UPDATE OOH Prescription Stationery




As a reminder please see attached the E Prescribing letter update to the communication below which was previously circulated on the 14/3/2023.



As part of the introduction of the Electronic Transfer of Prescriptions from Out of Hours Centres (see PCA(M)(2021)13 - attached) a change was made to the prescription stationery that was to be used.

As a result, <u>ALL</u> prescribers working in Out of Hours Centres - regardless of their professional designation - should use the GP10(SS)5 form (see below for image).

Therefore, a replacement prescription is <u>not</u> required if you receive a prescription signed a NMP e.g. a Nurse.

Message from Alan Harrison, Lead Pharmacist Community Care

Can't believe that I am writing this Christmas communication as it seems like it was just yesterday that it was Christmas 2022.

Christmas is always a time of reflection and it's good to take a pause and think about everything that has been achieved over the last 12 months.

Community Pharmacies have continued to be at the forefront of care in the community with over 24.5 million prescriptions being dispensed across the GGC network in 2023.

You have played a huge part in ensuring that patients receive their medication and have gone to huge lengths to ensure patient care is maintained. This was never more evident than at the start of 2023 when there was a Strep A outbreak with many antibiotics going into shortage. The network, stepped up to the plate in obtaining what little was available and adapted quickly to the ever decreasing stock availability.

Shortages, in general, have continued to be a significant problem this year, but again the network has risen to the challenge and worked tirelessly to ensure that pharmaceutical care is maintained for all our citizens. We lost one of our established names on the High street this year when Lloyds changed ownership of their 48 contracts within NHS GGC. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff in each of these contracts for what must have been a turbulent and difficult time and also thank the new owners of these contracts who have worked extremely hard to ensure the changeover was as smooth as it could be.

The network continues to develop its Common Clinical Conditions service and we now have over 100 Independent Prescribers covering over 80 community pharmacies. With enrolment to courses in 2024 already full we would expect to have over 130 by the end of 2024 and over a quarter of pharmacies operating the service. I would like to thank our IPs for the excellent work they do in ensuring appropriate care is given to patients when needed and in doing so in many cases preventing the need for patients to access care elsewhere within the system.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for the delivery of care to the citizens of NHS GGC in what continues to be challenging times. Have a wonderful Christmas and a peaceful and prosperous New Year

GGC Briefing note on nitazenes Dec 2023.pc



Briefing note on nitazenes for community drug services

Please find attached an important communication from NHSGGC Public Health and the GGC Drug Trend Monitoring Group updating local community drug services about the current position regarding **nitazenes in the drug supply**.

The overall picture is still quite unclear however we do know that we are picking up evidence of nitazenes in a variety of drugs and that nitazene use, whether it is intentional or not, can lead to harmful effects including accidental overdose.

The resources in the briefings have been produced for use across Scotland but we feel it is important to also highlight the following points.

- Poly drug use remains the main cause of overdose especially if content uncertain. The advice surrounding this has not changed and should be discussed with clients at every opportunity. The advice around harm reduction is important.
- Check that your service has an appropriate stock of Naloxone for emergency use and for supply to clients (if set up to do so). If supplies are low please order more as soon as possible. Supplies of Naloxone should be ordered through normal ordering process.
- Encourage clients to take and carry Naloxone at all times. Always suggest they
 also take a spare kit and remind them that more Naloxone than normal may be
 needed to reverse an overdose.
- Synthetic Opioid information posters and booklets for services in GGC will be available soon. Please request a supply for your service by contacting john.campbell@ggc.scot.nhs.uk.

Briefing note on nitazenes for community drug services



GGC Briefing note on nitazenes Dec 2023.pc Please find attached an important communication from NHSGGC Public Health and the GGC Drug Trend Monitoring Group updating local community drug services about the current position regarding nitazenes in the drug supply.

The overall picture is still quite unclear however we do know that we are picking up



evidence of nitazenes in a variety of drugs and that nitazene use, whether it is intentional or not, can lead to harmful effects including accidental overdose.

The resources in the briefings have been produced for use across Scotland but we feel it is important to also highlight the following points.

Attached

- Poly drug use remains the main cause of overdose especially if content uncertain. The advice surrounding this has not changed and should be discussed with clients at every opportunity. The advice around harm reduction is important.
- Check that your service has an appropriate stock of Naloxone for emergency use and for supply to clients (if set up to do so). If supplies are low please order more as soon as possible. Supplies of Naloxone should be ordered through normal ordering process.
- Encourage clients to take and carry Naloxone at all times. Always suggest they
 also take a spare kit and remind them that more Naloxone than normal may be
 needed to reverse an overdose.
