

C is for:

- Common Clinical Conditions frequently treatable via Pharmacy First include eyes, ears, skin, scalp, mouth, digestive tract, bladder, travel sickness, allergies, hayfever, pain, certain fungal viral and parasitic infections. Ensure you and your team know what's treatable and how to help patients avoid unnecessary visits to the GP or hospital see the latest Approved List here:

- Customer conversation openers "let me just take down some details so I can help you better...",
 or "let me take some details while you're waiting to see the Pharmacist..." as early as possible

D is for:

Disallowed items – 1 in 20 dispensed items put through Pharmacy First are being disallowed and not paid because they're not the Approved List, This means you're not getting reimbursed for the item, and it doesn't count towards your Pharmacy First activity target! Please pick items on your PMR exactly as listed on the Approved List; if your PMR doesn't allow you to, please report this to your Area Manager or PMR provider for investigation.
