# **Prostate Cancer Service**

A reminder to all pharmacies who participate in the prostate cancer service:

The SLA specifies that Enzalutamide stock should ONLY be purchased directly from the manufacturer, Astellas. While alliance healthcare are used to distribute the stock the orders from community pharmacies should be placed directly with Astellas. (Details in excerpt from the SLA below)

All orders must be placed with the manufacturer (Astellas) directly by telephone or email. Astellas Customer Service can be contacted on 0203 379 8721 or email ukcustomerservices@astellas.com.

MEDICINE RESOURCING REQUIREMENTS If problems in accessing the medicine via this supply route cannot be resolved through direct dialogue with Astellas, contact the Health Board. **Do not purchase from any other supply route without the approval of the Health Board.**

Uptake from care staff in A&A is low at the moment so your help in promoting the vaccination services during interactions with these colleagues is much appreciated.
