IMPORTANT INFORMATION	Pharmaceutical Waste
	The Board currently operates a single service for the collection and disposal of patients' returned medicines (pharmaceutical waste) from Community Pharmacies.
	Pharmaceutical Waste is collected from Community Pharmacies either every three months or every two months (for Health Centre pharmacies and individual community pharmacies who have been granted an increased uplift only). Where an AD HOC uplift (an additional uplift out with the agreed schedule) is required for any reason, the Pharmacist (or their representative) must contact the Community Pharmacy Development Team via email <u>ggc.cpdevteam@nhs.scot</u> to make arrangements.
	Our Team will agree a collection date with the Waste Contractor and inform the pharmacy of this date.
	Members of the general public are encouraged to return their unused medication to their local community pharmacy for safe disposal. As such we would like to take this opportunity to highlight to community pharmacies the importance of accepting patient returns and to offer a gentle reminder that the only acceptable reason for a community pharmacy refusing a patient return is if their bins are full (in which case the AD HOC process should be instigated).

ACTION	Palliative Care Learnings
	After a review of medicine incidents within the Palliative Care service we would like to share some common errors that have occurred and which you should be extra vigilant of, when dispensing controlled and high strength medicines.
	This should be for all controlled drugs and not just in the palliative care service.
	 Oramorph comes in two different strengths - 20mg/ml concentrate and 10mg/5mls solution - please double check strengths and also the dosage that is to be given to the patient as errors could lead to a 10x overdose. Alfentanil again comes in two different strengths - 500mcg/ml amps and 5mg/ml amps - although these are less rarely seen in community especially the higher strength (which tends to be hospital only) pay particular attention to the dosage and check that the total concentration is appropriate for the patient.
	 Pregabalin - if a patient is prescribed, for example, 100mg BD and a new prescription comes in for 150mg BD, double check that the 100mg has to be deleted and a new strength of

150mg is supplied - there have been cases where the 150mg has been added onto the 100mg causing an overdose.


ACTION	Advanced Notification – Q3 Customer Complaints / Whistleblowing

ACTION	Scottish Referral Guidelines for Suspected Cancer 2024 Full Clinical Review
	We would like to invite you to participate in the wider stakeholder engagement phase of the Scottish Referral Guidelines (SRG) for Suspected Cancer full clinical review. Your input will play a pivotal role in finalising the review and update of these guidelines. Please share this email with your relevant networks and colleagues. Please note you may receive duplicate emails from other contacts cascading through their networks.

The content of the updated guidelines was developed and written following a series of Peer Review Sessions, attended by healthcare professionals from primary and secondary care, as well as the Scottish Cancer Coalition and public representatives. The content was written using current evidence and clinical consensus, and is specifically for healthcare professionals to aid recognition and referral of people in whom cancer is suspected.

Decision logs were produced for each Peer Review Session to provide an overview of what changes were made and why. These have been linked in this email for your consideration. Please note that there is no decision log for Non-Specific Symptoms of cancer as this is a new addition to the SRG. Dear Colleagues,

As we head into another festive period and the busiest two weeks of the year, I just wanted to take a few moments to thank each and every one of our 283 contracts for the sterling work that they have delivered over the last 12 months. It certainly doesn't get any easier and with prescription numbers growing at 2.6% from 2023 and more patients seeking access to care through community pharmacies, it shows how valuable our network of pharmacies is to us all.

As I have done in previous years it is always good to reflect on achievements across the year and there are two in particular that I would like to draw your attention to. The ADRS team work tirelessly with our addiction patients and do so in a caring and compassionate manner to ensure that our obligations under MAT standards are being met and this year I was delighted to see two pilots between the ADRS service and community pharmacies coming to fruition. Currently we are piloting the supply and administration of Buvidal from community pharmacies and also carrying out BBV testing which has never been done before in the current format. Once again working hand in hand we can show the important part community pharmacies can play in looking after the most chaotic of our patients.

I would also like to give a huge shout out to our 172 qualified Independent prescribers who are working in 141 of our community pharmacies and really making a huge difference to access of care within our communities. This was never so evident than in the test of change we carried out at the start of the year where two of our IP pharmacies supported the GP OOH service and ensured that over 80% of the patients seen did not need to go on to access care elsewhere within the Health Board.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our local Contractors Committee (CP GGC) who we meet with regularly to ensure that we can develop and grow services together and it is down to their ongoing support that we continue to be at the forefront of community pharmacy development. I would also like to thank the Community Pharmacy Development Team in their tireless support of the network and ensuring that the needs of the network are being supported.

I would suggest that you <u>double your usual stock levels</u> of the above medicines, but if your pharmacy is expected to be busy, or is open for several of the public holidays, please feel free to increase by more if you are able to.

Please claim for any incurred costs in the usual manner by using the electronic claiming workbook.

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COMPLIANCE AID DISPENSING FROM HOSPITALS

Pharmacy traditionally supply a minimum of 7 days of medicines on discharge where patients have no medicines at home or have been prescribed a new or changed medicine. During the festive period the quantity supplied is normally increased however, last year from the acute setting we supplied a **one** week compliance aid only where requested for existing compliance aid patients. As this initiative was successful, the same approach will be taken this year.

Acute Pharmacy Services Dispensaries will supply a minimum of 7 days of new medicines as normal including the supply of **one** compliance aid only for existing Pluspak patients. An information leaflet will be given to the patient (copy attached as a separate document) detailing when they require to contact their GP for a new prescription and collect their medicines. If for any reason the patient cannot contact the GP or Community Pharmacy we will supply two compliance aids to ensure continuity of medicine supply.

ADRS Briefing

Appropriate / Start Date on Opioid Substitution Therapy (OST) Prescriptions

In general ADRS teams supply 2x28 day prescriptions for patients prescribed OST, which are delivered directly to the pharmacy in advance of the start date to allow preparation. Prescriptions will have been printed / signed prior to the treatment start date (the appropriate date). In some cases the date of printing / signing may be more than 28 days before the start date. These prescriptions are legal, as prescription validity is **28 days from the appropriate start date**. However, if you have any concerns regarding the clinical appropriateness of a patient's medication, please contact the team who issued the prescription to discuss.

Home Office Approved Wording for Instalment Prescribing

All ADRS instalment prescriptions for OST will contain the relevant Home Office wording which enables take home doses to be supplied on an appropriate day, in advance of pharmacy closures.

Medication intended for use on the days that the pharmacy is closed, can be supplied in advance providing that a legally valid prescription is in place and contains the Home Office approved wording *"Please dispense instalments due on pharmacy closed days on a prior suitable day"*, or similar.

Medication may be supplied in advance of the prescription start date providing that the prescription has been signed and dated by the prescriber. No supply should be made before the date on which the prescription was signed. Please refer to the CD governance team briefing embedded for further guidance.

For example, an instalment from a prescription that is due to start on December 25th or 26th can be supplied on December 24th or earlier suitable day providing that the prescription has been signed on or before the identified suitable day and that the Home Office wording or equivalent is included. Similarly an instalment from a prescription that starts on January 1st or 2nd can be supplied before that date provided that the prescription has been signed on or prior to the suitable day identified for supply and includes the Home Office wording.

Please ensure that when deciding on the appropriate day to dispense instalment medication over the festive period / bank holiday / emergency closure that you consider each patient's individual circumstances and take these into account where possible e.g.

• Patients may struggle to attend on certain days (e.g. 26th December and 2nd January) if the pharmacy is only open for reduced hours and there is limited public transport.

Please refer to the Royal Pharmaceutical Society 'Medicines, Ethics and Practice', current edition, for further guidance on Home Office wording.



Supervision of OST

The majority of ADRS prescriptions will direct that the OST dose should be supervised on the day of collection. The supervision direction is a request from the prescriber rather than a legal direction. A patient representative can collect an OST instalment if a patient is unable to do so e.g. if self-isolating or due to illness. A new prescription is not required and details of the representative does not have to be written on the prescription by the prescriber. It is good practice to discuss requests with prescribers / care managers and appropriate records should always be maintained.

Reporting Missed doses of OST

All pharmacies must have a robust system and Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) in place to identify when patients have missed OST doses. It is vital that the patients' ADRS / GP is notified at the earliest opportunity following 3 missed doses or sooner if pharmacists have concerns about a patient. More urgent contact may be required following risk assessment of vulnerable patients, for example, in the high risk initial titration period of OST, following recent discharge from hospital, prison liberation or prior to a weekend / public holiday.

The 'GGC ADRS NEO OST Pharmacy Module' reporting tool should be used to contact the ADRS teams about missed doses, prescription queries or to raise concerns about patients. Messages should be sent by 10am each weekday morning, Monday to Friday. The ADRS 'professional to professional' phone lines can also be utilised to facilitate contact if the issue is urgent. NEO cannot be used to contact prescribers within GP shared care practices, the GP surgery should be contacted directly by telephone.

The self-audit should be completed on an annual basis, following a dispensing incident/near miss or when significant changes have been made to the OST dispensing processes within the pharmacy. Pharmacists newly in post may additionally find it helpful to complete. On completion the ADRS Pharmacy Team will be notified of responses and

pharmacies can print and save their submission for future reference. The ADRS pharmacy team will also review the audit and send recommendations for consideration. Please see link embedded.

Supervision of Disulfiram

Pharmacies who participate in the supervision of disulfiram are required to report any **single** missed dose of disulfiram within 24 hours via the GGC ADRS NEO Pharmacy Alcohol module. The ADRS team should respond within 24 hours to provide guidance, however, if a response is urgently required, the ADRS team should be contacted directly by phone / email in addition to logging the missed dose on NEO.

The use of breathalysers is <u>currently on hold subject to review</u>, however, if supervision is requested on a disulfiram prescription, this should continue to be undertaken without the use of the breathalyser until further advice is issued. (If a pharmacy has already reinstated breathalysing please continue to do so).

Please note: Disulfiram prescriptions do not require the home office wording (not a CD); the day of supply of a bank holiday dose is at the discretion of the pharmacist. Either provide the patient with the bank holiday dose(s) on the previous day of supervision or on the last day of opening prior to closure.

Safe Transport and Storage of Medication

It is important that all take home ADRS medication is transported and stored safely by patients. Steps which can be taken by pharmacy staff to promote this are:

- Provide the NHS GGC Safe Storage Leaflet
- Use bottle / bag methadone warning labels for take home methadone doses. Contact 0141 303 8931 if you require labels.

Please undertake regular conversations with patients on the importance of safe transport and storage of take home medication, especially around children.

NEO Troubleshooting

Pharmacy staff frequently request support to assist with access to passwords or to register / remove members of staff from the GGC ADRS Neo 360 system. In the first instance they should refer to the NEO housekeeping manual (embedded) which will guide them through the process. The manual is also available by clicking the "Help" tab in NEO.

Submission dates for ADRS Pharmacy Claims

Claims for al GGC ADRS Pharmacy Services including, OST, IEP, Disulfiram, Naloxone, BBV Testing and Buvidal administration must be **submitted via NEO by the 6th of each calendar month.** Claims must be submitted by an individual with current GPhC registration, using their own unique NEO username and password. Claims must **not** be submitted using the generic IEP or pharmacy manager log on.
