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NHS Pharmacy First Scotland – RECORD

In the spirit of the Olympics we thought we would share our very own community pharmacy record in NHS Ayrshire & Arran!

In May this year our community pharmacy network delivered 35,204 Pharmacy First Scotland consultations – the highest recorded since the service launched!

29,149 patients received treatment, 4298 were given advice from pharmacy teams and 1757 were referred to other services!

Well done to all of you and thank you for your continued hard work in delivering primary care pharmacy services to our citizens in their communities!

This Weeks Key Messages

QV products

As you may be aware, several QV products were removed from the Scottish Drug Tariff effective as of 01/08/2024, this comes 2 months on from their removal from the English Drug Tariff after being deemed surplus to requirements of the NHS. Below is a list of the affected products from the manufacturer –

4 lines within the QV range below will be discontinued from the Drug Tariff and are no longer reimbursable against prescriptions, effective June 1st 2024, as these were deemed surplus to the requirements of the NHS:

- QV Bath Oil 250g
- QV Bath Oil 500g
- QV Skin Lotion 250g
- QV Gentle Wash 250g

Additionally, all presentations of the QV range are still available for consumers to purchase over the counter.

NHS prescriptions for these products will now not be reimbursed.

We recommend endorsing prescriptions for QV Skin Lotion 250g and QV Gentle Wash 250g to 500g preparations of both as these pack sizes are unaffected by this change. Prescriptions for Bath Oil will need to be returned to prescriber, patients will be advised to purchase this OTC if required.

Work is underway by our Pharmacotherapy practice teams to identify and review patients who are regularly prescribed the affected products to switch to a suitable alternative (500g pack) where appropriate.

Furthermore, QV Gentle Wash 250g was previously on the Pharmacy First Formulary, this has now been removed with QV Gentle Wash 500g remaining.

The Community Pharmacy website has been amended to host the new national formulary under the page <u>Formularies</u>.
