MEDICINE RESOURCING REQUIREMENTS

If problems in accessing the medicine via this supply route cannot be resolved through direct dialogue with Astellas, contact the Health Board. **Do not purchase from any other supply route without the approval of the Health Board.**

Please remember that as front line patient facing staff, community pharmacy teams are eligible for FLU and COVID vaccinations.
