We would be very grateful for your help in ensuring this guidance is disseminated as widely as possible. Who is this guidance for? This guidance is for any healthcare professionals working across NHS Scotland who may receive a disclosure of sexual assault or rape. This may include, but is not exclusive to, GP's, sexual health healthcare professionals, pharmacists, emergency department healthcare professionals, gender based violence groups and other primary care settings. • This document supersedes the previous guidance hosted on the Scottish Government website – which will be archived with

What is included in the guidance?

- As you will see, there are three components to the toolkit:
 - Pathway determining the steps that each healthcare professional should take following a disclosure of rape or sexual assault, and the referral options available. Each step in the pathway contains hyperlinks to their corresponding section in the main document, should the healthcare professional wish to find out more information
 - Responding to disclosure further text and advice for each step of the pathway as well as links to further support
 - Checklist a resource for healthcare professionals to check over and confirm that all necessary steps have been taken when discussing the disclosure with the person

	For ease, the information for dispensers has been reproduced below:
	 a visual warning symbol will be added to the pack of topiramate. This symbol will show a pregnant woman in a red circle with a line through it, with warning text about the risks and information about the new measures until warning symbols are present on packs, stickers will be available to print locally on eMC Pharmacists should dispense in whole packs whenever possible. This will ensure that patients always see the warning symbol and receive the statutory information Pharmacists should give the patient card to female patients when dispensing topiramate ask women or girls of childbearing potential if they are taking highly effective contraception, if they are not, pharmacists should advise them to contact their GP for a follow-up appointment

	We are aware that an additional wholesaler (Ethigen) not included in our original information is now able to obtain unlicensed Creon®.
	Our table of suppliers is being updated accordingly.
	In order to make the process of sourcing unlicensed Creon® easier, the pre-approved price list (attached) has been amended to include;
	 Creon® 10000 - 100 pack (up to £55) Creon® 25000 - 100 pack (up to £75)
	Therefore, the usual authorisation process doesn't need to be followed.
	Provided the cost is within the guide price shown, approval will be granted automatically.
	As availability of ULM seems to be improving this should reduce/remove the need for patients to obtain supply from their hospital team.
	Supply from hospital should only be necessary when all other routes have been exhausted.

REMINDER	PGD v31 new format for Schedules



As you know, NHS 24 is responsible for the review/update of the National PGD for Urgent Supply of Medicines, Appliances and ACBS Products (UC PGD).

Attached

The next version (UC PGD v31) will have a new format and will be accompanied by a Medicines A-Z Look-up List. The Look-up List will mean you no longer have to refer to the BNF to identify whether a medicine can be supplied or not under the UC PGD. The UC PGD will be made up of two parts: the PGD (which still needs to be signed for legal purposes before use), and the Medicines A-Z Look-up List (which should be used alongside the PGD for reference). The attached screenshot shows what these will look like.

The Medicines Look-up List clearly defines those medicines which can (green) and cannot (red) be supplied, making it easier and quicker for you to identify this in practice. Medicines marked as amber are those medicines where supply is conditional e.g. only certain formulations are allowed.

Used together they should support you in helping anyone who has lost, run out of, or damaged a medicine, appliance or ACBS product and needs a further supply, providing them with the pharmaceutical care they need first time.

Therefore, the usual authorisation process doesn't need to be followed.

Provided the cost is within the guide price shown, approval will be granted automatically.

As availability of ULM seems to be improving this should reduce/remove the need for patients to obtain supply from their hospital team.

Supply from hospital should only be necessary when all other routes have been exhausted.
