IMPORTANT INFORMATION	Patient Information Leaflet – Keppra® to Generic Levetiracetam Switch	
	A patient information leaflet is now available to support the switch from Keppra® (levetiracetam) to generic levetiracetam in line with national guidance and NHSGGC cost efficiency work.	

While there is **no requirement to routinely provide the leaflet**, you may find it helpful when speaking with patients who have concerns or queries about receiving a different version of their epilepsy medicine. The leaflet explains:

- The MHRA's classification of levetiracetam as a **Category 3** antiepileptic (low risk when switching versions).
- Reasons why a different version may be dispensed (e.g. cost efficiency, supply).
- What patients should expect regarding appearance, ingredients, and potential side effects.

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

Community Pharmacy Referrals to GP Out-of-Hours Emergency Treatment Centres

Overview

From 1st September 2025, community pharmacists will have an enhanced referral option for unwell (non-emergency) patients during out-of-hours (OOH) periods. In addition to consulting with an OOH GP by phone, pharmacists may now request an appointment for patients at one of the GP OOH Emergency Treatment Centres.

Referral Criteria

This pathway is intended for patients who, after assessment, are considered too unwell to be treated in the pharmacy and need to be **seen** urgently (within four hours), and that cannot wait until their GP practice re-opens.

Referral Process

- Pharmacists should call the current GPOOH telephone number.
- Ask the call handler you would like to request a "4-hour" appointment.
- Provide the following patient information:
- Name
- Date of Birth (or CHI if available)
- Home Address
- Current Contact Telephone Number
- Brief summary of the presenting complaint
 - your contact information will also be collected.

Patient Communication
Inform the patient that the GP OOH service will contact them directly with an appointment time.
Review and Feedback
It is anticipated that patient numbers referred via this pathway will be low. All will be reviewed and feedback provided in the case of inappropriate referrals.
