What is your current role? My current role is Associate Director of Pharmacy (Clinical Services, Governance & Innovation). CAU Discharge service

Fluoroquinolones Patient Information Leaflet

You will be aware that the MHRA issued a strengthened warning regarding the use of Fluoroquinolones on 22nd January 2024.

It is notable that the MHRA has produced an advice sheet on serious adverse reactions affecting musculoskeletal and nervous systems associated with fluoroquinolone use, which should be provided to all patients and their carers on receipt of a fluoroquinolone prescription.
