REMINDER	ATTEMPTED FRAUD
•	We are asking community pharmacy colleagues to be vigilant to approaches being made to patients, via phone call to elicit bank details. These attempts are made by an individual who claims to be contacting the patient on behalf of their community pharmacy, in relation to a delivery of medication. The individual has the patient's name and address, and asks the patient to provide their bank details.
	Community pharmacies might want to consider reassuring their patients, that they will never phone and ask for their bank details. If a patient is in any doubt as to the veracity of contact on behalf of their community pharmacy, that they hang up and phone the pharmacy to confirm. 24/04/2023

REMINDER	The Use of the Unscheduled Care PGD for Care Home Residents
•	Questions have been raised recently about confusion over the use of the Unscheduled Care PGD specifically for medicines supply within Care Homes. As a result, advice was sought from Community Pharmacy Scotland and NHS24.
	They advised:
	The Unscheduled Care PGD allows Community Pharmacists to undertake the urgent provision of currently prescribed medicines (as listed) to NHS patients (including those who live in a care home).
	Therefore, as it is for urgent supply it could potentially be used when:
	1. Medicines have been refused and are spoiled
	2. Medicines have been spilled, dropped or inadvertently destroyed
	As there is an immediate need.
	In the case where a resident's medicines are no longer in sync (i.e. the current supply will not last until the end of the cycle e.g. due to a hospital admission, commencement mid-cycle) the criteria for the Unscheduled Care PGD are not met. NHS 24 (the authors of the PGD) have advised that it should not be used for this purpose.

In this situation a prescription from their GP is required, this can either be:
1. For the exact amount required to bring the resident's medicines back into sync
2. An additional prescription for a full 28-day supply that the pharmacy can dispense the required amount from – and electronically endorse for the amount supplied.
NB in this situation a script for a full 28-day supply will still be needed for the next cycle, refusal to provide a script (as it appears that it is being requested "early") will perpetuate the problem.

	As of the 1st March Dexcom One transmitters were available on Tariff. As of May, GP system drug dictionaries have been updated and can issue prescriptions for transmitters. Previously these will have been handwritten.
	Patients with a prescription for a three-month supply of sensors should also have a prescription for a transmitter. GP practice teams are making sure this is added to the records of existing patients.

If you receive a prescription for sensors without a transmitter; a prescription for a transmitter should be requested from the GP practice.
Dexcom ONE
One transmitter lasts 3 months.
Please ensure 3 x triple boxes of Dexcom ONE sensors are requested/supplied. (9 sensors)
Check the text on the sensor; it should now read 'Replace sensor every 10 days. This is a 3-month supply.

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

	From Tuesday 16 May 2023, new Scottish Government guidance comes into effect on the use of facemasks and face coverings within health and care settings.
	Due to a number of factors including high vaccinations rates and other mitigations against COVID-19 in the health and social care sector, the recommendation that face masks are worn at all times is being removed. The PPE requirements for standard infection control and transmission based precautions remain in place as per the National Infection Prevention and Control Manual.
	The advice covers all hospitals, health centres, community sectors, primary care facilities and care homes.
	<ul> <li>The key changes to the guidance are:</li> <li>staff providing direct care do not need to routinely wear a face mask at all times during their shift</li> <li>staff in non-direct care roles (e.g. catering, domestic or office staff) do not need to routinely wear a face covering unless advised to so on IPC advice</li> <li>visitors to adult care homes do not need to wear a mask or face covering including in communal areas.</li> </ul>
	Why the guidance has changed Fluid resistance surgical masks (FRSMs) provide protection to the wearer and those around them, and therefore have a purpose within health and social care settings. However, we are in a position now where the extended use of masks and face coverings should be for particular situations and not the default position.
	Although COVID-19 continues to spread, transmission rates are lower and the virus is currently milder than at earlier stages in the pandemic resulting in a reduction in severity of illness and hospitalisation.
	The impact masks and face coverings can have on health and mental wellbeing, along with communication barriers, continues to be weighed against the protection provided against the risk of harm from COVID-19.



	The Board initiated the Early Warning System (EWS) Cascade on the 9th May 2023 relating to a Class 1 Drug Alert - Emerade 500 & 300 MCG solution for injection in pre-filled syringe.
	Of the 29 cascade systems, 18 were successful. This represents a 62% success rate. Please note, this is a 3% decrease in the EWS which took place in December 2022. I would like to thank those contractors who contributed to successfully completing the 18 cascades.
	On further scrutiny, we identified the following reasons for failure:-
	<ul> <li>Last pharmacy in cascade failed to pass the message to the Master Station;</li> <li>Pharmacy was not displaying the most up to date EW Cascade;</li> <li>Trainee Pharmacist / new Pharmacist did not know that there was a cascade process that had to be followed;</li> <li>Unable to get through to the Pharmacy.</li> </ul>
	We appreciate that there are often competing priorities within the Pharmacy and that time is precious; however, the Early Warning System is specifically used in emergent situations and the transfer of information is imperative.

REMINDER	Change in Guidance on Face Masks across Health and Social Care
•	From Tuesday 16 May 2023, new Scottish Government guidance comes into effect on the use of facemasks and face coverings within health and care settings.
	Due to a number of factors including high vaccinations rates and other mitigations against COVID-19 in the health and social care sector, the recommendation that face masks are worn at all times is being removed. The PPE requirements for standard infection control and transmission based precautions remain in place as per the National Infection Prevention and Control Manual.
	The advice covers all hospitals, health centres, community sectors, primary care facilities and care homes.
	<ul> <li>The key changes to the guidance are:</li> <li>staff providing direct care do not need to routinely wear a face mask at all times during their shift</li> <li>staff in non-direct care roles (e.g. catering, domestic or office staff) do not need to routinely wear a face covering unless advised to so on IPC advice</li> <li>visitors to adult care homes do not need to wear a mask or face covering including in communal areas.</li> </ul>
	Why the guidance has changed Fluid resistance surgical masks (FRSMs) provide protection to the wearer and those around them, and therefore have a purpose within health and social care settings. However, we are in a position now where the extended use of masks and face coverings should be for particular situations and not the default position.
	Although COVID-19 continues to spread, transmission rates are lower and the virus is currently milder than at earlier stages in the pandemic resulting in a reduction in severity of illness and hospitalisation.
	The impact masks and face coverings can have on health and mental wellbeing, along with communication barriers, continues to be weighed against the protection provided against the risk of harm from COVID-19.
	Vaccination remains the greatest protection against COVID-19.


