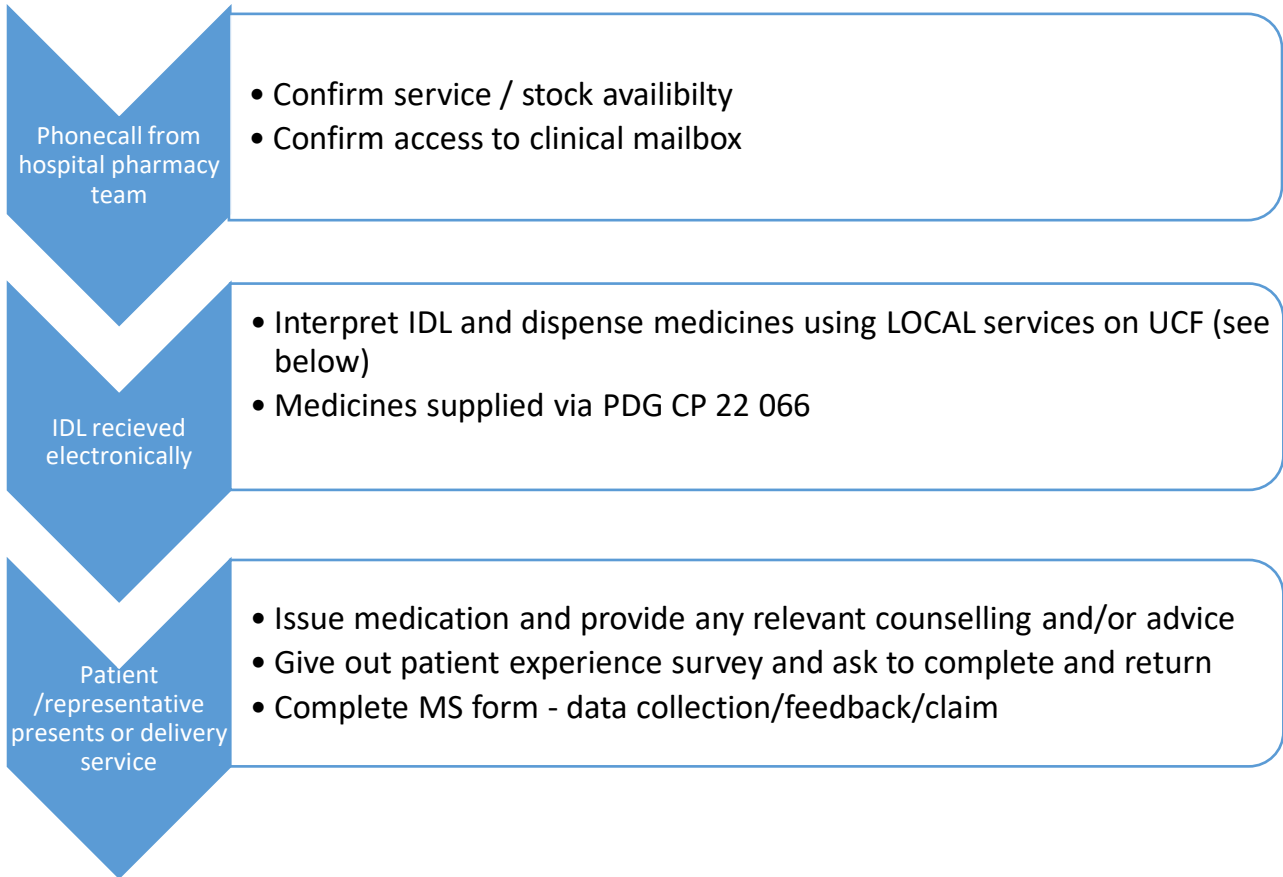

This is what would be supplied from community pharmacy via PGD and UCF.

For this EXAMPLE the following would therefore be supplied:

- 41 x Dalteparin 5000 units on 0.2ml prefilled syringes. It be injected ONCE daily at 6pm.
- 100 x Dihydrocodeine 30mg tablets. ONE four times a day when required for pain. (NB IDL says supply 1 x OP)
- 20 x Flucloxacillin 500mg caps. ONE four times a day for five days.
- 500ml x Lactulose solution. 10ml TWICE daily. Exact quantity would be 560ml which would also be OK.
- 100 x Paracetamol 500mg tablets. TWO four times a day when required for pain (NB IDL says supply 1 x OP)

This is a list of the other drugs that a patient is on that don't need issued at this time. You may (as you would normally) discuss other medicines with the patient and help them to arrange repeat supplies etc if required. If an urgent supply of regular medicines was required, this should be done in the usual manner via the urgent care PGD.
