	As you should be aware there has been a MHRA drug safety update outlining the introduction of new safety measures for women of child-bearing potential being prescribed Topiramate.

	We have been made aware that there have been several instances recently where community pharmacists have been the first healthcare professional to highlight this issue with patients.
	Therefore, it is vital that all community pharmacies provide the appropriate information every time a prescription is dispensed.
	As a reminder, the information for dispensers has been reproduced below:
	A visual warning symbol will be added to the pack of Topiramate. This symbol will show a pregnant woman in a red circle with a line through it, with warning text about the risks and information about the new measures
	Until warning symbols are present on packs, stickers will be available to print locally on eMC
	Pharmacists should dispense in whole packs whenever possible. This will ensure that patients always see the warning symbol and receive the statutory information

Pharmacists should give the patient card to female patients when dispensing Topiramate
• Ask women or girls of childbearing potential if they are taking highly effective contraception, if they are not, pharmacists should advise them to contact their GP for a follow-up appointment

	The Thistle is a safe, clean, warm and welcoming service where individuals can inject their own drugs. If they choose, the staff will also help with access to other recovery and support services that are needed.
	The staff team includes people with lived experience. The Thistle Service User Briefing.pdf
	This is a huge opportunity for Glasgow City to really make a difference in reducing drug related deaths.
	Community Pharmacies can themselves continue to contribute to supporting a reduction, by providing overdose awareness training for community pharmacy teams, and ensuring that Naloxone is available for immediate emergency supply and emergency administration.
	This was outlined in the National Community Pharmacy Emergency Naloxone Holding Service Specification which was released in 2023. pca2023-p-34.pdf
	Immediate emergency supply of Naloxone will be made from the pharmacy premises while emergency administration may occur within or out with pharmacy premises.

We ECW V3.0.xlsx have also fixed some formatting errors. Contractors should now use this version and discard any User-Guide-CP-Local previous versions they may have saved. -Claim-Forms-v4-Jan **Attached Points to Note:** Please complete all sections of the Cover Sheet **before** entering data into any individual sheet. This will auto populate relevant fields reducing workload for contractors. We have introduced drop down lists across various claims. This should cut down on input errors and make completion of the ECW easier for contractors. Please use these where they are provided. The Hospital Discharge claim has been removed as this service has now come to an end in its current format. There is no need to claim for attendance at Palliative Care Training events – payments will be made automatically using the attendance sheets from the session. - The person submitting the ECW must include their name in the submission. This is required for audit purposes. An updated User Guide can be found here. If you are in **any** doubt how to complete the Workbook, please refer to the User Guide before submitting. Failure to complete properly could result in

delay to processing (and payment) of claims.

	The Tuesday edition of the Update has always contained "new" information, with the Thursday edition being solely (by and large) for Updates, Reminders and Pieces where there is a cut-off date i.e. training.
	Like many others, the CPDT are currently experiencing staff shortages and the Team has had to look critically at areas where we can make changes to allow us to build some capacity into the Team while we experience these constraints.
	As such from 6 th March 2025 the Thursday edition of the Communications Update will be suspended for a period of at least six months.
	The Tuesday edition will continue to provide "new" information but will contain a section at the end of the document which will detail those pieces of information which have a cut-off date. These pieces will stay on the document until the cut-off date has been reached.
	I hope you can support this temporary change in process which, along with other amendments in process will allow the CPDT to

continue responding to the needs of the network at the current level.
