NHS Pharmacy First Scotland – Hay fever service

Following the release of the circular (PCA2023(P)27) this week and the subsequent MEMO with the required documentation relating to the new NHS pharmacy first Scotland hay fever service we would like to highlight the following:

- GP practices were included in the distribution list from the Scottish Government and therefore are aware of the service.
- The expectation is that all pharmacies should be 'ready' to deliver the service from 31st August, or as soon as practically possible. If you have completed the training and signed the PGD's before this date then you should inform your local surgeries that you are able to deliver the service and also have discussions with colleagues in general practice regarding appropriate referral routes.
- Not all PMR systems have been updated as yet to include the new modules if there is a delay with your PMR supplier, please inform your GP surgeries in order that patients are not referred for a service you are unable to deliver.

Tostran 2% Gel Pump Shortage – Safety Information regarding Alternatives

We have been made aware that shortages in Tostran 2% Gel Pump have resulted in 2 significant events where by inappropriate alternatives were issued for women who use this as part of their HRT.

Suitable alternatives which can be calculated to provide the appropriate dose are:

- Testim® (1% testosterone gel in 5g tubes containing 50mg testosterone)
- Testogel® (2% testosterone gel in 2.5g sachets containing 40.5mg testosterone)

PLEASE NOTE THAT TESTOGEL 16.2mg/g PUMP ACTION IS NOT A SUITABLE ALTERNATIVE AS THIS WILL DELIVER 4 TIMES THE DOSE OF TOSTRAN GEL PUMP ACTION. THE DOSE DELIVERED IS ALSO TOO HIGH FOR WOMEN.

Please ensure you discuss with the prescriber what suitable alternatives are available.
