

FUN PHARMACY FACT:



In 1886, American pharmacist John S. Pemberton created Coca-Cola as a treatment for most common ailments. The syrup was based on cocaine from the coca leaf and caffeinated extracts from a kola nut – hence the name, Coca-Cola. Cocaine was only removed from the recipes in 1903! Pemberton sold his syrup to Atlanta Soda Fountains, and the rest is history.
