We now have 65 of our 98 pharmacies signed up to this service and are still hoping that those pharmacies who have not will sign up and join the pilot service for the remaining 3 months. There have been 12 patients through the community pharmacy pathway thus far and we hope for many more as community pharmacies go live with the service. Feedback from all involved remains overwhelmingly positive with the patient experience and enhanced relationships with community pharmacy teams being the highlights!

URGENT F.A.O Palliative care network pharmacies
