips should be supplied as recommended by the secondary care Diabetes teams in accordance with the 2022 NHS GG&C Blood Glucose & Ketone Meter formulary for use in adults.
