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## **IMPORTANT UPDATE – Antimicrobial Companion App**

The Antimicrobial companion app which many of you (especially IP's) will use is closing at the end of March.

On Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March Ayrshire and Arran empirical guidelines will move to new host locations.

Adult (16yr+) guidelines are moving to the NHS Ayrshire & Arran Therapeutics Handbook. This can be downloaded as an app for smartphone. Instructions are below and user name/password details will be **e-mailed separately** to pharmacy clinical mailboxes.

\*\*For the attention of CP sites still to manually renew their verification certificate – please do so by the 24<sup>th</sup> March \*\*

A reminder regarding the verification certificate renewal for CPs which needs to be manually completed before 24th March. If the new certificate has not been installed on the PC where the ePharmacy adapter is installed, your pharmacy will no longer be able to download AMS or MCR (SRx) prescriptions, the electronic prescription data will not be displayed within your PMR and all details will require to be keyed.

<u>To avoid this happening, please download your pharmacy's replacement certificate as soon as possible.</u> The download should only take a few minutes to complete, following the installation instructions which can be found at the following location: <a href="http://www.eps.nds.scot.nhs.uk/VertCert/install.html">http://www.eps.nds.scot.nhs.uk/VertCert/install.html</a>. Please note that this certificate is common to all Community Pharmacies and the installation does not require any PIN or other pharmacy specific details to be entered.

# This Weeks Key Messages

## **Hospital Discharge service pilot**

We are seeing many patients now coming through this pathway and benefitting from expedited discharge from our CAU and ED. This week we have e-mailed all pharmacies NOT currently signed up to the pilot service to encourage sign up.

If you are signed up already (you will not have received an e-mail) please ensure you are familiar with the service in anticipation of patients selecting your pharmacy to receive discharge medicines.

As a reminder, if a patient has selected your pharmacy, a member of the clinical pharmacy team from CAU/ED will make contact by phone before the IDL is sent to confirm you have stock and are able to participate in the service.

Following supply to the patient the MS Form (link below) should be completed to provide feedback and request payment.

## A reminder from Quit Your Way (QYW)

If a client smokes AND vapes, as long as they wish to stop smoking, then pharmacy can sign them up for a quit.

PCR is for **smokers only** so if someone only vapes and wishes to stop, they should NOT be signed up and should be directed to QYW.

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
