Waste PAA- Per Acceptance Audit Tradebe and SEPA have requested as part of the national contract that all waste producers (including community pharmacy medicines waste collections) must have an up to date per acceptance audit (PAA) in place at each site to ensure the clinical waste collection services continue.

These PAAs should be completed by the waste producer/s and sent to the health boards waste management officer (WMO) to review and log prior to being sent to Tradebe and Sepa to review and update. Below is a copy of the PAA 2024 audit template that has to be used nationally and an audit check list that will help staff when completing the audit

This is requested for ALL NHS Lanarkshire pharmacy sites to ensure they are fully aware of the importance of the audit, failure to complete the audit and return to the WMO will result in the clinical waste services being stopped until an up to date PAA is in place- It is the sites responsibility to ensure the PAA is completed within a sufficient timescale and know when they are due etc.

CLINICAL SERVICE UPDATES

Addiction Services We would like to remind pharmacy teams of the importance of informing addiction teams when patients do not attend for their medication, and the use of the NEO messaging too to support this reporting (although if urgent using both phone and NEO would be advised). NEO offers an auditable trail. We also remind teams of the importance of filling in the purple form or another auditable trail for locum pharmacists to easily see if patients have presented or have missed.

Smoking Cessation Please see below details of up and coming smoking cessation training from the Quit your way team, with many online, 30 minute drop in and lunchtime sessions available, if you cant be released to attend.

ASH CHARTER

We know community pharmacies do a good job in supporting Lanarkshire residents to quit smoking. We understand people who might smoke might feel nervous to ask for support, especially if they have tried to quit once or twice before. However, pharmacies can offer friendly information and advice as well as ongoing support and free NRT which can increase peoples chances of quitting. By signing the ASH Charter, pharmacies are reinforcing their commitment to delivering an excellent smoking cessation service in helping reducing the harms caused by tobacco and contributing towards achieving the goal of creating a tobacco free generation.



Becoming a Charter Supporter is easy:

HOSPITAL AT HOME SERVICE- NHS LANARKSHIRE

We have had feedback from some pharmacies around prescriptions received from the hospital at home service, and an ask for some information around what this service is, and who to contact if there are any issues. We hope the following briefing is helpful:

Hospital at Home (H@H) in Lanarkshire is a short-term, targeted intervention that provides a level of acute hospital care in an individual's own home, or homely setting that is equivalent to that provided within a hospital.

The service covers Lanarkshire with 78 "beds" across four teams:

Base @ University Hospital Monklands

- Areas covered: Airdrie, Coatbridge, Cumbernauld (and surrounding areas e.g Kilsyth), North
 Uddingston (G71 5** & 6**), North Bellshill (ML4 1** and 3**)

Base @ University Hospital Hairmyres

- Areas covered: East Kilbride, Hamilton, Strathaven, Bothwell/South Uddingston (G71 7** & 8**),
 Blantyre, Stonehouse, Cambuslang

Base @ University Hospital Wishaw

- Areas covered: Wishaw, Motherwell, Larkhall, Shotts, South Bellshill (ML4 2**)

• Base @ Carluke Health Centre

- Areas covered: Clydesdale locality e.g. Carluke, Lanark, Law, Douglas, Carstairs, Carnwath, Biggar,
 Kirkmuirhill, Forth, Lesmahagow etc

Patient Group

- Older adults (any patient over 65 including frailty patients) and anyone in a care home requiring hospital level care.
- Patient referred to the service through the following routes:
 - Primarily through their GP or SAS
 - A&E departments
 - "Step Down" referrals on discharge from acute hospital wards
- Patients are given information on the H@H service when first seen including above contact details for relevant team.
- Patients are asked to contact H@H in first instance rather than their GP or other service for any issue relating to their current acute problem.
- However, patients are instructed to still contact their GP for their repeat prescription medications unless these are being amended by H@H team.

Hours of Service

• 7 days a week

- 8am to 8pm (Monday to Friday)
- 8am to 6pm (Saturday and Sunday)
- Out of hours, patients asked to contact 111 or 999 for any acute problems

Prescribing

- H@H is a multidisciplinary team approach in which there are multiple prescribers of different professions.
- Who can prescribe?
 - Consultant Geriatricians
 - Medics (trainee medics FY2 and above, specialty doctors)
 - o Non-medical prescribers e.g. nurses, physiotherapist, pharmacist
- Prescriptions are written on a Form HBP(5) to be dispensed via community pharmacy.
- Often, these will be emailed to community pharmacy from a H@H staff member with the H@H service email cc'd in.
- Original prescription will be sent in post to be received within 72 hours.
- Emailed prescriptions from H@H will always be sent to the pharmacies "pharm.clinical" inbox and not a community pharmacist's personal NHS email or a non-NHS email.
- Please ensure the junk email inbox is checked as often emails from H@H staff can be sorted in to junk automatically.

Waste PAA Audit Check List

- Internal domestic bin/s check if labelled correctly, are they pedal bins or own/small under desk size bins, clear bag and note contents (any gloves/clinical products etc).
- Internal clinical bin/s check if labelled correctly, majority should be pedal bins or under counter for dental site (note if any other type of bin), orange bags and note contents (any paper towels, packaging, medical products etc).
- Are the internal bins visible, correct locations or hard to see.
- Sharps bins check the lid and label match (blue/blue), check ID label is fully complete, check its within date if complete (3 months from open date then close), temp close use or slide open and note contents.

Orange = routine bloods, scissors, scalpels, lancets (non-contaminated).

Blue = medicinal injections, vials i.e. B12, clexane, vaccines etc (note names on vials/syringes if visible).

Purple = cytotoxic, cytostatic, hormonal/contraceptive injections, vials i.e. Pro stap 3, implant applicator, Hydroxycarbamide, Methotrexate, Depo Provera, Depo Medrone etc (note names on vials/syringes if visible).

Note if the bins are overfilled, waste sticking out, stained, dusty etc (any risk).

- Pharmacy waste i.e. pills/tablets, glass medication bottles, medication cups/spoons, plastic syringes (no needles), blister packs (full or empty) these should all be disposed of via the blue/blue pharmacy bins (looks similar to sharps but it's all blue and no needles allowed or the large wiva bins with blue lids. If any of these items are in sharps bins, please make note.
- Check for any up to date waste segregation posters, charts etc.
- General feel/observation of the staff knowledge onsite or have a discussion with staff if they are available. Any non-compliance issues, are the staff aware of procedures.
- Are the bags swan necked/double tied, any tape used, ID tape etc.
- Any bin store/compound areas, are they locked and secure, are the euro bins locked and secure, waste streams inside bags tied, sharps sealed etc. Waste segregated in store area or mixed.
- Anything else you think relevant, just note everything and as much detail as possible.
