What is your current role? Superintendent pharmacist for Seafield Pharmacy in Ayr.

How long have you worked in NHS AA? 20 years now since I qualified and worked in community until 2017, then I switched to primary care and worked as a GPCP as well as a Senior Pharmacist in East Ayrshire but then came back to community 2 years ago when this role enticed me back!

What's the best bit of your job? Being able to utilise my IP qualification as part of the Pharmacy First Plus service and make the patient journey so much easier, rather than having to refer them on, which I would have had to do previously, despite knowing what the best course of action would be.

what do you think about the future of community pharmacy? It is very challenging at present as the number of services that we offer and number of patients that we see on a daily basis is increasing all the time. The fact we are the only healthcare professionals that don't need an appointment to see us out with A&E adds to this challenge, so it is important that we stick together and work together as a profession across all sectors to ensure that we are able to offer a sustainable, first class service to all patients which we are capable of doing with the right resources and proper integration with other healthcare professionals.

What do you to relax outside of work? I regularly run 5-10km and on occasion step up to half marathons - a very good way to clear the cobwebs and destress! I also enjoy going to and playing football (not changed since I was 10), as well as counting down the days to my next holiday!

#### **GOOD NEWS STORY**

David from Seafield Pharmacy has shared the good news story for this week:

Our delivery driver lan, went to deliver to one of our regular patients who is usually in all the time but got no response when he arrived. He listened carefully through the letterbox and thought he could hear some noise coming from upstairs. He chapped the neighbour's door as he knew they had a key and gained entry to the property. It turns out the lady in her 80's had fallen the previous night and had a severe head injury from the fall and was unable to move as well as going in and out of consciousness.

He immediately called an ambulance and waited with the patient until they arrived and gave a full handover to the paramedics. The patient was admitted and discharged the following week.

He potentially saved her life. This shows the importance of a delivery service to vulnerable patients as sometimes this is their only contact with others. Well done to lan and he is an asset to the Seafield team!
